I'm sure you will feel the pride that Renee and I experience in bringing you the tenth edition of The Italian Film Festival.

Ten years ago, the old Italian Film Festival suddenly ceased; before I could even consider the implications, Renee drafted a Press Release announcing to the world that we would launch a brand new, re-invented Italian Film Festival. It was a vertiginous leap into an entirely new side of the film industry. From the sustained official support of The Italian Embassy in Wellington to Italian businesses and societies to film-loving individuals, our Festival is buoyed by Italians and Italo-philes alike. 

THE ART OF APERITIVO -

How an evening pastime became a symbol of Italianità

Could aperitivo be one of the greatest inventions ever made? We think so. A quintessential Italian tradition, a glorious way to wrap up the day, a convivial moment to be enjoyed with friends and new acquaintances: it is remarkable how much this simple pre-dinner ritual packs in.

Not to be confused with happy hour there are no two-for-one deals involved! - aperitivo is like a magic word and a state of mind. It is fun, unpretentious, and the best way to kick off an evening or, why not, a celebration in style.

When we aperitivi-amo, we open (as the Latin "aperire" suggests) our stomachs with a traditionally bitter, low alcohol cocktail that prepares us for dinner. We also open mouths and seats at our table to chiacchierare - to chat and spend time with friends.

In 1860, Gaspare Campari introduced his eponymous vibrant red, bitter beverage, widely served as an aperitivo with soda water or in cocktails like the Negroni and Americano. (The exact recipe for Campari remains a secret today).

The true beauty of aperitivo lies in the feeling that you are in Italy and celebrating a time old tradition.

No matter what you are drinking or who you are with, it's the anticipation that you are at the beginning of an adventure. To that end, both drink and tradition are a bit like taking a holiday - and we can't think of a sweeter experience than that.

NEGRONI

Ingredients /

1 PART Campari 1 PART London Dry Gin 1 PART Sweet Red Vermouth

- 1. Pour the London Dry Gin, Sweet Red Vermouth and Campari directly into the glass filled with ice
- 2. Garnish with a slice of fresh orange

The Negroni Sbagliato was invented in 1972 by Mirko Stocchetto at Bar Rosso in Milano, who created this take on a classic by accident. When asked to make a Negroni, Stocchetto pouredprosecco instead of gin. In Italian 'sbagliato' means mistaken.



Gloria! Gloria!



The directorial debut of Italian actress and singer, Margherita Vicario, is a joy to watch!

Set at the turn of the 19th century, at Sant'Ignazio Institute a convent-like orphanage for young women who are musically trained by dour chapel master Perlina (Paolo Rossi). Ahead of a much-anticipated visit from the newly-appointed Pope Pius VII, the institute receives a grand pianoforte (a prototype of course, as they were not invented until nearly 60 years later), which is deemed a 'machine of evil' and the piano is hidden away, only to be discovered by an overlooked maid, Galatéa Bellugi (The Taste of Things) whose hidden talents helps to inspire an uprising.

WHY YOU SHOULD SEE THIS FILM

Gloria! received a long standing ovation from the audience following its screening at the Berlinale in 2024.

The film is reminiscent of Paola Cortellesi's recent Italian hit, There's Still Tomorrow for its female emancipation theme and mixing of a period setting with modern, contemporary music elements. It has the charm of Little Women, the stylised academia of Dead Poet's Society and the cross-generational tensions of Amadeus.

The title 'Gloria!' is a callback to Vivaldi, whose famous piece was composed in Venice for the choir of the Ospedale della Pietà, an orphanage for girls, well-known for its all-female musical ensembles that attracted tourists and patrons from around Europe. Renee Mark

Set in the Traiano periphery district of Napoli, Ciao Bambino takes an aesthetic and philosophical approach to tell a story of love, crime and the legacy older generations force on the young. In stunning black and white photography reminiscent of the New Wave of Italian Cinema, we are immersed into a dangerous world where growing up is complicated and uncertain. At 19 years old, young Attillo takes his first job as a minder for a young Ukrainian prostitute. This is a world of survival with little room for sentimentality, yet somehow, a love germinates. To complicate matters, young Attillo will also have to repay debts and promises his father made. Soon, Attillo will be forced to choose between freedom, his family, and his romantic heart. Director Edgardo Pistone never falls into predictable tropes, crime cliches or sentimentality, instead offering a very stylish, even cool, but realistic portrayal of a small moment in a very challenging world. Without a doubt, this is a new Italian directorial voice to watch, with a powerful visual approach and a stylish, fresh take on the gritty crime genre. Paolo Rotondo

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The formidable Pierfrancesco Favino delivers a powerhouse performance in gripping maritime thriller Comandante, which opened the 2023 Venice Film Festival.

