OUR VISITORS



Raunds Town was founded in 1946. There had been other teams with "Raunds" in the title as long ago as 1896–97, but at a meeting in the town's Temperance Hall in May 1946 a new amalgamated club was formed. The club is nicknamed "The Shopmates" in reference to the local boot and shoe industry, which was largely workshop-based.

In 1950 the Shopmates joined the United Counties League (formerly the Northamptonshire League), playing in the Second Division. They did not set the league on fire, and after switching between the divisions settled in Division One after the former first division was redesignated the Premier Division. A season in Division Two in 1979–80 seemed to wake them up: after the division was disbanded at the end of that season, the Shopmates returned to Division One and were promoted as champions in 1982–83. Raunds Town embarked upon an ambitious programme. Having played at Greenhouse Field for two years at the start, they moved to The Berristers for thirty-three seasons and in 1991 they moved to Kiln Park. The stadium adjacent to the A45 was designed to host football at a higher level. The Shopmates' on-field performance matched this munificence. In 1992–93 they won at Northwich Victoria 2–0 to eliminate their hosts from the FA Cup in the Second Qualifying Round, thus far the only time a UCL club has eliminated Conference opposition from the competition. In 1994–95 the Shopmates lost the FA Vase semi-final against Arlesey Town having led 3–0 after the first (home) leg. The following season they were eliminated in the quarter-final by Bristol club Mangotsfield United. In 2006–07 the Shopmates eliminated Isthmian League side Enfield from the FA Cup by way of a 2–1 away win, gaining revenge for a reverse in the same competition at their hands eight seasons before.

Meanwhile, in the United Counties League, the leadership of manager Keith Burt led an assault on the top of the table. Having lost out on the championship on goal difference in 1994–95, Raunds seized the title the following season. They were duly promoted to the Southern League, where they took their place in the Midland Division. However, they suffered from their geographical location close to the boundary between the divisions and in 1998–99, the Shopmates were shifted to the Southern Division, which was renamed the Eastern Division the following season. This had financial implications, not least the cost of travelling, and for two seasons Raunds Town struggled. Manager Keith Burt resigned, and the club had little option but to apply for re-admission to the United Counties League at the end of 1999–2000.

In the 2012–13 season, Raunds Town are playing in the United Counties Football League Division One, led by manager Stuart Brown and Russ Baxter.

2013-14 saw the arrival of co-managers James Le Masurier and Scott Manning, with intention of a 5 year rebuild. 2014 – 15 saw only Jim as the manager. Raunds persistently remained in the top half of the league with 2017-18 as being the most successful position. However, after seeing promotion to the UCL being eluded, Jim decided to stand down and most

WHAT'S THAT noise you hear rumbling in the distance? Ah yes, it's the national media getting ready to start covering the FA Cup from the first round proper.

No Non-League footballer's day job is safe from being shoehorned into any report in a bid to save the romance of the FA Cup.

Of course, if you're reading this you know the FA Cup kicked off back in August and the magic has been well and truly alive ever since.

And while, yes, the first round proper is drawing ever nearer, the fourth round qualifying round as thrown up some mouth-watering ties.

We've said for quite a few years now how this stage of the competition – and even those before it considering the size of some Step 2 clubs – almost has a first round feel in itself.

Biggleswade v York City jumps off the page in a northern section of the draw packed with big names with the likes of Scarborough Athletic hosting Chester and Oldham Athletic taking on FC Halifax Town.

Will it be a Big weekend in Bedfordshire? Biggleswade Town are still in the hat with their postponed replay against Alfreton Town due now scheduled for Tuesday after a midweek washout. The winners host Spennymoor Town.

Hednesford Town are a big Non-League name now under the charge of another big Non-League name in Steve King. The Step 4 side entered right at the very start in the extra preliminary round and, thanks to a 1-0 win over Shifnal Town on Tuesday, will now host Step 1 Gateshead.

And how about Step 5 Bury fresh from their win at National League North Radcliffe at the weekend? They travel to Harborough Town who are looking to create their own history by reaching the first round for the first time.

In the southern section of the draw we're waiting to see whether Bishops Cleeve can add Chesham United to their scalps in the rearranged replay on Tuesday with Yeovil Town awaiting the winners.

