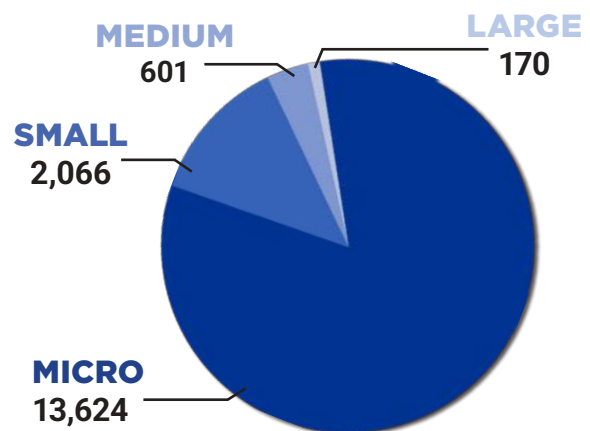

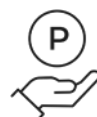

TOWARDS INNOVATIVE HEALTH INFORMATION MANAGEMENT THRU E-HMIS INTEGRATION

The aim to improve health and medical services to constituents is now underway with the completion of the Phase 1 of the system. Key features of the first phase included in the dashboard are patient profiling, consultation records, inventory tracker, laboratory and medicines prescription.

All health centers in the city are equipped and trained with the system features as continuous trainings have been conducted with the Management Information Systems Office.



Monitoring and Evaluation of Local Level Plan Implementation Protocol (MELLPI Pro) Evaluation

Assessment of the City's Nutrition Program was conducted by the Regional Nutrition Evaluation Team on March 21, 2024. It aims to evaluate the LGU's performance on the implementation in decreasing malnutrition rate prevalence within the locality.



CONSISTENT REGIONAL OUTSTANDING WINNER IN NUTRITION (CROWN)

The City Government of Muntinlupa is recognized by the National Nutrition Council for its achievement in maintaining its CROWN Status (Consistent Regional Outstanding Winner in Nutrition) for the first year. It reflects the administration's commitment to ensure that nutrition programs are effectively in place. The award also signifies the strong relationship among private partners and communities working together to eradicate malnutrition in the City. Muntinlupa City was able to bag 5 special awards during the 2024 Regional Nutrition Awarding Ceremony held on August 16, 2024 at Novotel Hotel. The conferment included recognitions such as Best LGU in Documentation

of Nutrition Programs, Nutrition Leadership Award, CNAO Runner Up (Dr. Magdalena Meana), Special Citation for being the Philippine Partners Award for the Nutrition Award to Congressman Jaime Fresnedi and Certificate of Recognition for Muntinlupa City's dedication in advancing the capacities of its Barangay Health Workers.

The CROWN status is given to LGUs with three (3) consecutive years of being awarded with the Green Banner Seal of Compliance, of which Muntinlupa City was able to be conferred for years 2017, 2019, 2021, and 2022.

QUALITY AND AFFORDABLE MEDICAL EDUCATION

The City Government of Muntinlupa, through its "Kalusugan" and "Karunungan" agenda, places strong emphasis on ensuring quality, accessible, and affordable medical education for individuals aspiring to build careers in the healthcare field. The inauguration of the Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Muntinlupa - Ospital ng Muntinlupa (PLMun - OsMun) College of Medicine provided an avenue for both residents and non-residents to have access to quality education leading to a total of **42 students** enrolled in the second year of its operation (AY 2023 - 2024). Supporting this venture, the City Government of Muntinlupa provided educational financial assistance through the Muntinlupa Scholarship Program bracket "Law and Medicine Program (LAMP)", amounting to Php 50,000.00 subsidy every semester, subject to certain requirements. The seven (7) pioneer students are also recipients of financial grants from former DOTR Secretary Arthur Tugade.



A collaborative effort between the Ospital ng Muntinlupa and Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Muntinlupa in strengthening the College of Medicine reflects the dedication of the City Government on its "Kalusugan" and "Karunungan" agenda. Lectures and laboratory activities are conducted both at PLMun and OsMun facilities. In its third year of operation (AY 2024-2025), additional 37 new enrollees are accommodated.