Oct 15, 1940. Nighttime. The Italian Royal Navy submarine Cappellini is navigating the Atlantic Ocean, under the command of Salvatore Todaro (Favino), when she comes upon a merchant ship sailing with lights out. After the ship suddenly opens fire on the Cappellini, it is quickly sunk. Disobeying orders from his own Fascist command, Salvatore makes a selfless decision - one that puts his crew at great risk, but which also makes history.

Directed by award-winning filmmaker Edoardo de Angelis (Indivisible, The Vice of Hope) who co-authored the screenplay with Sandro Veronesi, and featuring a striking score by Massive Attack's Robert Del Naja, this tense and exciting antiwar epic eschews sensationalism and sentimentality in order to closely examine the courage of upholding one's ethics in times of social rupture. Simone Godano's engaging film Family Matters is set in a sprawling family that proves to be fertile ground for both drama and levity. Godano takes six siblings who all share the same father but different mothers and thrusts them together at their patriarch's funeral. They all gather together for the first time in their lives in their father's home in Bordeaux to execute his will. Each of them is searching for something different, but none of them bargain on getting each other. It is an ensemble all-star cast that is deftly directed to make the most of the comedic moments but never shies away from the story's pathos. It is a bittersweet tale where siblings at different stages of life and experiences, spread between Italy and France, come together and somehow paint a complex picture of the person who is no longer there, their father. I found it to be a thoroughly entertaining drama with enjoyable comic flourishes that reminded me of the universality/ normality of dysfunctional families. Paolo Rotondo

However he struggles to adjust to small-town culture until he finds his feet with Principal Agnese's (Virginia Raffaele) help. But soon he learns that the school's diminishing numbers threatens its very existence. Populations in ancient villages are decreasing all over Italy. Thus, Michele and Agnese are thrust into a race against time to save the school and their way of life. Filmed in the beautiful Abruzzi National Park with professional actors and non-actors working seamlessly together, it is a heartfelt, funny, and uplifting story exploring the power of education, community and persistence. Sardegna's craggy beauty doubles as Biblical Palestine in this thoughtful imagining of Mary's untold story. Director Paolo Zucca's 21st-century perspective depicts her as a sharply intelligent, curious, rebellious spirit that refuses to be constrained by the limitations of her society. Mary has a hunger for freedom, knowledge and wisdom and a curiosity for everything forbidden to women. Joseph's character is brilliantly portrayed as the teacher and confidant who educates and cares for her. In a brilliant twist, they fall in love. What will this mean for the 'Annunciation'? Benedetta Porcaroli as Mary and Alessandro Gassman as Joseph, genuinely engage and draw us in portraying such iconic roles. In my view, it is a long-overdue feminine hymn to free will and a statement against ignorance. It feels to me like Mary has waited millennia to tell her own story. Il Boemo The Bohemian



Little-known Czech Composer Josef Mysliveček was a contemporary and friend of Mozart. At the height of his career, it seemed he also was destined for immortal celebrity. Josef spent his most productive musical years as a sought-after Composer in the regal Italian courts of Venice, Florence and Naples. At the same time, his personal life was just as glamorous and titillating. As he struggled to garner patronage, he eventually secured the admiration of the volatile Soprano, Caterina Gabrielli (played by the magnificent Barbara Ronchi). His emergence into the elite of Italy's thriving Opera scene was now guaranteed. Director Petr Václav cleverly depicts his transformation into a charming cosmopolitan playboy in the upper echelons of Italian society as a function of survival as much as an artistic act. Václav orchestrates a truly impressive multi-lingual film set in opulent palaces with meticulously costumed grandeur. But one of the most accomplished aspects of this film are the Opera scenes and music recorded by the Czech ensemble Collegium 1704 led by Václav Luks, featuring a constellation of international soloists. 

