If you want to attract birds to your garden plant Grevillias.


If you want to attract more birds, plant more Grevillias!

• There are over 380 species which are endemic to Australia.

- Plants in the genus Grevillea are shrubs, rarely small trees.
- The genus was named in honour of Charles Francis Greville, an 18th-century patron of botany and co-founder of the Royal Horticultural Society
- Many animals rely on the pollen and nectar from grevilleas as a source of food, in particular, insects and birds.
- The insect-pollinated species tend to have smaller, more fragrant

- flowers than bird-pollinated species as insects are more drawn to fragrances than birds are.
- Most species of grevillea appear well-adapted to pollination by birds the most prominent are the honeyeaters
- Aboriginal peoples utilise grevilleas for a wide variety of uses, including food, medicine, tools and ceremonial purposes.



# Cromwell's Quirks Gender-Based Taxation?

# Part One: Retirement Comfort Determined at Birth

The old "Equality Versus Fairness" debate is winding up again, this time for superannuation gaps, feminist calls for structural reform, a radical tax debate is asking whether fairness means treating everyone the same, or reshaping the rules themselves. Few would argue the statistics, women retire much poorer than men. My thoughts today lean towards how this is not from their lack of effort, far from it, and that to address this inequality, the system itself, which proudly accommodates all manner of "special cases" with agility and grace, will be not so very greatly taxed to remedy this imbalance. When economists Alberto Alesina and Andrea Ichino first proposed Gender-Based Taxation (GBT) in the early 2000s, the idea was striking in its elegance: if optimal tax policy demands that lower rates apply to goods or services more sensitive to taxation, then women, (whose labour supply is generally more sensitive to tax rates than men's), should face lower personal tax burdens. At its heart, the proposal was not framed as a moral argument but as a technical one. If men are more likely to stay in the workforce regardless of tax rates, while women are more likely to adjust their hours or exit employment when taxation rises, then differential tax rates could, in theory, maximise efficiency by encouraging greater female participation. Yet once the idea escaped academic journals, it opened a larger and far more contentious debate: should men and women pay different rates of tax?

# The Case for Gender-Based Taxation

Proponents argue that GBT could deliver multiple benefits simultaneously,

including increasing workforce participation; women are more likely than men to take on unpaid caregiving roles, to work part-time, or to exit the workforce altogether. By lowering the tax burden on women, policymakers could make it more financially attractive for them to remain in paid employment. Greater participation would not only benefit women individually but could also boost national productivity.\ Addressing lifetime income gaps would be of great benefit, even in advanced economies, women retire with significantly less accumulated wealth. In Australia, women's superannuation balances are, on average, around 25-30 per cent lower than men's. In Submission 36 to the Economic Security for Women in Retirement inquiry, Mrs Buckley stressed that a 12 per cent Superannuation Guarantee "would definitely help women in achieving some form of balance." A gender-sensitive tax system could complement such measures by helping women accumulate more over their working lives. Circumstances-based tax is far from radical, we already recognise income splitting and tax credits for dependants and progressive tax brackets depending on marital status, family structure or income level are practiced in one way or another over much of the world. (I.e. if taxation is already conditional, then why not include gender?) My research hasn't found many countries explicitly embracing GBT, and nevertheless i greatly doubt this won't change soon. The ongoing argument in Canada for example is the criticism of disproportionately benefitting higherearning men, some saying which strengthens the case for more explicitly gender-addressing policies. Sweden has long used individual rather than household taxation, reducing the disincentive for second earners, (disproportionately women), for entering the workforce. Favourable points by their very nature attract objections, and these, fiercely so. Some argue that

GBT will codify gender roles and reinforce stereotypes. Also, were women taxed less, in accordance with their more marginal participation, would this not entrench the very inequality reformers profess to seek? GBT could be argued to raise practical concerns regarding administration and legal complexity. On the surface it appears this would require taxation agencies to formally gather gender-identity data. Would the relevant legislation require exactly how systems account for non-binary individuals? Then there's that demographic of people who always try to beat the system, and could it ever be defended that more tax schedules would not create opportunities for evasion, or complexity that tempts those who see the benefits of undermining compliance? The philosophical objection just might end up the most powerful "people's" critique. For those societies who still attempt to make at least some pretension to equality before the law, GBT will always be perceived as discriminatory, regardless of how positively so. Senator Jane Hume's provocative question, "Should men and women pay different tax rates?", captures just such discomfort. It could also be argued that more targeted measures may represent an improvement over GBT, for example, superannuation tops up during parental leave to ensure breaks in career do not adversely affect anyone. Mandated parental leave between both parents, paid, as they do in Iceland and Norway, would encourage a better balance through men's participation in caregiving. Universal childcare subsidies would certainly ease the "cost of working" burden, known to be borne disproportionately by women. By such approaches we could tackle the system itself, mitigating the structural drivers of inequality without the state being required to resort to GBT

#### Mansions that made Winchelsea

#### Thomas Austin and the Rabbits of Winchelsea

Most Winchelsea locals have heard the story of Thomas Austin of Barwon Park being the first settler in Australia to release rabbits in the wild. You can see the symbol of rabbits as a reminder of this throughout the town today. In 2022, a study of genomic data confirmed Australia's feral rabbit population was entirely descended from the rabbits introduced by Austin.

As a member of the Acclimatisation Society of Victoria, Thomas Austin of Barwon Park helped to introduce many species from England. In 1 861, he wrote that he had introduced hares, blackbirds and thrushes, and that he was breeding English wild rabbits and partridges.

In October 1 859, he introduced 24 breeding rabbits (Oryctolagus cuniculus) on his estate as game for shooting parties. While other settlers praised his efforts at the time, he has borne the brunt of blame for introducing this pest to Australia.