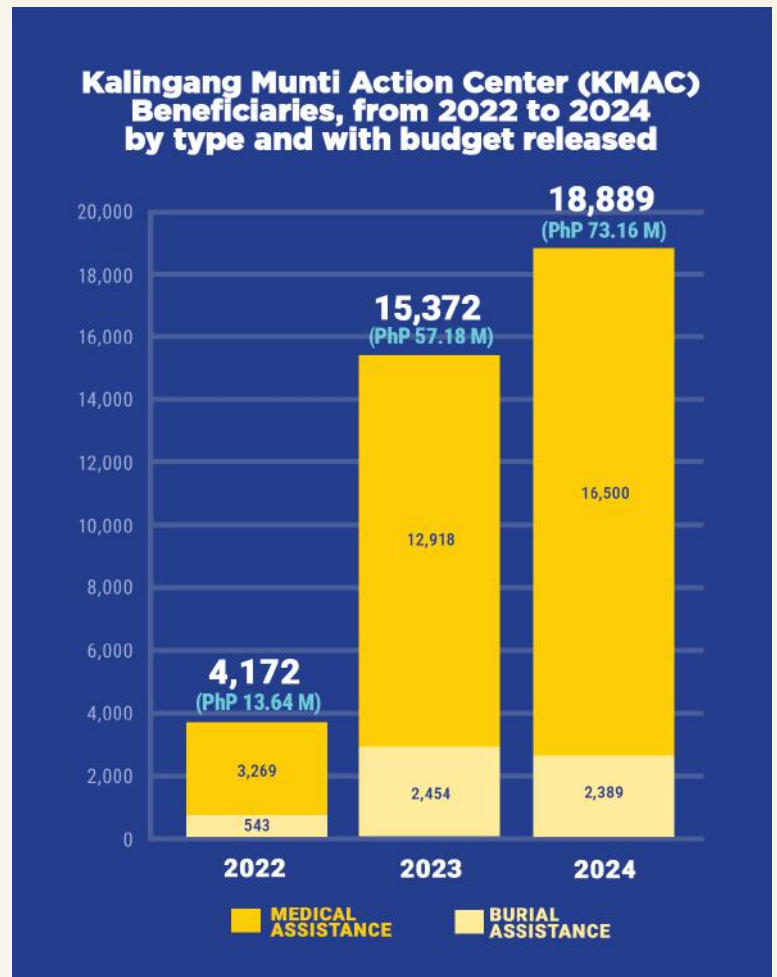

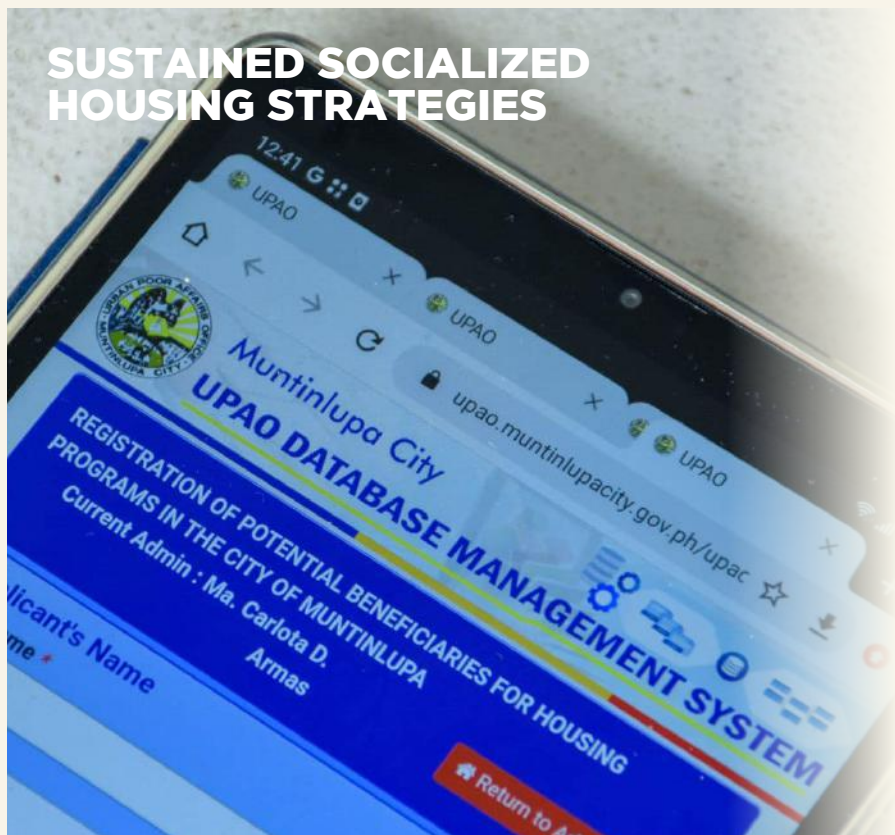

The main purpose of the Registration for potential beneficiaries is to acquire data for analysis to be used for future socialized housing projects.

There are two available methods to register: **Guided Registration** – **Face-to-face registration** wherein volunteer staff will assist the person in filling up the detail; and **QR Code registration**, an online registration wherein the registrant can scan the QR code and fill up electronic registration form.

