
The club is in an incredible position with 4 sides full of 12 players advancing through to the next round.



#### **Green light for** Winchelsea Common plan, Council to seek bike park options elsewhere

Surf Coast Shire Council has approved scope for reactivating part of Winchelsea Common, including reopening the former go-kart track area for public use.

Council resolved at its August meeting to endorse a Future Use Project plan which earmarks the area for recreation, and addition of a loop path linking to Gladman Street, seating and interpretive signs.

The works will include an important crossover bridging the street to the Common and addressing localised flooding issues.

The former go-kart area contains contaminated soil from throughout the Common, but is safely capped with non-contaminated soil.

An Environmental Management Plan prohibits excavation or movement of soil within the area, meaning plans for construction of a bike park are unable to proceed but Council resolved to initiate discussions with the Winchelsea community, including exploring options with young people, about the potential for establishing a bike park elsewhere.

A report is due to come back to Council by March 2024.

Work on the former go-kart area is scheduled for completion by the end of 2023, continuing revitalisation of parts of the Common following its decadelong closure due to contamination from former gun club activities.

"We look forward to seeing community members and visitors enjoying this grassed recreation space and making use of the new path and seating," Cr Adrian Schonfelder said.

"Reopening of the area will enhance people's ability to enjoy the Common's flora, fauna and unique landscape,

including its many magnificent River Redgums. This former go-kart area includes a gum estimated to be more than 300 years old.

Council will share further information on the scope of the reopening works with Winchelsea community during September.

Improvements to other public access areas of the Common since its reopening include building of an all-weather shared path, an off-leash dog area, grass play area, landscaping and protection of areas with sensitive vegetation.

Council and the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action share responsibility for the Common, with Council responsible for day-to-day management and the department the land owner.

### The Climate Report Judy Cameron

Four colonies of Emperor Penguin in western Antarctica ost their young (up to 10,000 chicks) as the sea ice on which they breed thinned and broke up in December 2022, before the babies had developed their waterproof feathers. They drowned or froze to death.

As we take in that disturbing news this week, we must realise that, if we don't cut carbon emissions, extinctions of species will result.

Australian inventor, engineer and visionary, Saul Griffith, is dedicated to widespread electrification as a means of fighting climate change, creating jobs, making our air cleaning, and saving the future for our children.

He has outlined his plan to reduce our emissions from energy production in Quarterly Essay 89 'The Wires That Bind'. He paints a practical picture of empowered local communities, acting collectively when it comes to renewable energy, and benefiting financially. He considers both equity and security – an end to dependence on foreign oil, for instance. He explores the rejuvenation of regional Australia.....a new populist movement driven by Australian women.

Comments from others on his vision:

Simon Holmes a Court, Businessman:

Saul has a knack for simplifying: decarbonising Australia is largely a matter of us replacing 101 million machines that rely on fire with ones that don't. As we replace fire with electrons... 'green' electrons.... electricity produced by non-polluting sources, rather than burning coal and gas and dumping carbon dioxide and other pollutants into the air – using the atmosphere as a giant open sewer, as Al Gore likes to put it"

Senator David Pocock:

Saul proposes a more democratic energy system that provides cheaper, more reliable and more secure energy ..... all while avoiding the damage to our heath, climate and economy caused by burning fossil fuels....and helping address two of the more pressing challenges we face: climate change and the cost of living.

Former Senator Christine Milne:

In a linear economy "raw materials are made into products that are used until they are discarded as waste". A circular economy focuses on reducing, reusing and recycling...not only is the ecological impact minimised, but the ecological, economic and social impact is even positive.

What will happen to 20 million obsolete cars and gas burners? Electrification has to occur within ecosystem limits, not by 'offsetting' ..... better to protect a forest and recover metals and minerals from obsolete



machines than dig a new mine.

At the end of his essay Saul argues that "we can show the world later this century what a circular economy really looks like"

Ian Lowe AO Emeritus Professor of Science, Technology and Society at Griffith University:

Perhaps the most interesting observation in the essay is the comment about the leadership of women.....in the 2022 election the Teal independents elected were all women. Surveys show that women are much more likely to support strong action on climate change than men.

Saul has the last word here.

An all electric lifestyle will need copper, nickel, iron, lithium, silicon and other things..... mined at a great cost to the Earth.....but these are extremely recyclable.

Simon Holmes a Court says we have to walk and chew gum and change everything from the ballot box to switchboard at the same time – and he's right. Or, as he puts it, "we need to focus on systematic change, work to build movements in our communities, elect the right people and pass the right laws" I couldn't agree more violently.



#### Sick Pay Guaranteed For Thousands More Casual Workers

The State Government is helping more casual and contract workers access sick and carer's pay, increasing the number of jobs covered by the Victorian Sick Pay Guarantee and extending the pilot until March 2025.

