Advancing Equity in Preschool: Sara Schmitt, PhD, Leads ISLA-P Initiative

We are thrilled to feature Sara Schmitt, PhD, recipient of funding from the College of Education's 2024-25 Faculty Fund Awards. This funding is made possible by generous donors committed to empowering faculty to pilot research projects.

Sara Schmitt, hired as the Bricker/Squires Faculty Chair in Early Intervention, will use this funding to develop the Inclusive Skill-Building Learning Approach for Preschool (ISLA-P). This project will address exclusionary discipline practices in preschool that disproportionately impact children of color, boys, and children with disabilities.

Fueling Discovery: Doctoral Research Awards Make a Lasting Impact

Through the generosity of current and past donors, the College of Education can offer up to \$3,000 in dissertation completion assistance to approved doctoral candidates. Since 2009, these awards have empowered over 100 students to pursue innovative research that benefits academia and society.

Darien Combs, PhD '21 Counseling Psychology, completed her doctoral degree with the assistance of these funds to help pay dissertation costs that included participant incentives, hiring a culturally responsive research assistant, purchasing secure hardware and software for data analysis, and transcription services. Combs now runs a private practice in Colorado, assisting patients in both Spanish and English.