The guided registration was scheduled at identified locations each for each barangay during the weekends and at the UPAO Office during the weekdays.

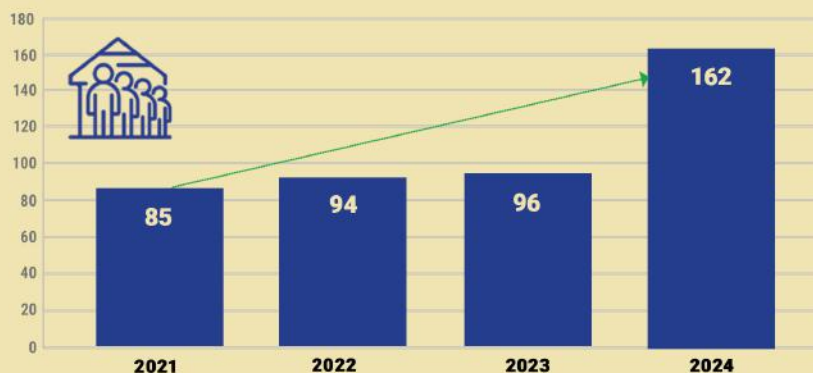

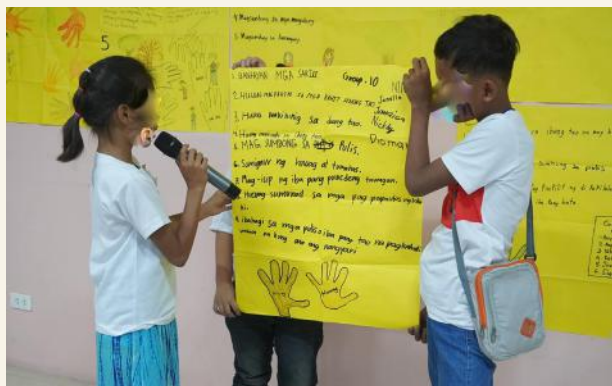



Once a drowsy agricultural community, Muntinlupa City has undergone a remarkable transformation into one of the Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs) in Metro Manila. Known in the past primarily for the New Bilibid Prison (NBP), which housed the nation's most dangerous criminals, Muntinlupa is now home to thriving Central Business Districts (CBD), modern shopping malls, world-class sport facilities, and key institutions and infrastructures. Today, it stands as one of the Philippines' leading investment destinations.

Muntinlupa officially became the 65th city in the Philippines on March 1, 1995, following the signing of Republic Act No. 7926 by then-President Fidel V. Ramos. This event served as the wick of the candle that lit up the trailblazing development of the city, alongside both dedication of its local leaders and the hard work of Muntinlupenos. While many played vital roles in the conversion of Muntinlupa from a humble municipality to a proud city, one man is strongly regarded as the “Father of Muntinlupa Cityhood”: *Ignacio “Toting” R. Bunye*. Now, let's take a look at his perspective towards this remarkable journey of cityhood.

A Personal Perspective on Muntinlupa's Evolution

As a young boy, Toting Bunye had a clear sense of how outsiders looked at Muntinlupa back then. “I remember riding a bus home when the conductor asked where I was headed, and I replied—Muntinlupa. I would hear snide remarks from other passengers—*Sa loob o sa labas?*”, he recalls, referring to the notorious NBP. He would then sarcastically tell himself “*Mabuti nang taga Muntinlupa, huwag lang taga Mandaluyong*”, a reference to the well-known psychiatric hospital in Mandaluyong.

When his father, Dr. Alfredo M. Bunye, Sr. retired as Director of Bureau of Prisons (now Bureau of Correction), their family moved from the NBP to Alabang, which was then just another quiet barangay in Muntinlupa. He described it as a community where most folks were fishermen at night and farmers by day.

Since the opening of the South Luzon Expressway, urban development has flourished in the City. Factories emerged, providing employment to residents, private housing subdivisions were built, and major private developers entered the scene, developing Ayala Town Center and Filinvest Corporate City.

Paving the Way through Financial Reforms

Despite early developments, Muntinlupa City remained as a fifth-class municipality. When Toting Bunye assumed office as Officer-in-Charge Mayor in June 1986, Muntinlupa's annual revenue was a meager 28 million pesos—hardly sufficient to cover the salaries of municipal employees. This made him dedicate his first two years as OIC Mayor to increase the city's financial standing by focusing primarily on increasing tax collection efficiency.

“Collecting taxes was not easy—and very unpopular too,” he admits, “But we did. Muntinlupa began taxing previously unregistered and non-tax paying businesses. We tax-mapped previously undeclared and non-paying real properties,” he said. Complementing the collection effort, they also reformed their collection system to make paying taxes easier and faster for everyone. Muntinlupa became one of the first LGUs to computerize its tax systems with the introduction of a One-Stop-Shop and Real Property Tax Administration (RPTA) system. “What used to take two to three weeks to process was now being done in 45 minutes or less,” he emphasized.