Flying Fish is New Zealand's longeststanding commercial film production house. Fish (as everybody now calls us) film across Aotearoa for the country's most well-known brands and advertising agencies. We also collaborate with the world's biggest production companies and renowned film directors, producing award-winning campaigns for almost 40 years.

2023 brought an unforgettable opportunity to film in Italy. Fish found themselves immersed in Napoli and the stunning Amalfi Coast, capturing Campari's global campaign for Aperol in celebration of its partnership with the Australian Open.



No other location could have fulfilled the creative vision - it had to be Italy. Over two large-scale shoot days, we filmed in the heart of Napoli, along the coastal beauty of Posillipo, before taking to the skies over the Amalfi Coast for sweeping aerial shots. The campaign's visual concept played with light, where the sun danced through scenes with a tennis ball in motion, that culminated in a breathtaking seaside rooftop party.

Before leaving New Zealand, Director Jason Bock, Executive Producer Samantha Attenborough, and Managing Director James Moore, headed to their favourite Italian eatery, Farina Restaurant on Ponsonby Road. At Farina, Sergio Maglione advised them on Napoli's finest dining establishments and introduced them to the warm hospitality of his close friends. The Fish team headed to one of Italy's biggest and most fascinating cities armed with culinary inside knowledge.

For James Moore, this shoot carried a deeper personal significance. His grandfather was born in Massa Lubrense, a picturesque seaside town perched at the top of the Amalfi Coast before the family moved to Nelson, New Zealand, and later settled in Island Bay, Wellington.

Il Postino The Postman



Without any exaggeration, Il Postino is one of Italy's most beloved films of the last 40 years. Appealing for its delightfully laid-back philosophising, disarming charm and the restrained performance by the comic genius Massimo Troisi. Set in the 1950s on the idyllic Phlegraean Island of Procida, off the coast of Naples, it is a world left behind by the progress of mainland Italy. Nobel Prize-winning Chilean poet Pablo Neruda (played by veteran French actor Philippe Noiret) is exiled to the island for his political convictions. Mario, the seemingly guileless postman, is intrigued as he delivers stacks of fan mail to the famous poet. Soon, Mario's good-natured, yet naive questions opens the door to an unexpected friendship. The power of language and poetry expands Mario's horizons. Troisi's depiction of Mario's uneducated but intellectual spirit is drawn with such tenderness and humour that it is both profound and hilarious in the same moments. Mario soon wishes to use the newly discovered power of words to woo the beautiful Beatrice. The uplifting and allegorical simplicity of Il Postino disguises its beauty and its weight. This is a film that can truly be called 'Cinema' and deserves to be seen on the big screen.

IL GRANDE MASSIMO TROISI **←**

International fame for Massimo Troisi only came when he was nominated for Best Actor and Best Adapted Screenplay at the Academy Awards for his work on *Il Postino*. In Italy, and especially in his home town of Napoli, Troisi was nothing short of an 'era-defining' artist. Watching *Il Postino*, you might be forgiven for imagining his gentle, humane comic style as 'sweet and endearing.' He was gifted at portraying characters who would feel naive bumbling and unpretentious, yet Troisi was subtly introducing subversive, philosophical, and political ideas into all aspects of his work. After the politically explicit films of the 60s and 70s, Troisi found a way of connecting to audiences through humour and understatement. The most obvious way he did this was never to speak Italian. In all his work and interviews, Troisi only ever spoke 'Neapolitan'. This was a conscious political act to restore and celebrate a



language and people that had been subjugated for so long. Troisi was ensuring that 'greater' Italy became familiar with this beautiful, underappreciated language. His performances were so naturalistic they felt improvised and wholly authentic, with broken dialogue, unfinished sentences, mumbles and hilarious malapropisms. Troisi cultivated a style of speech and gesture that felt so relatable to audiences that he garnered a loving fan base throughout Italy. However, Massimo lived his entire life with a 'sword of Damocles' hanging over him; at nineteen years of age, Troisi had undergone a quadruple bypass, he knew one day he would need a full heart transplant. Massimo Troisi's heart ceased beating only 3 days after filming *Il Postino*, as he prepared to have an operation. His legacy in Italian Theatre and Film is substantial, even if the wider world only saw Il Postino, he will be celebrated as a gentle, brilliant, giant of Italian Cinema. Paolo Rotondo

