

# FROM HERITAGE TO HARVEST: HOW MHONPAJ LEE BUILT THE FIRST HMONG OWNED CERTIFIED ORGANIC FARM AND FOUNDED INSPIRE ACCESS REALTY AS A BROKER/REALTOR

Mhonpaj Lee is the founder of the first Hmong-owned certified organic farm in the state. Together with her mother, she operates Mhonpaj Garden, cultivating five acres in Stillwater, four acres in Marine on St. Croix, and an additional 22 acres in Hugo. The farm produces fresh, organic produce sold at local markets and through a CSA program, reflecting Mhonpaj's commitment to sustainable living. Recently, she expanded her influence by launching a talk show that explores organic living and Hmong culture. In addition to her work in farming, Mhonpaj is an Inspire Access Realty Broker Realtor with a mission to support new construction homesteads and farmsteads. Before her current career, she held various roles, including aerobics instructor and sushi chef. Today, she is also a licensed real estate broker, real estate developer, and program host on Hmong TV, showcasing her versatility and dedication to uplifting her community.

## Rooted in Culture: How Hmong Traditions Shape Her Work

As a Hmong business owner, her cultural roots deeply influence her work and lifestyle. Coming from an indigenous group that values freedom and resilience, she grew up with parents who had humble beginnings but high expectations. Her family's

farming background meant they always had fresh fruits and vegetables. This upbringing instilled in her a passion for preserving Hmong culture, which she initially pursued by focusing on traditional Hmong herbs with her sister during college. Fulfilling her mother's dream, she purchased land, built a greenhouse, and established a certified organic farm, cultivating a variety of Hmong herbs and promoting a culturally enriched lifestyle. Beyond farming, she also works as a real estate agent, helping others embrace a sustainable lifestyle through farming and homesteading.







## Building a Business from Scratch with Resilience and Mentorship

Starting her business was a journey of resilience and self-discovery, as everything she accomplished began from scratch. Without formal guidance, she relied on her parents' example of a strong work ethic and dedication to forge her own path. Mentorship played a crucial role in her growth, as meeting mentors in real life proved to be a blessing. For instance, her cousin introduced her to a workshop where mentors helped her learn about building passive income as a financial advisor by managing people's assets. Similarly, her husband's network and her family's farming background in Laos inspired them to learn modern farming techniques in the U.S., such as using high tunnels to optimize tomato growth. Her resourcefulness extended to real estate when she initially aimed to help her brother buy and sell a house but ended up obtaining her license and continuing to work as a real estate broker to help others. Along the way, she sought out smarter individuals, asked questions, and absorbed knowledge, steadily building the connections and expertise that now define her success.

## **Navigating Uncertainty and Balancing Risk**

Starting and running a business came with its share of challenges, requiring a balance of risk-taking and careful planning. One significant hurdle was the uncertainty of income—whether it was the possibility of not selling a house, failing a year's crops,

or dealing with a family illness. To mitigate this risk, she and her husband adopted a strategy where one maintained a steady income while the other pursued self-employment, reducing financial vulnerability. Farming, in particular, presented constant challenges and a steep learning curve. She had to relearn how to grow specific crops in the U.S., operate equipment like tractors, and navigate different environments that made some crops harder to cultivate. There were even times when they had an overabundance of vegetables but insufficient markets to sell them. While her mother handled much of the farming, she supported with paperwork and other essential tasks, demonstrating the teamwork and adaptability needed to overcome these obstacles.

#### **Jump In: Advice for Aspiring Entrepreneurs**

For anyone looking to start a business in her industry, Mhonpaj's advice is simple: "Go for it!". There will never be a perfect time, so if you're passionate about pursuing something, jump in, try it out, and figure things out along the way. However, she emphasizes the importance of having a solid business plan, especially understanding upfront costs. For real estate, for instance, you'll need to invest in education and have financial resources prepared. Optimism is key, but so is having a plan and finding mentors to guide you. She learned much of what she knows through trial and error—making mistakes, learning from them, and trying again. A good mentor can help you avoid some of those missteps. Lastly, she encourages aspiring entrepreneurs to interview others in the field to gain clarity about their path and ensure it aligns with their goals and values.

# HOW SEARS REDEVELOPMENT IS BUILDING A BICYCLE-FRIENDLY COMMUNITY

The League of American Bicyclists works to create a Bicycle Friendly America where everyone can safely enjoy cycling. Every two years, it partners with state Departments of Transportation and advocates to assess bicycling conditions nationwide. This article examines the 2024 Bicycle Friendly States Report, which evaluates states using seven metrics: funding, infrastructure, laws, planning, capacity and support, safety, and ride impact. It also connects to the Sears Redevelopment Project, highlighting its plans for fostering a bike-friendly environment.