Thanks to these efforts, Muntinlupa was consistently recognized by the Department of Finance as one of the top LGUs in terms of tax collection efficiency. As a result, Muntinlupa's income grew exponentially. By 1995, the city's revenue had surged to over 400 million pesos, 15 times more than it had earned in 1986. This financial boost paved the way for Muntinlupa to meet the income threshold required for cityhood, which at the time was at least 20 million pesos in average annual income over the last two (2) years (a figure later raised to 100 million in 2001).

Traversing the Road to Cityhood

“With the significant inflow of money into the municipality's coffers, I made it a point to make a public accounting yearly of how much we earned and where we spent them. This was the start of the annual State of the Municipality Address, which is now known as the State of the City Address,” he said.

Once Muntinlupa had achieved the required income level, the next step was to address the question: “Why do we need to become a city?” or “What’s in it for us to become a city?”. For Former Mayor Toting, the most important advantage of becoming a city was being entitled to a bigger share of the Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA), now known as the National Tax Allotment (NTA). Cityhood would also mean having its own city charter and congressional district.

“But preparing for cityhood really entails more than just having a bigger yearly income or meeting the minimum 150,000 population requirement. It means strengthening Muntinlupa’s bureaucracy and preparing it to meet the challenges and responsibilities that lie ahead. It means energizing employees, instilling in them, first and foremost, pride in serving the public,” he added.

“Preparing for cityhood also means engaging the whole community so that they do not just watch from the sidelines but instead become active participants in the local government’s activities and undertakings,” he said. Involving the private sector, NGOs, and civil society organizations was crucial. Muntinlupa’s development was a collaborative effort, with partnerships formed with organizations such as the Muntinlupa Development Foundation, Zonta, Ayala Alabang, and renowned architect Felino “Jun” Palafox, among many others.

He also realized the power of music and symbolism in fostering local pride. He commissioned songwriter Renato Dilig to compose the Muntinlupa Hymn, a song that calls on Muntinlupeños to offer their “*Lakas, Talino, at Buhay*”. He also tapped Manuel Amorsolo, son of the famous national artist Fernando Amorsolo, to design the city’s seal, featuring the majestic Philippine eagle.

Final Steps to Cityhood

The process of applying for cityhood began with the passage of a resolution by the municipal council, accompanied by two key certifications: one from the city treasurer verifying Muntinlupa's income, and another from the Statistics Office confirming a population of at least 150,000. The resolution, seeking the conversion of Muntinlupa into a Highly Urbanized City, was immediately provided by the municipal council which was headed by Vice Mayor Jimmy Fresnedi at the time.

Former Mayor Toting credits much of the success to Majority Floor Leader Raul Corro, who he describes as the "chief architect" of Muntinlupa's cityhood journey. Atty. Corro was then his municipal attorney who quarterbacked the whole process from start to finish— from the solicitation of legislative sponsors to preparing the groundwork for the holding of Congressional public hearings.

As Former Mayor Toting reflects on Muntinlupa's transformation, he shares a sense of pride for how far the city has come and for the contributions of everyone who played a role in this remarkable evolution.

This milestone of Muntinlupa's cityhood marked the culmination of years of hard work and vision from local leaders, constituents, and stakeholders. Today, Muntinlupa continues to thrive, standing as a testament to the determination that turned a once-drowsy place into a bustling city, full of potential and pride.

