Pastoral Letter from Revd David Bickersteth

Spiritual Reality

My faith is both driven by my mind, that is considering doctrine and scripture – which convinces me that I'm on the right track, and my faith is based upon supernatural experience.

As a teenager (many decades ago!) I tried spiritism to see if 'there was anything out there' – there was, and it was dark. It led me to search the Christian faith – not difficult for I had an extended family of clergy! They were people I trusted and admired.

Years later, when rector of Gosforth and Wasdale, I was invited by Bishop George Hacker, to join the diocesan deliverance group – nick-named the 'Ghost Busters' by some! I was a member of the team for seventeen years, and we met regularly in Durham with colleagues from all major denominations. Some tales would make many shudder, but I can assure you, the spiritual world is very real and can be very menacing to those who treat it lightly.

Christianity speaks of a God who is Spirit and Truth (John 4:24). Jesus demonstrated his divinity in signs and wonders. Above all else we remember his conquest of death and the gift of the Holy Spirit to his followers. Today as well as two thousand years ago, Knowing Jesus is a supernatural relationship, not just cerebral. I have witnessed extraordinary happenings and am convinced in the reality of the angelic realm, both good and sadly evil. From my ministry I know the power of Jesus to change lives, set people free from dark forces and bring new life.

CS Lewis, the twentieth century's most profound convert to Christianity, wrote of Jesus:

A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic—on a level with the man who says he is a poached egg—or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon; or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God. But let us not come with any patronising nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to.

For me and millions of others, a personal relationship with Jesus is at the heart of my faith and life. I have great confidence that Christianity is intellectually credible but can be experienced in a personal relationship with God's Son. This month we continue to think about the resurrection as experienced by his first followers. Next month we celebrate the giving of the Holy Spirit – God with us.

God is just a prayer away, give him a try, he longs to share his love and reality with you!

Suzanne Pender will raise your concerns with Highways, regarding the increasing number of commercial events (not for charity) that are seriously disrupting our local community. Permission is generally given without regard for local community events which have often been scheduled at the same time for many years.

Your local Police Officer, Paul Harris, reported another drugs related fly tipping event had occurred within our Parish.

United Utilities have written to us regarding the water leak that occurred, before Christmas, on the road to the common and apologised for the inconvenience this caused to their customers in the village. The work is now complete and the road has been resurfaced. I will write to Paul Forshaw to ask for an update on the work done on the water main feeding Gawthwaite.

Several parishioners have been raising concerns regarding the maintenance of local footpaths. This is the response we received from the LDNPA regarding Public Rights of Way:

"In short it has always been the land owners legal responsibility to maintain gates and stiles on a public right of way, The LDNPA have a duty to see this is done and have for many years supported landowners by fully funding this work, due to financial cuts along with losing a large percentage of our field staff we have now been forced to reduce our contribution, we do however offer some financial support to landowners in carrying out this work and in some cases such as access improvements can still provide assistance. Coniston Surgery Update CPG

We first thank everyone who signed the petition and those who made it possible.

The Integrated Care Board (ICB) is the NHS department which has the responsibility of deciding how medical services will be provided for Coniston and Torver. The ICB were impressed by the total of 1056 signatures on the petition and the number of contacts they had stressing our need to retain a GP surgery.

The CPG have lobbied the key ICB managers and involved our MP. We have also tried to find a solution to the problems raised by the ICB about the current surgery premises. Many of you will have seen the video we made to attract GP candidates.

The ICB will shortly publish their report on our situation and will meet on May 5th (postponed from April 14th) to discuss the options. We should then have a clearer idea of what will happen next.

The Rawdon-Smith Trust

The Rawdon-Smith Trust is a charity that owns the bed of Coniston Water and uses the fees collected from moorings and jetties for the benefit of local communities around the lake.

The Trust's website: **rstcharity.uk** provides more information on its work and it has an application form for grants. The Trust regularly supports voluntary bodies and charities, and recent grants have supported projects to refurbish the children's playground in Coniston, to improve Satterthwaite Parish Rooms, for an environmental notice board at Spark Bridge and to renovate the changing rooms at the Coniston Sports and Social Club.

The Trust has been keen to encourage opportunities for local young people to enjoy outdoor activities particularly on the lake. It has developed links with three lake-based outdoor centres, Water Park, Low Bank Ground and the Priestley Centre, to offer sessions for youngsters. Water Park has provided RYA sailing courses and Low Bank Ground has organised a sailing day for Coniston Primary School children. The Priestley Centre has worked in partnership with John Ruskin School to provide residential overnight stays with a selection of outdoor activities for all Year 7 students.

Many local clubs and voluntary organisations have also benefitted from grants.

Trustees meet four times each year to consider requests. The Trust's next meeting is on 5th June and online grant application forms should be submitted a minimum of 7 days prior to the meeting.