# Strengths and Opportunities in 2024 Rankings: Infrastructure and Strategic Planning

Minnesota ranks 5th in the 2024 Bicycle Friendly State Ranking, showing its strong commitment to supporting cycling. The state performs well in key areas, including infrastructure with a high score of 98%, and strategic planning at 86%, showing a focus on building cycling-friendly infrastructure. Its capacity and support for cyclists are also strong, with a score of 82%, and safety measures are good at 70%. However,

areas like laws (43%) and Every Ride Counts (53%) need improvement. By addressing these issues, Minnesota can strengthen its position as a leader in cycling and improve its ranking.



# Minnesota's 'Laws' Metric: What's Measured and Areas for Improvement?


The "Laws" metric evaluates the legislative framework that supports bicyclist safety and rights, highlighting critical elements such as safe passing laws, protections against harassment, and penalties for drivers involved in bike-related crashes. It also examines requirements for incorporating bicycle infrastructure into transportation planning, such as Complete Streets policies, while ensuring the equitable enforcement of traffic laws. Additional considerations include helmet regulations, penalties for distracted driving to protect vulnerable road users, and clear definitions of bicyclist rights, such as lane use and protections against dooring. Minnesota's 43% score in this category underscores significant gaps in its legal framework, including the lack of comprehensive safe passing or vulnerable road user protections, limited or inconsistent helmet laws for younger riders, and challenges in the equitable enforcement of traffic laws. Addressing these issues by adopting stronger legal protections, ensuring fair treatment of bicyclists, and aligning policies with national best practices would demonstrate a greater commitment to fostering a safe and equitable environment for cyclists.

## Community Actions to Improve Minnesota's Bicycle Laws

While Minnesota has made significant strides in creating a bicycle-friendly environment, its 43% score in the "Laws" category underscores the need for targeted improvements to its legislative framework. Addressing these gaps requires a multifaceted approach. At the public level, communities can play a vital role by raising awareness about bicyclist rights and safe driving practices through campaigns and

encouraging voluntary helmet use, especially for children, via partnerships with schools. Engaging in policy discussions and attending public hearings provides opportunities to advocate for stronger bicycle safety measures, while community reporting tools can help identify and resolve unsafe road conditions or behaviors. By taking these proactive steps, Minnesota can enhance its legal framework, promote equitable enforcement, and ensure a safer, more inclusive environment for all cyclists, positioning itself as a national leader in cycling accessibility and safety.





# Effort Building a Bike-Friendly Future: Minnesota's Sears Redevelopment in Action

The Sears Redevelopment Master Plan is actively advancing Minnesota's goals of promoting active transportation and enhancing cycling infrastructure. With dedicated bike lanes, multi-use paths, and pedestrian-friendly streetscapes, the project demonstrates how transit-oriented development is reducing car dependency while fostering healthier, more sustainable lifestyles. Current features, such as enhanced connections to green spaces, public transit hubs, and Saint Paul's established bike routes, complement Minnesota's existing strengths in infrastructure and planning. The integration of zero-emission mobility options, including bike and e-bike sharing programs, further highlights the state's leadership in innovation and environmental responsibility. These initiatives are already creating safer and more accessible cycling environments, serving as a model for urban developments across Minnesota.

# MEARSHEIMER: U.S. CAN NO LONGER STOP CHINA'S RISE

In an exclusive interview with <u>MediaUnlocked</u> in Beijing, Professor John Mearsheimer discusses the intensifying security competition between the US and China.

Political scientist John Mearsheimer argues that the U.S.-China rivalry is primarily a power struggle, not an ideological conflict. He criticizes framing it as democracy versus authoritarianism, arguing this distracts from the core geopolitical competition.

Mearsheimer believes U.S. efforts to contain China's rise are increasingly ineffective due to shifting global power dynamics. While a full-scale war is unlikely, he identifies several potential flashpoints, including the South China Sea, Taiwan, and the East China Sea, where tensions could escalate.

#### Key takeaways:

- Power Struggle: The rivalry is driven by China's ambition for regional dominance and global influence, similar to the U.S.'s historical role.
- Ineffective Containment: U.S. attempts to curb China's economic and technological growth may prove insufficient.
- Risk of Crises: While large-scale war is unlikely, repeated crises in flashpoints could increase the risk of conflict.
- Long-Term Rivalry: The U.S.-China competition is likely to persist for decades, characterized by rivalry rather than cooperation.

This summary highlights the core argument of a power struggle, the challenges of containment, the potential for crises, and the long-term nature of the US-China rivalry.


## AI/AR/VR TRAINING COURSE