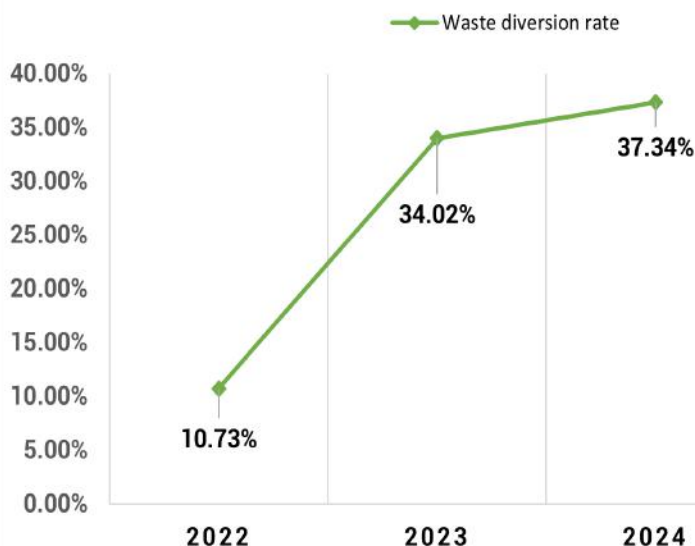

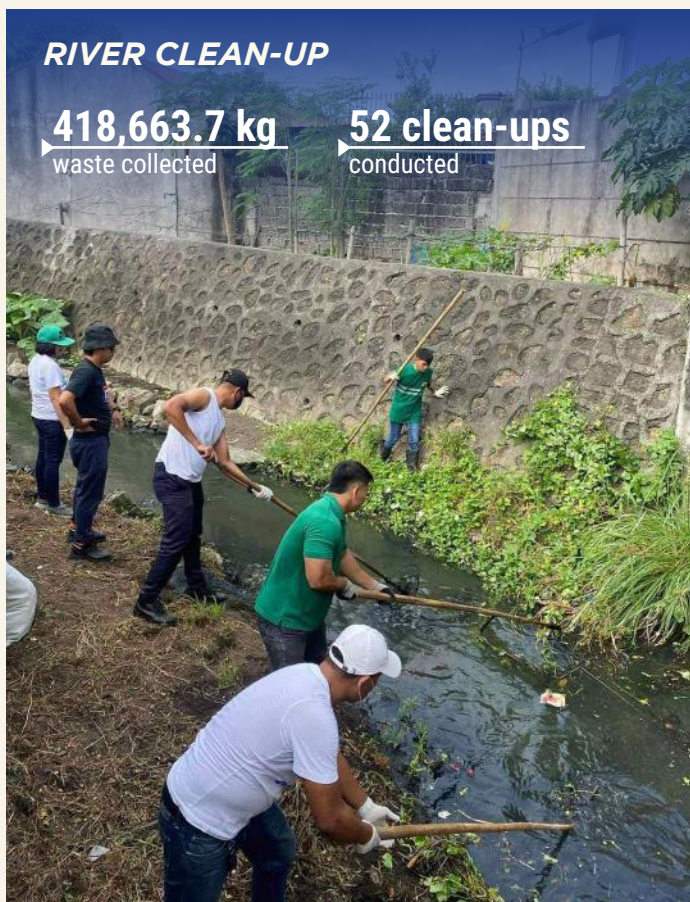

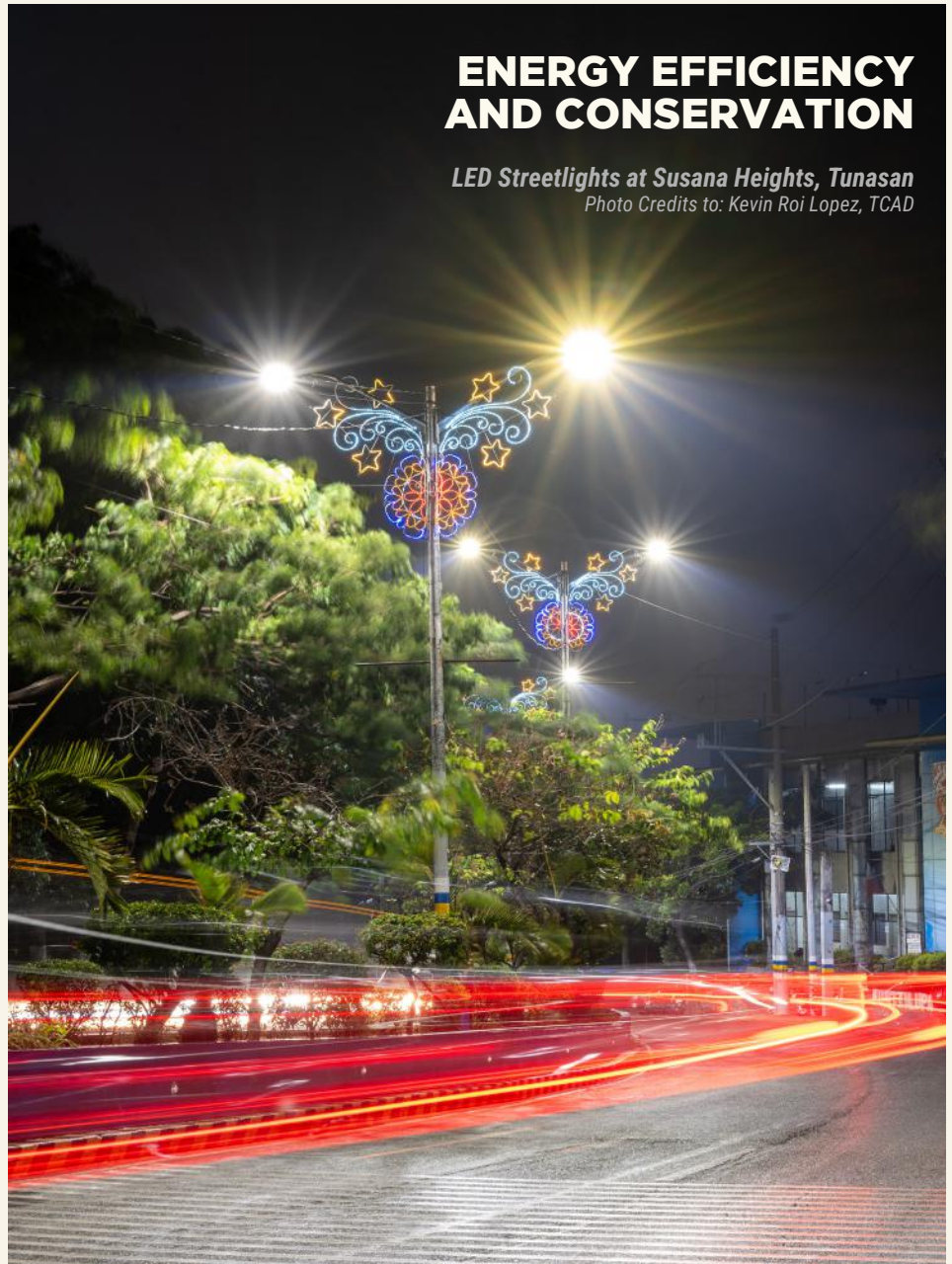

10 state-of-the-art ambulances were turned over to all 9 barangays and the Muntinlupa City Department of Disaster Resilience and Management (MCDDRM).



These ambulances are equipped with **basic life support supplies, blinkers, and sirens**, featuring high-visibility Battenburg designs for improved safety and identification.

Mayor Ruffy Biazon presented the ambulances to barangay representatives, emphasizing the importance of efficient use to enhance emergency services and reinforce the City's commitment to public safety and preparedness.

The **iRespond mobile app**, launched in **July 2024**, provides residents with immediate access to emergency services such as **medical assistance, fire rescue, and police intervention**.