Suffolk side Leiston beat Hornchurch in extra time on Tuesday to set-up a home date with National League Dagenham & Redbridge, while Chertsey Town host Sutton United.

Horsham enjoyed a fairytale run last season, drawing 3-3 with Barnsley before losing the replay and then being reinstated after the Tykes were found to have played an ineligible player.

They welcome Step 4 Gorleston, who have just dumped out St Albans City. The last time they reached the first round was in the 1957-58 season! IF they get there, surely that's worth a piece in the papers...

CLUB HISTORY

Buckingham Football Club is a football club based in Buckingham, Buckinghamshire, England. Formed by a merger of Buckingham Athletic and Buckingham United in 2023, they are currently members of the Spartan South Midlands League Division One and play at Stratford Fields.

The club was first formed in 1933 as **Buckingham Juniors**, but it was three years before a ground was found, allowing the club to enter the Brackley and District League. When they got their ground, it was originally called Timm's Meadow, before later becoming Stratford Fields. In 1939 the club adopted **Buckingham Athletic FC** as its name. It then took the club 27 years to win its first trophy when in 1960–61 they won their first trophy, the North Bucks League Shield.

In 1965 they applied and was accepted to the Hellenic League where they played in Division 1 finishing a creditable mid-table position in their first season but also won the Berks & Bucks FA Junior Cup. Their success continued and in 68/69 was promoted to the Premier Division after finishing Division runners-up.

The late 60's brought about some good success for the whole club with the Youth, Reserve and First teams all picking up trophies with the First winning the Buckinghamshire Senior Cup for the first time.

After a steady decline in fortunes in 78/79 the club returned to the North Bucks League and it wasn't until the mid-80's that further success was achieved.

This was the start of a successful period for the club and after winning the North Bucks Premier League title they moved to the South Midlands Division 1 in 1985 winning the league at their first attempt, losing only 3 games throughout the season.

However, success came too quickly, and the ground facilities were not ready for promotion to the Premier Division so they had to remain in Division 1.

The following season they were once again knocking on the door of the Premier League as they finished runners-up but a last minute hold up on planning permission once again stalled promotion. However, promotion was achieved the following year when they did the league and cup double and with correct ground grading in place the club was promoted to the Premier League for the first time.

Throughout the 90's all the teams in the club consistently won trophies

although the highest the first team achieved in the Premier League was in 97 when they finished 5th.

The late 90's the club struggled financially, and they made a very difficult decision to drop out of the top flight and they were placed back in Division 2. A level of stability was brought about the club and in 2003 they were promoted back to Division 1.

Once again ground grading held the club back as in 2004 they finished runners-up in Division 1 and promotion back to the Premier league was denied.

Since 05/06 a huge amount of work has taken place to upgrade the clubhouse and football facilities but unfortunately success on the field has been sparse.

In 2023 Buckingham Athletic started talks with Buckingham United to bring the two clubs together with the sole purpose of having one senior football team in the town.

Buckingham United FC were formed in 2011 with the sole aim of providing local grassroots football. This began as a single Sunday side playing in Deanshanger due to a lack of local facilities. After the first season the club moved to Tingewick but it was not until 2016 when the club finally moved into Buckingham to the new Lace Hill Sports and Community Centre. The club joined the North Bucks and District League before joining the South Midlands League Division Two in 2019. Here the club grew quickly providing grassroots football across various levels and abilities which peaked with eight teams by 2021, this included Saturday First and Reserves, Sunday League A & B sides, Veterans, Ladies along with an Under 21s and Under 18s.

The club reached many cup finals across the teams including winning the North Bucks and District League Division One shield in 2018. In the final season under Buckingham United the ladies side really gave the club a wonderful finally winning the Northants Premier Division Title and League Cup double.

As a result of many meetings between the clubs, both Buckingham Athletic & Buckingham United formally agreed to pass the motion to combine both clubs, creating Buckingham Football Club, which now has one of the largest offerings of adult football in the region with a structured youth pathway with our strategic partners Moretonville Junior FC.

This is not an end to Buckingham Athletic or Buckingham United, this is very much a continuation in the story of these clubs and football within the town. The history of which won't be forgotten.

