


### SASC 2024-25 sailing calendar

### SASC 2024-25 sailing calendar

#### **Important dates for 2024-25**

#### **Lion Island race** – Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> August

- Yachts with minimum Category 5,
- Plus, TfNSW Maritime Open Water requirements

**Season opening party** – Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September

Opening day & Spring Series Point Score – Saturday 7th September

Ranger & Couta, Folkboat sprints – 15<sup>th</sup> September

**Sunday racing** – 22<sup>nd</sup> September

Idle hour race – date TBA. Handicap start with BBQ at Greenshed after race

Twilight racing – Friday 11th October


- Remember early start at 5.30pm for first two and last four races...

#### **Entries via SailSys**

Season entry allows you to enter some or all the Series for a fixed price, in one entry process



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


#### Race entry completion

- After payment, the entry will be received by SASC as 'pending' for compliance checks:
  - Cat 4/5/7; and
  - Insurance
- You will receive an email <u>per Series</u> asking for the compliance documents to be uploaded.
- If you already have (current) compliance documents in Sailsys, SASC will transfer them to your entry(s). Nothing further for you to do.
- Expired compliance documents require the **updated** documents to be uploaded via your SailSys account.




Equipment audit forms and insurance CoC must be uploaded to SailSys to complete your race entries.

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- Audit forms expire twelve months after the date of audit
- Equipment audits must be completed on the (current) official Australian Sailing (AS) form(s) with SASC appendices as required, such as:
  - PFD proof of annual service
  - Category 5 Annex TfNSW Maritime "Open Water" requirements
- All equipment shall be laid out neatly for inspection. Where equipment is not appropriately laid out, the auditor may refuse to continue the audit.
- The yacht owner or person in charge must be in attendance during the audit

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- Where a yacht has outstanding items still required as part of its audit, it shall be ineligible to race. Outstanding items shall be presented with the audit form to sign off, to an AS/SASC accredited auditor
- Inflatable life jackets must checked annually with proof of annual check attached – see PFD checklist on the SASC web site
- Fire Extinguishers must be checked annually and must be under 5 years old and showing green in the gauge
- All yachts must be registered with TfNSW (Maritime)

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# **Equipment Audit - Category 5**

For Category 5, you must complete the official AS Category 5 form and the SASC appendices (TfNSW Maritime requirements for Open Waters)

#### Helmsperson

- Change of regular helmsperson must be notified to the Sailing Office at least 24 hours before the race.
- A yacht may be disqualified for failing to notify the Race Committee of a change in helmsperson
- Check if you need to let your insurance company/broker know?
- Australian Sailing prescribes that the **person in charge** shall be a member of a Club affiliated to Australian Sailing and an Australian Sailing card holder



#### **Sailing Instructions**

- Each Season there are changes to the Sailing Instructions and courses
- Read the Sailing Instructions and Courses, including the SASC General Sailing Instructions BEFORE you race
- Check the SailSys noticeboard (part of the skipper's race entrants screen in SailSys) for any amendments or updates for your Series/Race
- The Sailing Office will email skippers with any notifications and advise of shipping movements.



#### **Race Abandonments**

- Race Abandonments will be at the discretion of the Race
   Officer on the day and reasons for abandoning a race may include (but not be limited to);
  - Gale Warning for inshore waters (average 34 37kn)
  - Strong wind warning (average 26 33Kn)
  - Poor visibility
- Notification of race abandonments will be via:
  - SailSys SMS,
  - Placement of a notice on the Club notice board, and
  - The N over A flag will be displayed on the Club flagpole



#### Yachts intending to race

- Sign-on via SailSys
- Prior to entering the start area remove the anchor from the bow
- Ensure you have the SASC racing A Flag (available from SASC office) displayed at or near the masthead or from the backstay
- Report to the Race Officer aboard the Committee Vessel and receive acknowledgement.



