





























A COLLECTION OF MEMORIES FROM THE 51[°] YEAR OF THIS INCREDIBLE SCHOOL

Last year I spoke about our growth to "bigger and better" and while bigger is not necessarily better, we are in a unique position where we are able to realise that vision for our learners. Well a year has passed and we can without any doubt say we have realised so much this past year that has made us bigger and certainly better.

As South Africans on a whole who are feeling the pinch, we have been able to stay ahead of the curve as a result of having more learners this year (in excess of 1000) and due to the work of the amazing group of ladies in the finance office under the guidance of our bursar Mrs Peacock, their efforts have allowed us to realise the projects currently underway at Bryanston High School (BHS). These efforts would not be possible without you, our parents for the part you play in paying your school fees annually.

As always, our first function of the year was our staff long service awards with numerous staff being recognised for reaching various milestones in their chosen careers. We welcomed 14 new "young" staff with a mix of academics and administration and sorts administrator. These new staff members have replaced staff who have either resigned or retired over the last 18 months. At the same time, we celebrated 30 and 40 years of service with phenomenal ladies. Mrs Schumann has been in the BHS family for 30 years and the indomitable Mrs Weir for 40. During the course of the year we did experience a very unfortunate labour issue. We believe we dealt with this very sensitive matter correctly and with compassion. We have always made the effort to keep parents informed and our approach has been to handle the matter with complete transparency while still respecting the dignity of the learners and staff member concerned.

From an academic perspective we had great results with our outgoing matrics. We achieved a very commendable 98 % pass rate. Our thanks to all staff for their input into the lives of the class of 2018 over the last 5 years.

While we acknowledge that we are first and foremost an academic institution, we do strive to provide a holistic education which includes cultural, sporting and social responsibility programs. On the cultural side we found ourselves in the middle of an amazing production of "Chicago". At various times I was in the vicinity of the school, even on voting day, I was able to watch as the production came together. The effort from staff and learners alike was awe inspiring and their efforts culminated in the brilliant performance they put together. In addition, our thanks to parents who helped in the production, for their mentoring, passion and just being willing to play "mom's taxi". The production yet again set exceptionally high standards and brought out talent in our learners that many parents and friends did not believe existed.

From a sporting perspective we have undertaken a massive Capex upgrade in the planned provision of our Astro. The project is well underway and will be completed mid-February 2020. The Astro will be a full water based facility with floodlighting and will be comparable to any facility in South Africa.

In my report of 2018 I made mention of rugby coaches starting preseason training in October in anticipation of the new 2019 season. Well, what a year they had. Our First XV has had a phenomenal year winning 15 of their 16 matches and in the process beating Fourways and Randpark twice in the regular season with only 1 loss. The team undertook two tours - one down to KZN and one to Namibia to play against the best schools in Namibia. In the process they acquitted themselves exceptionally well against much larger schools, so much so, that they have been invited back in 2020. As mentioned last year, this is a young team and we look forward to 2020 to see how this team matures both on the field and as young men.

Our netball girls have once again had a phenomenal season with our 1st Team just missing out on a flawless performance. Just like the rugby boys, they played with absolute passion and as the year progressed in was interesting to watch as they peaked around our larger derby days. Their performance against Fourways was flawless and they did every Bryanstonian proud on the day.

We look forward to 2020 with a number of new trial sports being introduced. To stay relevant these sports will complement our current offering. While I would love to expand on this, all I can say right now is watch this space. On a negative note it has been concerning to see support from parents and learners decline at sporting events. I would like to appeal to all parents to encourage their sons and daughters to participate in school activities and to then come out and support them on the sports field. As a parent of two boys who have been through the Bryanston system, I know just how much your support for your children means to them. Your being there for them will make memories they will cherish forever.

In between all the mainstream activities on the campus our learners and staff have been very busy with activates such as Miss Pizzazz, Miss Elegance, Mr Bryanston, the LAN Club, the Midmar Mile, Debs and Squires, LIA, grade camps, councillor camps, debating, the Matric Dance, Parlauf and numerous charitable projects. Thanks to all who gave up their time to make these events a success.

