Previously I had mentioned, how not playing enough preseason fixtures had affected performances in our first league fixture at Kenilworth. The last two weeks have felt very much the same. DOR Neil Shillingford THE FINAL TAKE

I have found this final view difficult to write.

Most of my season is spent looking forward to the next game and setting targets so to reflect on the past season was strange.

Some great performances but a few disappointing close losses as well. The important thing about the close losses is to make sure you collect the bonus points. The weather took a turn for the worse and games were postponed. Along with the Xmas break we started the new year having not played for four weeks. This in turn meant the run-in till the end of the season would be without any rest weeks.

I think it is fair to say that apart from the first half against Bromsgrove those early fixtures in 2023 were scrappy performances at times. Scrappy but we still managed to pick up the wins we needed to keep us top of the pile.

The unbroken run of games was tough on the bodies and the strength of the squad was tested. At this point for some reason, we started to try and play the maths. Decisions on the park when it came to penalty options became conservative. DK have always strived to play fast open rugby. I have always encouraged teams to chase the try bonus points. To some this may seem not the most tactically sensible at times but a team with that mentality is always dangerous. It also makes great viewing for the spectators!

So, after a quick reboot we refocused and targeted what was required to get the job done.

Because of games in hand and cancelled fixtures going into the last month it was still mathematically possible that four different clubs could possibly become champions. Simple fact was it was ours to lose. Altered fixtures again kept the run in interesting for all. We could and should have had the championship wrapped up two weeks previous but down to the last game it went. We required two points from our fixture against Broadstreet to claim the title.

Once again mathematically if we failed to gain the points **Bridgnorth** could take the crown.

Once again, we don't do maths. Infront of a great home crowd swelled with members from all areas of the club, with legions of our mini junior players decked in their blue and blue kit, there was no way we were going to disappoint. A convincing win and a display of true DK running rugby and then let the party begin. What a great club day it was.

It has taken a while for me to realise what we as a club have achieved over the last six seasons. Credit must go to all.

Directors and management, Staff and volunteers, Coaches and players, Members and supporters have all played their part. I probably hadn't realised because as normal I had been so focused on looking ahead. Planning what will be required to compete at National League Rugby. It will be a massive challenge both on the pitch and off.

On the pitch we will be facing a long list of quality opposition and off the pitch logistically things will have to change.

As always, we relish the challenge. Bring it on!