#### Yachts intending to race

- Check the flags for division start and courses don't just follow yachts in your division (flags are identified inside front cover of Sailing Program).
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- Shortening a course may be;
  - At the start
  - At a mark
- Yachts not actually engaged in starting MUST KEEP
   CLEAR of the starting line and other yachts starting.
- Yachts should endeavor to not sail through other clubs' starting or finishing lines.

#### Y Flag

- When the Y Flag is displayed with one sound signal before or with the warning signal, competitors in yachts with open non-self-draining cockpits and which are not fitted with sufficient in-built buoyancy to stay afloat whilst flooded, shall wear appropriate personal flotation devices, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment
- Skippers must decide when you and your crew need to wear PFDs even if the Y Flag not displayed







#### **Yachts retiring**



Yachts retiring from a race are required to notify the Committee Vessel via:

- The Race Officers mobile 0419 625 883, or
- Hailing on VHF Channel 73, or
- By any other means

#### **Sail Numbers**

- Yachts persistently displaying incorrect sail numbers may be marked as DNF by the Race Officer
- General Sailing Instruction 19 regarding permission to carry a sail displaying a different number to that shown on the list of entries must be observed.
- Sail numbers shall comply with RRS 77 and the AS
   Prescription to RRS Appendix G which require sail
   numbers to be of a contrasting colour to the body of the
   sail and clearly legible
- Non-compliant yachts may be recorded as DNF



Sail numbers must be in a contrasting color to the sail




















# **Know the Rules of Racing ...**

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#### Protesting...

- The SASC encourage skippers to protest even is unsure of the rules applying – it's a good way to learn.
- Protests must conform to RRS Rule 61.
- Completed Protest forms must be delivered to the SASC Sailing Office no later than 11:00 hours on the first working day following the day of the race protested.
- Hearings will be held on the following Tuesday at the SASC clubhouse or as directed by the Protest Committee.

#### Risk minimization on the water

- Provide a safety briefing to your crew each time!
- Train for on-water emergencies
  - person overboard
  - medical emergency
  - Collision or grounding
- Can all crew operate safety equipment?
- Weather check the forecast before you go out
- Check daily vessel movements on Sydney Harbour advised via email

#### Rendering assistance

- SASC Race Committee vessel are not rescue yachts.
- RRS 1.1 Helping those in danger the responsibility during a race lies with other competitors to stand by or provide assistance.
- Report all on-water incidents to the Race Officer



#### **Incidents**

- Skippers must report all incidents that involve a fatality, serious injury and/or significant damage to NSW Water Police
- A written incident report must be emailed to the Sailing Office racing@sasc.com.au and to TfNSW within 24 hours if one of the following applies:
  - The incident has resulted in death or serious injury to a person
  - The incident has result in damage more than \$5,000 to a vessel or any other property
  - Damage or risk to the environment has occurred
- The information you provide in your incident report plays an important part in supporting the way we improve safety on the water

#### Insurance

- Following an incident contact your insurance company ASAP
  - Check your specific policy(s) for details of reporting requirements
- Speaking of insurance...
- All owners of yachts competing in SASC events must hold current third-party property liability and personal liability insurance cover of not less than \$10,000,000 (ten million dollars) for each, separate incident. GSI Item 34
- Skippers are advised that although SASC has third-party liability insurance for the Club, this cover DOES NOT extend to participants

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
#### Insurance (again...)

- HAVE YOU PAID YOUR ANNUAL PREMIUM?
- HAVE YOU RENEWED YOUR yacht REGO?
- IS YOUR YACHT FIT FOR YOUR INTENDED PURPOSE?
- ARE YOU COVERED FOR CHANGE OF SKIPPER?
- DO YOU HAVE SUFFICIENT COVER? -offshore, spinnaker, social racing
- HAVE YOU CHECKED YOUR POLICY FOR EXCLUSIONS PDS?
- DO YOUR CREW ALL HAVE ACCIEDNT/LIABILITY INSURANCE?
- Sail Pass provides (limited) personal insurance coverage to individuals who are participating in sailing activities as a temporary member of a sailing club