We are indeed fortunate to have Mr John Skelton as our Principal. Mr Skelton leads a dynamic Senior Management Team comprising staff with years of experience combined with the energy of youth. Anyone involved in the governance of a school will very quickly realise that no two days are ever alike. With over 1000 learners, their parents and the GDE to serve, the value of a capable and competent SMT cannot be underestimated. We are privileged to have a SMT that continues to manage the day to day functions of the school efficiently, with integrity and often with compassion and empathy. Their leadership style contributes to the ethos of our school and makes every one of our learner's part of the larger "Bryanston Family".

As Chairman of the Governing Body I am acutely aware of the need to maintain standards in a climate where many schools are facing tremendous challenges. These range from providing a good education in a disciplined environment with limited resources, to providing opportunity for learners to express themselves on the sports field or on the stage. The accolade of "Top School" in the northern suburbs is testimony to each and every teacher's commitment to our learners. We will be eternally in your debt for the influence you have had in the lives of our sons and daughters.

As with learners leaving Bryanston High School, so too, do we lose parents from our Governing Body. During the year we lost Mrs Giselle Schiavini and Dave Denton whose children matriculated from the school. Our thanks to them for the many hours they put into the school and their input into making Bryanston great. At the bye-elections held earlier in the year, we welcomed Mrs Aleena Bharuth and Mr Shalen Ramduth to the SGB and we look forward to your input and insight as we continue to grow and serve the Bryanston community. They have taken on the Fundraising and Discipline portfolios respectively.

Our existing members who continue to serve are Mr Kenneth O'Connor (Sport and Vice Chair), Bruce Tyson (Treasurer), Trevor Blackstock (Governance), Ron Tavener (Grounds and Maintenance) and Jackie Vernon (HR). Our gratitude to you all for your willingness to serve in what can be a tough but immensely rewarding environment. To our Grade 12s, I would really encourage you to join the Bryanston High Alumni and contribute in some way to the Alumni Foundation. As you take what you have learned here and spread your wings, I trust you will look back fondly at your time here and where possible play your part in shaping the lives of future learners at Bryanston High.

Our U16 A team did it yet again – for the 3rd year – only losing 1 League match which meant they went through to JOMO play-offs again.


Our 1st team also had a great season with wins against President, Glenvista, Edenglen to name a few but our biggest victory was beating Fourways yet again with a score of 30-20.

I am the Registered Psychological Counsellor for the learners at Bryanston High School.

What is a Registered Psychological Counsellor?

I am a Health Professional registered under the Health Professions Act and the governing board called the HPCSA (Health Professions Council of South Africa). Registered Counsellors assist to make psychological services more accessible in South Africa.

Me as a Registered Psychological Counsellor

In addition to being able to help with a broad scope of a client's life, I importantly screen for and cater to the psychological side of a person's wellbeing. I believe counselling is my calling as I've always had an innate passion for helping other people. I use mainly a person-centered with eclectic (including cognitive behavioural) approach to empower and suit each unique client.

What is the purpose of counselling?

The main purpose of counselling is for the clients to learn how to cope, overcome challenges, improve functioning and experience personal growth. The success of counselling is largely dependent on their honesty and voluntary disclosure of what is really going on in their lives in the sessions and, for the clients to take responsibility to use the necessary skills/techniques/insights from counselling and apply them in their own lives.

Why should the counselling profession be respected?

Registered Counsellors are faced with numerous challenges in their daily practices but, these challenges are an expected part of the therapeutic relationship, a relationship built on trust and openness. Psychology is one of the most complex professions as Health Professionals deal with the most vulnerable state of clients. Psychological Professionals are expected to not compromise their profession, given the privilege to practise a profession that deals with the most confidential aspects of human behaviour and experience. Various responsibilities are associated with the profession of psychology, with ethical requirements being of paramount importance. In other words, maintaining a protective attitude in safeguarding the best interests of the client. The best interest of a child is of highest importance in this profession, as well as in my own value system.

What services can I offer as Bryanston High School's Registered Psychological Counsellor?

- Screening and identification of mental health challenges
- Containment of presenting difficulties and trauma containment
- Provide preventative, developmental counselling services and interventions
- Promotion of primary psychosocial wellbeing
- Psychoeducation to clients and staff
- Education and barriers to learning guidance and services