At the same time, 12 year-old Adrian is going through her own existential crisis; she wants to identify as a boy. From here on in, she will be known as Adi. Young Luana Giuliani as Adi gives a performance beyond her years. Themes of family dynamics and youth experience in those times are poignant, but Crialese keeps the upbeat and breezy tone of a nostalgic memory. The colourful palette, world-class cinematography, stunning art direction and even some brief, unexpected musical sequences do justice to the performances of the radiant Penelope Cruz and the brilliant Luana Giuliani. 

Galleria Doria Pamphilj is another must-visit. One of Rome's richest private art collections, it boasts works by Raphael, Tintoretto, Titian, Caravaggio, Bernini and Velázquez, plus several Flemish masters, which visitors can admire across its ornate, opulent halls.



Take A Day Trip - Or Two -OUTSIDE ROME



Lake Bracciano and its three delightful towns - Anguillara, Bracciano and Trevignano - is another great destination for an afternoon away from the bustle of the Eternal City, with lovely centri storici, excellent restaurants and an impressive medieval castle to discover.



If you're after more chilled vibes, opt for the coast, where Palo Laziale offers laidback beaches, more Etruscan ruins, fantastic seafood and, of course, the magical La Posta Vecchia, for a perfect getaway.

Why Did Sorrentino Thank Maradona When He Won The Oscar?



In 2013, Paolo Sorrentino stood on the stage at the Oscars, gripping his iconic golden statue, won for The Great Beauty. After the usual acknowledgements, he thanked the Argentine footballer regarded as the greatest of all time, Maradona. It seemed incongruous. But back in Sorrentino's native Napoli, it is not an exaggeration to say that Maradona is venerated, revered and worshipped like a deity. The cult of Maradona grew from when he took the Napoli Football team to its first national title. His divinity is even manifested on his football shirt as D10S, Dios (God in Spanish). Maradona's humble roots and stature seemed to heighten the improbability of his capabilities on the field. He did things with a ball that appeared to be impossible. My father took me to see him play at the San Paolo Stadium (now named Maradona Stadium). That day, instead of resting at halftime, he emerged from the changing rooms alone to entertain a frenzied stadium with spectacular ball tricks. He possessed the generosity of someone who knew what it was like to have nothing. He was flawed and heroic-like them.

In the film *Youth*, you will see a Maradona impersonator performing the trick I saw in the stadium alongside my father. The scene of an ageing Maradona fits perfectly with the film's theme of the tension between the past and our future. For a sixteen-year-old Paolo Sorrentino, Maradona had literally been a matter of life and death. In the heat of a Neapolitan summer, his parents travelled to the cool air of the Abruzzi mountains.

Paolo staved behind to watch Maradona play. Tragically, his parents were killed in an accident of carbon monoxide poisoning. Sorrentino says, "That weekend, I didn't go because I wanted to watch Maradona and S.S.C Napoli play... and that saved me." Diego's creativity on the field and his triumphs against all odds saved Paolo Sorrentino, in turn, Sorrentino was inspired to transform his grief into truly creative artistry. Maradona helps us Neapolitans identify with the city of Napoli, which is both extraordinarily beautiful and deeply flawed. Sorrentino's latest film, Parthenope, is an allegorical homage to Napoli's beauty, ancientness, and complexity. This is a place where footballers become divine and where the sacred and profane combine like nowhere else. Grazie Diego. Forza Napoli sempre. Paolo Rotondo

Monica (Alba Rohrwacher) suffers from the Korsakoff syndrome that affects her memory while at the same time creating false memories. This premise provides an eerie parallel with Monica Vitti's last years when she was affected by Lewy body dementia. The Monica in Roberta Torre's film gradually gets swept into a state of confusion as she watches the films of Michelangelo Antonioni's muse. Meanwhile, her husband Edoardo (Filippo Timi), indulges in her visions whilst they reside in their house by the sea.

