2CHR30:1-11

## Single, saved, and living life









Beloved Saints, God's rest, yoke, peace, refuge, and promises are ALL "Ours For The Taking."




## Becoming Extraordinary and Undergoing Transformation Incorporating Faith Understanding and Love ${\bf FAITH}$

Faith and believing is the beginning of any journey. Whether it's a spiritual journey that leads to peace, joy, and righteousness in the Holy Ghost or a journey to the store to buy milk, the first step in reaching your final destination is to first believe that you can get there. So, what is faith then? The bible teaches that faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen (Heb 11:1). Simply put, it's having confidence for things you hope for when there's no visible evidence that it is even possible. For a long time, I didn't believe that I could be emotionally whole. I settled for being "better than I used to be". But God had so much more in store. Before you begin the journey of healing, you need to understand that complete healing is possible. God heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds (Ps 147:3). He takes care of the pain and the scars. No matter what you've been through or how difficult it seems, you can be whole, only believe.

We practice faith every day without even realizing it. When you sit in a chair, you have faith that the chair can hold your weight. When you drive across a bridge, you have faith that it won't collapse beneath you. When you go to the store to buy milk, you have faith that the store has milk. We sit in chairs, cross bridges and go to the store exercising faith in man-made process. How can we have faith in those things and not trust God?
