

Game drives through Kruger National Park, Makalali Game Reserve, and Hwange National Park provide opportunities to observe the Big Five and other indigenous wildlife in their natural settings. Among other adventures, sojourn through the rugged Drakensberg mountain range, explore archaeological sites in Great Zimbabwe, and experience the raw beauty and power of Victoria Falls.

African Expedition by Private Train | Itinerary and Highlights (subject to change)

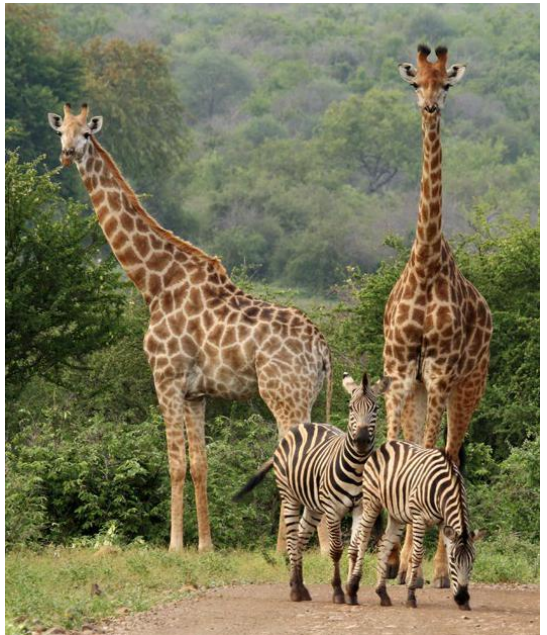
Locations selected for this safari promise excellent viewing of wildlife, though spotting specific wildlife cannot be guaranteed. Activities may be dependent on weather and seasonal conditions.

Day 1: EN ROUTE FROM U.S.	Day 9: MAKALALI GAME RESERVE Immerse yourself in the untamed beauty of the Makalali Game Reserve, a diverse landscape providing a rich tapestry of habitats for a plethora of wildlife. Spot for the Big Five and an abundance of other species during a game drive, and gain insight into the area's history. Overnight: Private Train (B,L,D)
Day 2: ARRIVE IN JOHANNESBURG, SOUTH AFRICA Upon arrival to O.R. Tambo International Airport an Orbridge representative will be waiting to assist with your transfer to the hotel. Overnight: DaVinci Hotel and Suites	Day 10: FULL DAY ABOARD TRAIN En route through the Limpopo Province, pass by the Soutpansberg mountain range and the lands of South Africa's Rain Queen. Enjoy a biltong (traditional spiced jerky) tasting. Embrace time for introspection, listen to a presentation by the tour guide, or partake in stimulating conversation with fellow travelers. Overnight: Private Train (B,L,D)
Day 3: PRETORIA Set out for a guided panoramic tour to see Pretoria's iconic landmarks including the Union Building and the Nelson Mandela Statue. As embarkation begins late afternoon, settle into your private sleeping car featuring large windows and en suite bathroom. Venture into the cozy lounge car to admire the passing scenery from its panoramic windows or observation porch. On board, four-course dinners are a highlight. Talented chefs prepare African and European cuisine served in two comfortable restaurant cars. Overnight: Private Train (B,L,D)	Day 11: GREAT ZIMBABWE Following breakfast embark on a bus journey to the ruins of Great Zimbabwe, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and unravel the mysteries of this ancient civilization. The legacy of Great Zimbabwe lives on as one of the largest and most culturally important archaeological sites of its kind in Africa. Overnight: Private Train (B,D)
Day 4: FULL DAY ABOARD TRAIN Spend today on the luxurious train. Enjoy informative lectures, marvel at the landscapes and socialize with fellow travelers. Overnight: Private Train (B,L,D)	Day 12: BULAWAYO MATOBO NATIONAL PARK Take a guided panoramic city tour of Bulawayo. After lunch visit Matobo National Park—a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Later see the Grave of Cecil Rhodes. Overnight: Private Train (B,D)
Day 5: KINGDOM OF ESWATINI Visit Ngwenya Glass to witness the art of glassblowing followed by time to peruse the showroom. Continue to the village of Mbabane to see a traditional Swazi dance performance. Before returning to the train explore the town of Piggs Peak. Overnight: Private Train (B,D)	Day 13: HWANGE NATIONAL PARK VICTORIA FALLS Disembark for a morning game drive through Zimbabwe's largest and most important game reserve. Overnight: Victoria Falls Safari Lodge (B,L)
Day 6: MAPUTO, MOZAMBIQUE Set off on a guided panoramic city tour followed by a seafood lunch before returning to the train. Overnight: Private Train (B,L,D)	Day 14: VICTORIA FALLS Explore Victoria Falls followed by a boat safari down the Zambezi River. Tonight gather for a farewell dinner. Overnight: Victoria Falls Safari Lodge (B,D)
Day 7: KRUGER NATIONAL PARK Prepare for an exhilarating full-day game drive through the park to spot for the Big Five and other wildlife. Gather for a traditional African boma dinner this evening. Overnight: Kruger Gate Hotel (B,L,D)	Day 15: VICTORIA FALLS DEPART FOR U.S. After breakfast transfer to the airport for flights home. (B)
Day 8: DRAKENSBERG MOUNTAINS After breakfast take a final safari through Kruger National Park before traveling by bus along the panoramic route through the rugged Drakensberg mountain range. Overnight: Private Train (B,D)	Day 16: ARRIVE IN U.S. (B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner)



