#### **BUYING AND DEVELOPING REAL ESTATE IN NEW ZEALAND**

#### **Types of Land Title**

New Zealand's property law framework recognises several forms of land ownership, the most common being:

- Freehold The most straightforward and preferred form of ownership, providing full and indefinite rights to the land and improvements.
- Leasehold Ownership of the right to occupy land for a set period, under the terms of a lease.
   Leasehold titles are more common in waterfront or seabed areas, particularly in cities like Auckland.
   These arrangements can be complex and require careful legal review to understand the terms, obligations, and long-term implications.

#### **Overseas Investment Regime**

The acquisition of sensitive assets by overseas investors is governed by the Overseas Investment Act 2005, which ensures that such investments are in New Zealand's national interest. The Overseas Investment Office (OIO) administers this regime, which is currently under review, with proposed changes aimed at streamlining the application process and reducing barriers to investment in certain sectors.

Due to these regulatory controls, not all land is readily available for overseas development. Properties classified as "sensitive" may require formal consent before acquisition. As the OIO operates under delegated ministerial authority, it is essential for overseas investors—particularly those involved in infrastructure, commercial development, or large-scale land acquisitions—to seek legal advice at an early stage. This helps ensure compliance, avoid delays, and manage risk effectively.

#### COMMERCIAL PROPERTY INVESTMENT IN NEW ZEALAND

#### Why Invest in New Zealand?

New Zealand offers a stable, transparent, and investor-friendly environment for commercial real estate investment.

With a resilient economy, a well-regulated legal system, and strategic positioning within the Asia-Pacific region, the country continues to attract long-term investors seeking security, growth, and access to a dynamic market.

#### **Commercial Property and Overseas Investment**

Overseas investors can generally purchase commercial property in New Zealand without consent from the Overseas Investment Office (OIO), unless:

- The total purchase price exceeds NZ\$100 million (for a single transaction or a series of related transactions), or
- The property is classified as or adjoins sensitive land—such as foreshore, conservation land, lakes, or certain categories of rural land.

Leases of commercial property by overseas persons also typically do not require OIO consent unless:

- The property is situated on or adjacent to sensitive land, and
- The lease term (including rights of renewal) is three years or more.

Our team provides clear guidance to help investors assess whether OIO approval is required and ensure all regulatory requirements are met from the outset.