In December 1 867 Queen Victoria's son, Prince Alfred, visited Australia. He stayed at the Austin's homestead and went shooting there. In three and half hours over 1 000 rabbits were shot by the party. The Prince alone shot 41 6 and was so delighted with the shoot another was arranged for the Prince's return visit to Victoria the following February. On that occasion he claimed 432 of the 1,532 rabbits shot that day.



## Winchelsea Projects Update

#### **EV** charger installation

Winchelsea residents and visitors will be able to plug into a new public electric vehicle, EV, charger by the end of October.

The 50kW charger will be installed in Willis Street near the town's former library building, with two parking bays allocated for charging and an adjoining parking bay providing disability access.

Increased power capacity will be provided to the site via underground cabling to a new main switchboard at the former library.

Several sites for the charger were considered before selection of Willis Street due to factors including:

- Availability of Council land with ability to connect to Councilowned and operated switchboard and metering equipment
- · Availability of power supply
- Convenient access for travellers, with supporting amenities
- · Disability access



Minimal impacts to heritage buildings.

Costs for use will be 45c per kilowatt hour while vehicles are charging. If vehicles remain on the charger from 10 minutes after charging, an idle fee of \$1 a minute will apply.

Surf Coast Shire Council is supporting EV use through installation of public charging stations at several locations across the municipality, with supporting funding from the Victorian Government through its Destination Charging Across Victoria program.

#### Memorial grandstand improvements

Upgrading of the heritage-listed Soldiers Memorial Grandstand at Eastern Reserve is scheduled to start this week.

The building has provided a home for Winchelsea RSL Sub-branch members for close to 100 years and the renovation project is of great importance to veterans, members, their families and the wider community.

Work will include:

- Construction of a new entry ramp to improve safety and accessibility
- Expansion of library, museum and work spaces
- Opening of an internal wall connecting two ground floor rooms
- Repairs to windows and doors
- · Internal and external painting, and

• Installation of downlighting which will highlight the building façade.

Work is expected to take up to eight weeks and an official opening is expected to be late in October.

RSL members will be joined by community on 13 September for a celebration acknowledging a century of RSL use of rooms within the memorial grandstand.

The upgrading project is being jointly funded, with a contribution of \$49,728 from the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing via the Victorian Veterans Capital Works Program 2023-2024, and a \$10,000 in-kind contribution from the RSL Sub-branch.

Council is managing the project in collaboration with the sub-branch and contributing \$37,000.

# Why some climate policies are more popular than others – a psychologist explains

(By Wouter Poortinga; Professor of Environmental Psychology, Cardiff University via The Conversation UK)

In a UK-wide study, my team and I asked more than 2,000 people what they thought about 12 different climate policies that focused on diet, home energy and transport. These included "push" measures such as taxes and bans that aim to discourage carbonintensive behaviour, and "pull" measures such as subsidies and support that encourage lower-carbon alternatives.

We found that most people strongly favour pull measures......

People want to know that a policy will actually reduce emissions. They also care deeply about how its benefits and costs are shared. Taxes and restrictions often fail both these tests: they are seen as neither effective nor as fair.

We also investigated how much people think others support or oppose a policy. We found that people consistently underestimate how much others support climate action. This phenomenon is known as "pluralistic ignorance". On average, respondents underestimated support by 18%, and overestimated opposition by 16%. This creates a kind of shared illusion that climate policies are less popular than they actually are......

Climate action does not just need good policy, it also needs good psychology. Understanding and addressing how people perceive climate measures is essential to avoid backlash and build lasting public consent.

# Why China is becoming the world's first electrostate

(by ABC climate reporter Jo Lauder)

In April this year, China installed more solar power than Australia has in all its history. In one month.

China became the world's factory at the end of the 20th century, manufacturing cheap, low-quality products. This industrialisation modernised the country but also caused widespread environmental damage and drastic air pollution.

The factories were powered by fossil fuels, causing China's emissions to skyrocket and it to become the largest polluter in the world

"Even if you have pretty poor-quality natural resources, you can still squeeze quite a bit of electricity out of a solar panel. It's really changing the geopolitics," the Australian National University's Dr Gosens said.

"Renewable energy is the most secure form of energy that there is because you just eliminate the need for imports.

"But also the cost of it, right? It's a stable cost. You lock it in as soon as you build it. You know what the price of your electricity is going to be. You get insulated from both those risks if you have more renewable energy."

For Australia, one of the world's largest exporters of coal and gas, there is plenty to take from this, with China's furious electrification paving the way for the rest of the world to follow.

#### The science of a drying world

(by Pedro DiNezio, Associate Professor of Atmospheric and Ocean Sciences, University of Colorado Boulder and Timothy Shanahan, Associate Professor of Geological Science, The University of Texas at Austin via The Conversation US)

For decades, scientists have relied on a basic physical principle to predict rainfall trends: Warmer air holds more moisture. In a warming world, this means wet areas are likely to get wetter, while dry regions become drier. In dry areas, as temperatures rise, more moisture is pulled from soils and transported away from these arid regions, intensifying droughts.

While most climate models simulate this general pattern, they often underestimate its full extent, particularly over land areas.

Yet countries are already experiencing drought emerging as one of the most immediate and severe consequences of climate change. Understanding what's ahead is essential, to know how long these droughts will last and because severe droughts can have sweeping effects on ecosystems, economies and global food security.

Drought is a growing problem, increasingly driven by human influence. The picture that emerges is sobering, revealing a much higher risk of drought across the world.

# Blue whales have stopped singing in the Pacific Ocean.

(from Monterey Bay Aquarium Research Institute)