The **Muntinlupa City Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) System** integrates with the **iRespond app** and **responders' tablets**, enabling real-time, efficient emergency response coordination to save lives and protect property.

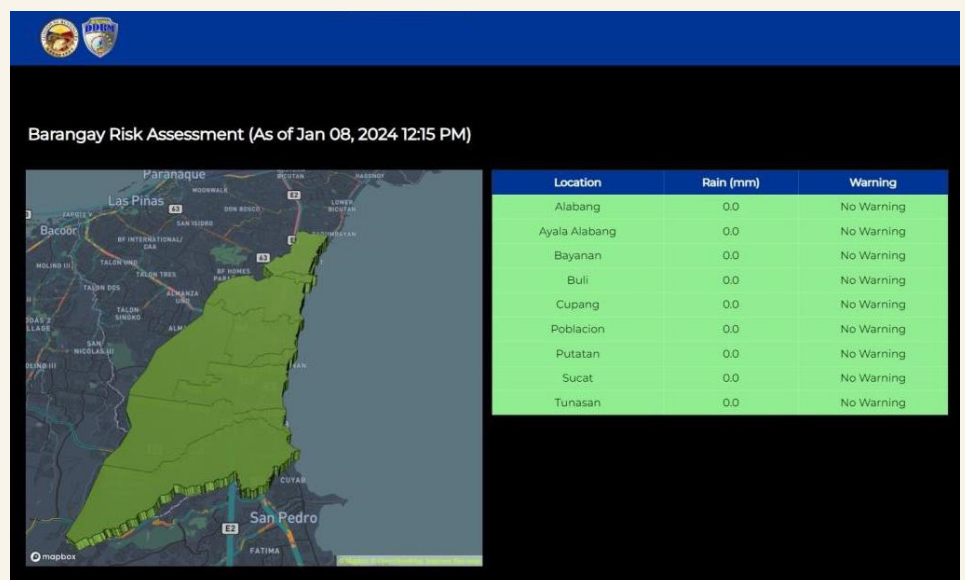

HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL & SEISMIC MONITORING

The **Hydrometeorological and Seismic Monitoring Unit** conducted monthly maintenance and testing of the citywide **public address and early warning systems** to ensure their functionality.

Daily local weather forecasts are shared with the public through the MCDDRM's **Facebook page, outdoor LED displays**, and disaster-related information updates.

