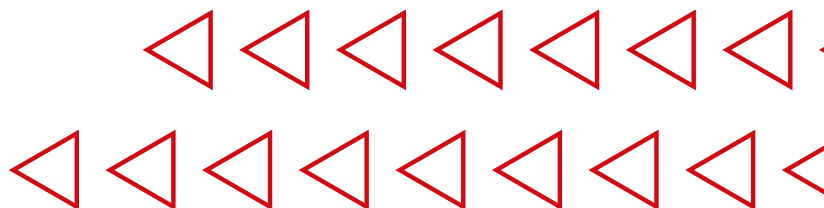
Track & Field

All speed and agility workouts take place on campus. Athletes will start and finish in the Athletic Center (building G) at the same time each day, rain or shine.

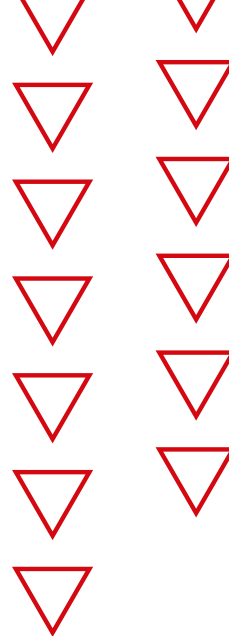
