Cup Dreams Begin

The Football Association has released the opening round draws for the 2025/26 FA Cup, FA Trophy, and FA Vase, with local clubs preparing to kick off their campaigns in early August.

Seven of the region's eight FA Cup entrants begin in the Extra-Preliminary Round on 2nd August 2025, with six enjoying home advantage.

Hallam host newly promoted Northern Premier League Division One West side Lower Beck, who earned promotion via the North West Counties League play-offs.

Penistone Church welcome Padiham, the beaten finalists in that same play-off.

Handsworth face fellow NCEL side Silsden at home.

Parkgate and **Sheffield** also host NCEL rivals, Eccleshill United and Albion Sports respectively.

Rossington Main take on United Counties League side Moulton at Oxford Street.

Wombwell Town are the only side drawn away, travelling to Horbury Town.

Winners will receive £1,125, with £375 awarded to the losing teams. The Preliminary



Round follows on 16 August.

Stocksbridge Park Steels, as a Step 3 club, enter at the First Qualifying Round on 30 August.

Hallam will compete in the FA Trophy for the first time, beginning with an away tie against either Consett or Bishop Auckland (both NPL Division One East) on 6 September.

Stocksbridge Park Steels enter at the Third Qualifying Round on 3 October.

Several all-NCEL ties feature in the FA Vase,

Handsworth take on Nostell MW at Olivers Mount whilst Horbury Town visit **Club Thorne Colliery** at the Chesterfield Poultry Stadium

Other fixtures include **Penistone Church** travelling to FC St Helens (NWCL Premier Division), **Rossington Main** also go to Merseyside with a visit to Litherland Remyca also of the NWCL Premier Division.

Doncaster City debut with a trip to Abbey Hey **Maltby Main** and **Swallownest** host Stockport Georgians and City of Liverpool respectively

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic travel to Euston Hey (NWCL Division One North)

Second Qualifying Round (20 September) sees **Parkgate**, **Sheffield**, **Armthorpe Welfare**, **Athersley Recreation**, **Dearne & District**, and **Dronfield Town** enter. Only one tie is confirmed: **Armthorpe Welfare** at home to Darwen.

Wombwell Town, following last season's impressive run to the Third Round Proper, enter at the First Round Proper on 18 October.

Warmsworth CC Makes Father's Day History

In a remarkable and possibly unprecedented moment in local cricket, Warmsworth Cricket Club fielded a team featuring three father-son pairings—a total of seven players from just three families—in a Barnsley & District Cricket League match against Crofton Phoenix (Wakefield).

The match, played fittingly on Father's Day, became a celebration of family, tradition, and the enduring spirit of grass-roots sport.

Lining up for Warmsworth and pictured from left to right were:

Harry, Jonathan (Dad) and Charlie Iball; Jay (Dad) and George Horne;

James and Jonathan Schofield (Dad).

This unique configuration meant that seven of the eleven players on the field were directly related—an extraordinary statistic in any competitive league setting.

“To my knowledge, this is the first—and possibly the last—time something like this has happened,” said club official Ashley Boothman. “It was a special moment for the players, their families, and the club as a whole.”

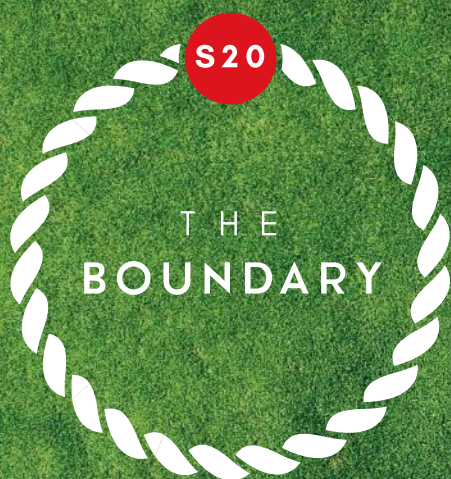
While the match result may fade into the background, the occasion itself will be long remembered. Fathers and sons shared the pitch not just as teammates, but as torchbearers



of a sporting legacy that spans generations.

Such a gathering is rare in league cricket, and local historians believe it may be a first for the Barnsley & District Cricket League.

Whether or not it is ever repeated, June 15, 2025, will be etched in Warmsworth CC's history as a day when cricket was more than a game—it was a family affair.