Minghella's Italy



Why have we included Anthony Minghella's films in a curation of Italian cinema? A reasonable question: he was British, and he worked solely on Englishlanguage films.

The English Patient and The Talented Mr Ripley may be among the most artfully crafted and gripping films of the 90's. The sense of place that Italy provides in Minghella's films is the key. A nearly mythical sense of Italy is woven deeply into the dramatic fabric of his narratives. Italia is not merely a location; it is a 'state of mind'. It is indeed a 'condition'. In The Talented Mr Ripley, it provides an essential right of passage, as if the characters have taken too literally the famous Goethe quote 'See Naples, then you can die'. Italy offers an alternate reality, a heightened world filled with mysterious, intoxicating and dangerous new possibilities. Their shiny American hubris is heightened through contrast to the ancient, knowing and world-weary beauty of Southern Italy. In The English Patient, the abandoned Monastery in the Tuscan countryside is the cradle of the story, the maternal place of care, where stories are told and passions burn dangerously bright. Italy becomes the repository of soaring romance, bitter revenge and tragedy. The scene inside the Basilica of St. Francis in Arezzo offering stolen glimpses of Piero Della Francesca frescoes becomes one of the most iconic scenes in cinema history. You can feel Minghella's longing personal connection to his ancestral homeland.

Minghella was the son of Italian immigrants, his mother from Valvori and his father from Cassino. They emigrated to the Isle of Wight and set up a cafè and the now famous Gelateria 'Minghella' next door to a cinema. Here, Minghella discovered Fellini's I Vitelloni about a group of young men getting up to mischief in a small seaside town. In this film, he related to both the Italian culture and the wild young men depicted. Minghella's characters seem to possess an Italian way of relating to the world, an existential angst, a sense of romance and an unassailable appreciation for beauty. His cultural heritage is so deeply entwined with his masterly creative sensibility that it is present in every frame. Paolo Rotondo

The English Patient



The English Patient is arguably one of the most unforgettable films of the 90s. It was adapted by Anthony Minghella from the Booker Prize-winning novel by Michael Ondaatje. It's WWII during the liberation of Italy, inside the ancient Monastery Villa San Girolamo Tuscany, and nurse Hana (Juliette Binoche) cares for a severely burned man. She has lost her own true love in the horror of war and forms a deep connection with him. He was rescued, barely alive from a burning plane, shot down in the North African desert. He is entirely bandaged, covered in burns and speaks perfect English, but has no recollection of who he is. In Hana's care, they begin to piece together his memories and we are transported into an extraordinary sweeping story of love, betrayal and passion. He is the Hungarian Count Almasy and was fatally in love with a married woman (Kirsten Scott Thomas). In the unravelling of the story, we discover that Hana and the mysterious man are in danger of revenge by an intelligence agent named Caravaggio (Willam Dafoe). The fates of all characters become entwined in an epic, dangerous, and breathtakingly romantic story. One of the greatest films in my lifetime. Paolo Rotondo

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

We meet her during her early career when her methods were still unorthodox and she struggled with an archaic male-dominated profession. A glamorous (fictionalised) French actress, Lili d'Alengy, flees to Rome to ask Maria to care for her own special-needs child, but Maria has her own difficulties with a child out of wedlock in a society deeply uncomfortable with her brilliance. The unexpected bond between these two women from different worlds will help and inspire Maria Montessori to create an entirely new vision for pedagogy. An exquisitely crafted film with lush cinematography and impeccable acting does justice to such a fascinating story. Jasmine Trinca's performance is note-perfect, finely balancing lightness and charm with pathos and depth. This film is, at times, truly uplifting and, at other times, deeply moving. Set over a surreal summer, Chiara is a struggling actor living in her father's shadow, haunted by her own resemblance to him. Some real-life stories can be as extraordinary as a film. In the 50's and 60's, Paolo di Paolo was a photojournalist, trusted photographer and friend of some of Italy's most glamorous stars. It is set in a pastoral village at high altitude in the snowy Alps of Trentino Alto Adige in the last year of WWII. The setting is of breathtaking beauty but also of a foreboding majestic potency. Io e il Secco My Killer Buddy