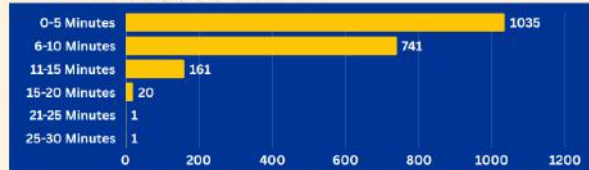

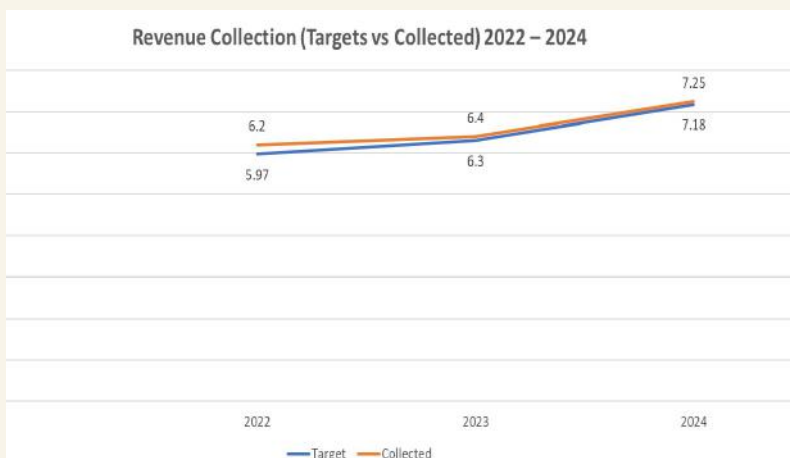

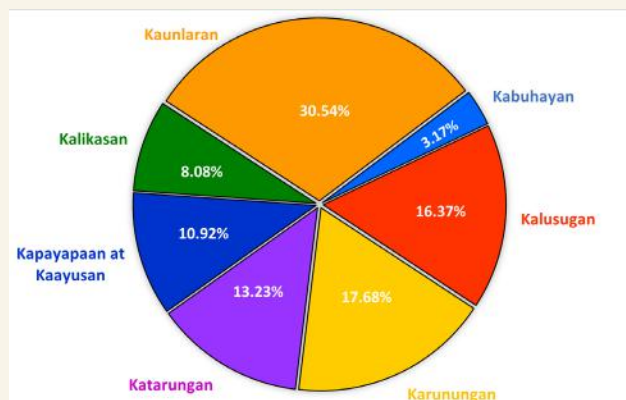


Business Permit Renewal Hub at the Sports Complex

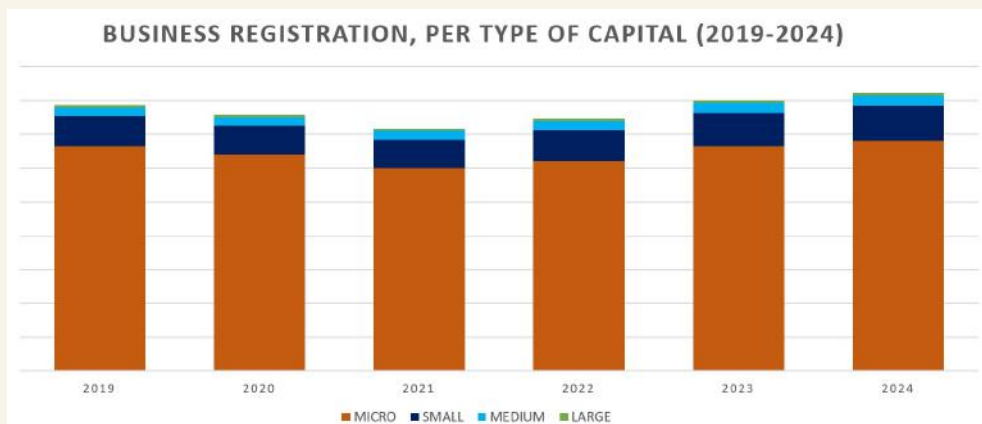

The path toward a progressive City is not a solitary endeavour — it requires a shared commitment among government leaders, business partners, and the community, all working together under the principles of good governance. True development thrives on this collaboration, where each sector plays a crucial role in laying the foundation for a smart, sustainable, and strong city for the its existing generation and for its future generations.

For Muntinlupa City, this commitment is not just a vision but a continuous effort to shape its identity and solidify its role in the broader region, ensuring a **#FutureReadyMuntinlupa** for generations to come.

Laying the Groundwork for Transformation

The seeds of Muntinlupa's modernization were sown early on, championed by leaders who recognized the City's potential for growth. One such leader is Mayor Rozzano Rufino "Ruffy" Biazon, whose political career began at an early age. Elected as the Muntinlupa City's youngest district representative at just 32 years old in 2001, he served for a total of 15 years before taking on the role of Local Chief Executive. Throughout his career, his dedication to public service has been evident in his numerous contributions, both as a legislator and as an executive.