The ultimate aim of combining the clubs is to provide the town with a sustainable non-league football club by sharing resources, passionate volunteers, and great sporting facilities. A club with the aim of pushing up the pyramid while also providing structured football for the community, maintaining the fun and enjoyment of the game that everyone loves.

FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I first got involved with local football around 55 years ago, once I had finished playing football I went into team management even starting up two teams but unfortunately neither team lasted because as I found out very quickly, without the right backing it isn't quite as easy as you expect.

When I moved to Buckingham I got involved with Junior football, Moretonville, and co-managed a very successful team who eventually came to Buckingham Athletic, as it was then, to represent them as their Under 18's.

Once that came to an end I went back to Moretonville and brought another team through the years and again brought them to the Athletic as their under 18's. During that period I was proudly elected as Chairman of Moretonville and helped them gain the facilities they now have at Gawcott.

On completion of that project I joined the committee at Athletic and then became Chairman and have held that position now for some 14 years.

It hasn't been easy we are still a small club in the terms of our status and what we can do but we do have huge ambitions, and slowly we are putting together the framework to have a club in the town of Buckingham that can serve football for boys and girls from the age of 5 years old through to seniors.

We are also continuing to try and improve the facilities both on and off the pitch but as a committee any decision we make we only have one thing in mind, is it sustainable? Unfortunately that does set about constraints that perhaps are not always palatable, but we want this club to still be around for future generations.

Our step 6 status is extremely important to the club and losing that could be detrimental to so many of the development plans that we have for this season.

As we all know we have been riding through a very difficult period on the pitch so the club had to make a very difficult decision to part ways with First Team Manager, Rory Williams. From every level I personally found this difficult because Rory and his team worked extremely hard throughout their time with us and I would like to put my appreciation on record for the tremendous effort and dedication that they put into the club.

Rory will always be welcome back to the club any time and his tenure will be fondly remembered as a key part of the clubs history following the merger.

However, the committee felt that we needed to try and steady the ship so the decision was made to make a change.

We now welcome Scott Reynolds and Ryan Gurton who pick up the reins, faces that some will remember as they have been with us before so they know the club well.

We believe they will bring us some added experience at a time that perhaps we need it and really hope that ALL the players and supporters associated to the club will stick with us and give the new management team a chance to turn things around.



FROM THE GAFFER



It's great to be back, albeit working under a different banner of the recently formed Buckingham FC.

The energy, ambition around the club along with the communication streams within the club have changed tenfold since I was here before.

When the approach came in, it didn't take long to consider the role and accept the position - there are some great people here and some great friends of mine too.

On the pitch, the team hasn't been in the best of form and that has to change. A period of transition will always involve change, but we have given all of the current players a chance to train and play, whilst starting our recruitment processes to strengthen the first and other teams if needed. All the players have responded well at training and I was surprised at the level of talent at the club considering our league position. It was disappointing that we had a couple of games postponed due to the weather but it actually gave us time to get to know the squad.

I am really pleased to have been able to assemble a management team so soon. My good friend, and former assistant, Ryan Gurton comes in as head coach. Ryan will be responsible for all training, the coaching of the team and tactical input.

Since leaving Buckingham last time he has been working at Aylesbury Utd as an assistant manager and still day to day works in football full time at both Ace Academy and Oxford Regional Talent Centre.

I am also delighted that Joe Cooper accepted my offer to stay at the club and work with us. Joe has been incredible this past week working tirelessly to keep in touch with the players and to introduce them to Ryan and I.

We will still look at add an additional coach. Someone who can help with our goalkeepers in particular but also generally training assistance and indeed recruitment.

A physio will be required too for help on match days as a minimum but ideally at training too. If anyone from within the club or externally would like to focus these roles with me, do make yourselves known.

This project is an exciting one, I want the whole club and town to come together to help make it a success. There is no way a club of this size, in a growing town like a Buckingham should be struggling at step 6. Let's all work hard on and off the pitch to take it to where it needs to be and beyond.

What hasn't changed is the floods! Big thanks to Colin in particular for getting the pitch playable, and hopefully we can re pay him with a much needed three points to start this new regime!

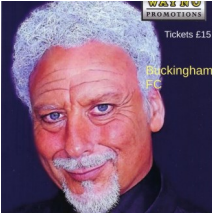
