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






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### Head of School Message

Your partnership is vital in our mission and vision of creating the world we seek for children here at Westfield Friends School. This report recounts a small fraction of what your support provides for our students, their families, and our community of educators.

From the start of the academic year to graduation, our students were united under the theme of "We Seek An Earth Restored." Whether it was during their first overnight stay at Camp Darkwater, kayaking on the Cooper River, painting pictures of Iris flowers growing on campus, or adopting trees in the cemetery, our students were able to fully immerse themselves in the natural beauty around them. Queries in Meeting for Worship asked them to consider themselves as parts of the natural world. This led to some thought-provoking questions about how we can better protect our community's plants, animals, and people. They identified concrete actions we can take to make a difference in reducing single-use plastics during class celebrations.

Teachers and staff act as guides and motivators, demonstrating the value of lifelong learning and encouraging students' exploration and budding activism. Transitioning from a conventional teacher-centered pedagogy to a Quaker-grounded experiential learning approach has become a challenging multi-year endeavor. The teachers' project-based learning units are in sync with our school's mission, initiating thought-provoking queries that stimulate curiosity instead of providing answers. Culminating in authentic communication through writing and presentations, their highly collaborative projects provide ample time for reflection and learning.

This year teachers are continuing this pedagogical shift with support from our partners at PBLworks.org. One teacher completed her Master's Degree, and two others participated in the Parker Palmer-inspired SPARC (Spirited Practice and Renewed Courage) program through Friends Council on Education. Six attended national conferences, including NCTM, NAEYC, and NCSS. Others attended the NJAIS annual innovation summit. Our new DEIB Coordinator led two inservice day sessions on understanding and supporting student identity formation and partnering with families. Your generous gifts open up this world of opportunities.

I write with deep appreciation for all of your unwavering support in the past. It is with purpose that I write to encourage you to consider the possibility of increasing your contribution to Westfield in 2023-2024. And I write with the promise that your gifts of time, talent, and treasure will help ensure that the Westfield students of today and tomorrow continue to "create an earth restored."

Third, Fourth, and Fifth Grades went kayaking on Cooper River. The students learned about their local watershed in their place-based social studies program.

3rd-grader, Cora, told us "I learned there are three different kinds of plants in the river." Classmate, Alara, asked, "Did you know that there are lots of eagles on the island in the river?" And Michael learned that "the plants help to filter the water for the fish and other animals."

4th-grader Noah recalled, "There have been a lot of shipwrecks, including an old WW2 container ship called the Barnegat." And Charlie, another 4th-grader, mused, "Some of the plants are underwater and some float on top, and some, depending on the tide, do both."

As part of the earth science geology curriculum, sixth and seventh-grade students visited Virginia to explore the wonders of Luray Caverns and Shenandoah National Park. The trip served as an extension of their classroom learning, which also included a year-long project-based learning unit inspired by the book *All Thirteen: The Incredible Cave Rescue of the Thai Boys' Soccer Team*.

6th-grader, Landon, fondly remembered that is was "great to hike in the Shenandoah." And his peer, Ethan, "really enjoyed the independence we had to explore."

7th-graders also had insights. Henrietta, shared that "Limestone is porous and when water drips down, it adds new minerals so the stalactites are always getting longer." Classmate, Julia, was astonished that "Luray Caverns is old and enormous." And Heidi recollected that they all "got to see the President and Vice President drive by!"



First Grade went on a trip to Cedar Run Wildlife Refuge. This trip sparked their driving question "What is the human impact on endangered New Jersey species?"






### At a Glance