What's Included

- 9 nights aboard the private train plus 4 nights deluxe hotel/lodge accommodations
- 13 breakfasts, 7 lunches and 11 dinners including a special farewell dinner
- All excursions described in the itinerary including admission and park fees
- Expert naturalist guides throughout including an Orbridge Travel Director Team

During leisure time, relax in the bar car with a cool Windhoek lager or one of South Africa's famous wines, listen to an intriguing presentation, or sit back with a book. Take advantage of the open observation platform with uninterrupted views of passing wilderness, providing endless opportunities to take amazing photographs.

SLEEPING COMPARTMENT CATEGORIES

Giraffe: approx. 75 sq. ft. accommodating two guests in either two single beds or one double bed

Lion: approx. 107 sq. ft. accommodating two guests in either two single beds or one double bed

Single travelers can select from either category. There is no internet access on the train.



SLEEPING COMPARTMENT AMENITIES

Individual climate control, windows (equipped with blinds and sunshades) that open, 220/230V electrical outlets, safe, closet, bedside cabinets, complimentary bottled water, bathrobes and slippers, and private en suite bathroom with shower, towels, sundries and hair dryer.

At the southernmost tip of Africa, Cape Town offers a perfect blend of natural beauty, cultural richness and outdoor experiences. Explore this vibrant region's iconic landmarks, sample its exquisite flavors and admire the peninsula's captivating landscape.

Day +1: EN ROUTE FROM U.S.

Day +2: ARRIVE IN CAPE TOWN, SOUTH AFRICA Upon arrival to Cape Town International Airport, transfer to the hotel to enjoy an evening at leisure.
Overnight: Mount Nelson Hotel by Belmond

Day +3: CAPE TOWN Today's first highlight is a cable car ride ascending Table Mountain (weather permitting). At the summit, take a leisurely walk to the various lookout points. Continue with a panoramic tour of the city, passing by some of Cape Town's most iconic landmarks. Afterwards enter the eye-catching Bo-Kaap neighborhood where you'll delve into South Africa's rich and complex food heritage during a food tasting featuring a delicious blend of flavors and techniques.
Overnight: Mount Nelson Hotel by Belmond (B,L)

Day +4: CAPE TOWN | CAPE PENINSULA Set off on a scenic drive south along the Atlantic Seaboard towards Cape of Good Hope. En route, take advantage of brief photography stops at Hout Bay and Chapman's Peak Drive. Immerse yourself in the vibrant atmosphere of Hout Bay Market, a bustling hub of local artisans, craftsmen and food vendors. Journey into the heart of the winelands for an exclusive food and wine pairing experience. Continue to the iconic Cape of Good Hope, a legendary promontory where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans converge. Ascend to the summit aboard the historic Flying Dutchman Funicular. Visit Boulders Beach to observe a charming colony of African Penguins, then return to the hotel for an evening at leisure.
Overnight: Mount Nelson Hotel by Belmond (B,L)

Day +5: CAPE TOWN | FLIGHT TO JOHANNESBURG | MAIN PROGRAM BEGINS After breakfast transfer to the airport for the group flight to Johannesburg to join the main program. (B,D)