Beyond his congressional role, Mayor Biazon's early exposure to governance and policy-making began when he served as a Youth Representative in the Videogram Regulatory Board. His leadership journey also included serving as a Chief of Staff and Chief Legislative Officer, where he gained invaluable experience in policy formulation and public administration. Later, he also served as the Commissioner of the Bureau of Customs, tackling critical issues in trade and regulation.

His early years in Congress gave him a front-row seat to Muntinlupa's developmental needs. With the City still in its early stages of growth, Mayor Biazon saw the transformative power of education as a driving force for progress. Recognizing the need to invest in human capital, he championed initiatives aimed at modernizing the City's public school system. His flagship program, the Computer Training for Educators and Resources for Students Program (Compu.T.E.R.S. Program), was designed to enhance the capabilities of both educators and students by integrating technology into teaching and learning processes. The program provided computer literacy training for teachers, supplied schools with hardware, and introduced Technology Intensified Instruction (T.I.I.), ensuring that Muntinlupa's youth would be equipped with the necessary skills to succeed in the digital world. This initiative was supported through multi-year funding from his congressional budget and partnerships with NGOs such as Gearing Up for Internet Literacy and Access for Students (GILAS).

Recognized as one of the most prolific legislators of his time, Mayor Biazon was the principal author of significant bills that have had a lasting impact. Among them were the Armed Forces of the Philippines Modernization Act, which aimed to strengthen the country's defense capabilities, and the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act, which established a comprehensive framework for disaster preparedness and response. In total, he authored eight (8) Republic Acts and co-authored thirty-six (36) others, all aimed at improving various sectors of society on the national scale. His legislative work complemented the initiatives of the City's leadership, reinforcing his commitment to a progressive Muntinlupa City.

30 Years and Beyond: A Future-Ready Muntinlupa

AN IN-DEPTH FEATURE ON MAYOR RUFFY BIAZON

Shaping a Future-Ready Muntinlupa

Mayor Rozzano Rufino B. Biazon, widely known as 'Ruffy' to his peers and the public, has embraced his role as the Father of Muntinlupa City, passionately driving its transformation into a smart, future-ready city. While his role as a Local Chief Executive presents new challenges compared to his time in Congress, it has also provided him with a more hands-on and critical approach to governance. His focus remains on digital transformation, ensuring that the City keeps pace with the rapid advancements in technology.

Mayor Biazon attests that Muntinlupa City enjoys a strategic geographical advantage — situated with easy access to neighboring cities, blessed with a vital shoreline along Laguna Lake, recipient of various national infrastructure projects, and heavily dominated by humble yet excelling residential households. With these realities, he envisions a Muntinlupa that is not only liveable and safe, but also a destination of leisure and relaxation. To achieve this, urban planning and sustainable development are key priorities.

His administration is focused on redesigning land use classifications to accommodate modern development trends, revitalizing and expanding green and open spaces, and enhancing sports and recreational facilities to meet world-class standards.

One of the city's long-term goals is to fully unlock the potential of the lakeshore, transforming it into a vibrant economic and social hub. This vision aligns with the globally recognized 15-minute city concept – a “model Smart Urban Village”, where residents can access essential services, leisure, and work opportunities within a short distance — supported by pedestrian-friendly streets, wider sidewalks, and efficient public transportation.



At the heart of this transformation is the City's ambition to be one of the pioneers of Smart Cities Development in the Philippines. Digital governance is set to revolutionize the way public services are delivered, streamlining processes such as business permit applications, tax mapping, and regulatory functions. Moreover, artificial intelligence (AI) and data-driven solutions have started to be integrated the City's dynamics, hence, these are expected to enhance transparency and public participation, and strengthen the institution's culture of open governance. With these innovations, Muntinlupa City aims to bridge the digital divide, empower its citizens, and create a more inclusive, responsive, and efficient local government.

Navigating Challenges with Vision for Sustainability

Mayor Biazon understands that development comes with its own set of challenges. While obstacles may arise, he views them not as setbacks but as opportunities for growth and innovation. His leadership philosophy is rooted in the belief that progress is a shared responsibility — one that extends beyond government officials to include the entire community. He relies not only on the institutional capacity of the local government with its workforce to usher positive change but recognizes that all Muntinlupeños are ready to embrace such change.

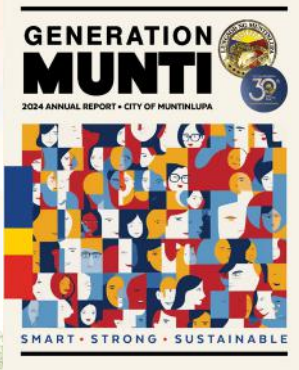
