

# 2023 Surf Coast Arts Trail - Registrations Open

Being part of the Surf Coast Arts Trail can be a stepping stone for local artists, just ask Jude Morgan.

The Torquay oil painter made her Arts Trail debut in 2016, thanks to encouragement from local sculptor Cinnamon Stephens.

"I thank Cinnamon for it, and I similarly would like to encourage anyone who is considering applying to do it," Ms Morgan said. "It is a great experience and can open doors to other events and exhibitions. You don't have to have your own studio as there are community spaces available to share with other artists, and I can assure you that on my first Arts Trail I felt really welcome as a newcomer."

Artist registrations are open for the 2023 Surf Coast Arts Trail, which will be held 5 and 6 August. The trail welcomes all artists, from hobbyists to professionals, and all mediums: painting, sculpture, glassware, jewellery, ceramics, textiles and so much more.

The diversity of artists is evident through last year's trail which welcomed 11



community groups including SPARK in Deans Marsh, basket makers, fibre artists and sculptors The Weaverbirds, and a U3A SurfCoast exhibition. Eight galleries also opened their doors, from In The Skies Art and Music in Lorne, to Surf Coast Gallery in Torquay and Salt and Pepper Gallery in Bellbrae.

Forty private studios featured established artists such as Natalie Martin, Ian Westwood, Pat McKenzie, and Ms Stephens.





Council is providing quick turnaround grants of up to \$1,000 to support community events and initiatives that increase awareness of this important day.

Grant applications open 20 March and close 30 April, for activities to run between 17 May and 17 June.

Councillor Rose Hodge said the Council-run Surf Coast Arts Trail was an ideal opportunity for local artists to display their work and to open their studios and venues.


"Local and international trailgoers will have an opportunity to see first-hand why the Surf Coast is one of regional Australia's top creative hotspots," Cr Hodge said. "We hope that momentum will build from last year's trail, which sprang back to life post-pandemic with more than 200 artists across 60 venues."

Artist registrations for the 2023 Surf Coast Arts Trail are open until Wednesday 26 April. Artists can register for the event via surfcoast.vic.gov.au/ SurfCoastArtsTrail. The website has key information about the event, including registration fees.

Participating artists will receive a welcome pack, invitation to join the 2023 Surf Coast Arts Trail Facebook group, directional signage, and promotional material. They will also have an opportunity to feature in the Arts Trail Taster Show - a month long exhibition in July.

As an artist who exhibits on the trail at Surf Coast Community Arts Facility in Bellbrae, Ms Morgan showcases pieces that are often inspired by Surf Coast scenery.

"I am drawn to painting beach scenes especially waves, as well as European street scenes," she said. "I try to capture the subject that I am painting realistically and then enhance the scene by accentuating the colours I see.





# Local Legend Michael Judd helping men survive and thrive

Michael Judd is living out his purpose shining forward his late daughter Estella's vivid light and love.

Caring old soul Estella was only 8 when she was taken by brain cancer.

In her final hours her Dad promised her he would do something great to help others in repayment for the love and support his family had received, and three years on the product of his pledge may well be saving lives.

Michael became the founder of Surf Coast men's group DIIGG Wellbeing – Doing Imperfect Inner Growth in Groups.

With over 110 local members it is bringing normal blokes from all walks together to talk, connect, reflect, learn and support each other.

The concept evolved in the months following Estella's passing, as Michael shared his story with others. "Catching up, connecting and sharing my story with mates not only helped me, it also helped my mates share their story and with their encouragement I started a men's group," Michael said.

"There is always going to be pain losing a child or a loved one but it's what you do with those lessons and how you respond to life's questions, as life is a gift and the silver lining can be found by paying it forward and helping other people through their obstacles.

"Estella was a light in our lives, and everyone can shine their light in someone else's life. That's basically the purpose behind it all, and it is putting more meaning to her life."

Michael's altruistic mission has qualified him as Surf Coast Shire's latest Local Legend, recognising his positive impact helping men to survive and thrive.

DIIGG Wellbeing provides connection and storytelling for men through a simple format – with monthly Sunday evening sessions at different venues across the Surf Coast featuring a guest speaker and a co-created supportive space for attendees to share life experiences, lessons learnt with fun along the way They also connect via a WhatsApp group.

"It's basically creating a supportive space, so guys can feel safe to share their stories," Michael said. "It's not church, it's not AA, it's not fight club, it's blokes from all backgrounds blue collar to white collar getting together.

"Not all blokes have got life-changing experiences to share but it's a great chance for storytelling, and some of the benefits we've had out of it ... we've had guys who have changed their lives.



"Life is asking us all questions, every minute, every hour of the day, and we've got to respond and take action. That's what we're doing, and you don't have to do it alone."

The group is open to men aged 18 and older, with attendees generally aged from mid-20s to mid-50s and the oldest clocking in at 80. Twenty-five to 55 attend each meeting, paying \$20 each to cover food, non-alcoholic drinks and venue costs.

Guest speakers have covered topics including financial, physical, mental, social, occupational, spiritual, cultural, occupational, intellectual and environmental health.

Michael is husband of Trish, father of three and works as a Permit Authority planning and managing high risk work.

His and the leadership group's major aims for DIIGG Wellbeing in 2023 are to connect, mentor and coach younger men, and for the group to attain registration as a not-for-profit organisation.

"We are working on obtaining not-forprofit status at the moment and actively seeking pro bono assistance but are really finding it hard to engage a law firm," he says.

"We are operating off community love but it's not enough to make a massive difference, and everyone knows where men's wellbeing is at in the present moment".

"I don't accept the suicide, anxiety, depression rate. I don't accept the family violence, I don't accept the drug and alcohol abuse and people wasting their lives away, I don't accept the crime rate and number of men in jail.

"There are so many things to improve but it can't be done by only a few people."

Not-for-profit charity status will enable the group to receive sponsorship to help cover operating costs, including entry fees to ensure sessions are available to all men, and to expand into other communities.



#### Annual Check up to help prevent kidney disease

The latest research shows that one in five people living with diabetes are also living with chronic kidney disease.

"Diabetes is one of the main causes of chronic kidney disease in Australia; however, most kidney disease can be prevented or delayed if detected early," Dan Tehan MP said. "Unfortunately, only around a quarter of people living with diabetes get their kidneys checked regularly.

Diabetes Australia Group CEO Justine Cain said chronic kidney disease (CKD) developed when high blood glucose levels damaged the tiny blood vessels in the kidneys.