More than 400 new jobs are now eligible for the nation-leading Sick Pay Guarantee – giving thousands more workers in casual and contract jobs the opportunity to access up to 38 hours a year of sick and carer's pay.

Casual, contract and self-employed workers including community support workers, taxi and rideshare drivers, arts workers, childcare and early childhood workers, fitness instructors, tourism and outdoor recreation workers, factory workers, fruit pickers and hairdressers can check their eligibility and sign up to the scheme today.

Newly eligible workers can apply for sick and carer's pay from the day they sign up, and workers who were eligible in the first phase of the pilot will benefit from an additional year of the pilot.

The \$245.7 million Australian-first initiative aims to reduce workplace illnesses and injuries and keep businesses safer and more productive.

Since the pilot launched in March 2022, more than 76,000 casual and contract workers have signed up. In that time, the Sick Pay Guarantee has covered more than 1.8 million hours of sick and

carer's pay, giving workers the financial security to stay home when they're sick or need to care for loved ones.

Workers can check their eligibility and sign up online at vic.gov.au/ sickpayguarantee or in the Service Victoria app. Neighbourhood Houses can also help people to sign up and access the scheme – visit www.nhvic. org.au to find a participating Neighbourhood House.

Information is available in 19 languages on the Sick Pay Guarantee website. To speak to an interpreter, call the Translating and Interpreting Service on 131 450 and ask for the Victorian Sick Pay Guarantee hotline.

### More Little Learners Getting Outdoors With Bush Kinder

More of Victoria's littlest learners are getting the chance to explore and play in nature, with the Government delivering more Bush Kinder programs across the state.

Bush Kinder gives children the chance to learn while expanding their curiosity and independence in a natural environment, putting them in touch with nature through outdoor activities and creative play.

A \$3.6 million investment has been announced in 600 bush kinder programs state-wide over the next four years.

Grants for Bush Kinder programs starting next year are now open, which will support 150 kindergarten providers across Victoria to take children's learning outdoors.

The \$6,000 grants will help kindergartens purchase necessary equipment to set up programs that focus on getting outside, playing with natural materials and learning through activities like climbing trees and watching wildlife.

Bush Kinder programs are educational as well as exciting for children, giving them a supervised place to play in a natural environment – with significant positive impact on their development, as well as on their physical and mental health and wellbeing.

The Government is making it easier for more early childhood service providers to bring outdoor education into kinder through a new free online portal – providing staff with professional learning and case studies to ensure all children get the full range of benefits of learning in nature.

Through the nation-leading \$14 billion Best Start, Best Life reforms over the next decade, the Government is transforming kindergartens to give every Victorian child the best start to life, save families time and money, and support parents – especially women – to return to work or study if they choose.

#### Scholarships To Boost The Mental Health Workforce

The State Government is offering 20 scholarships at the Hamilton Centre to specialise in the field of addiction.

Valued at \$10,000 each, the Graduate Certificate of Addictive Behaviours scholarships will be delivered online by Monash University from February to November in 2024.

Established following a recommendation from the Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health System to improves outcomes for people living with both mental health and substance use or addiction, the Hamilton Centre opened in April this year.

A collaborative network coordinated by Turning Point, the Hamilton Centre's specialised addiction services are delivered by St Vincent's Hospital, Eastern Health, Western Health, Austin Health, and Goulburn Valley Health – playing an important role in guiding best practice in integrated care across metro, rural, and regional Victoria.



### Winchelsea Community Action Plan 2023 – 2026

How we will progress these ideas and opportunities is the next part of the plan. The plan therefore continues over time.

We look forward to you joining in to create positive outcomes for our community.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Winchelsea – Winchelsea is located on both Wadawurrung Country and Gulidjan Country. Today it is a small rural town on the banks of the picturesque Barwon River, midway between Geelong and Colac. It is the largest inland town in the Surf Coast Shire and a major service centre for surrounding smaller communities. Winchelsea is designated as one of two 'growth towns' within the Surf Coast Shire (the other being Torquay).

Winchelsea is currently growing at a moderate rate but planning is being undertaken to accommodate a potential population of 10,000 residents by 2050. The population estimate for Winchelsea as of 30th of June 2021 is 2,524. Since the previous year, the population has grown by 6.20% which is almost five times the population growth average for Regional Victoria (1.33%)

The Winchelsea Community Action Plan includes an umbrella Community Vision and 6 key themes that fall under it.

Each key theme has its own goals and its own list of priority projects plus additional project ideas - all received through the Winchelsea community.

It's important to note that whether a project is 'priority' or not isn't overly important because any project will only progress if locals want it to and get together to make it progress.

#### Wild Dog Management Plan a no-brainer

The Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) is urging the Victorian Government to renew the highly successful Wild Dog Management Plan that has seen an enormous drop in wild dog attacks on livestock since launching in 2012.

VFF Livestock Group Vice-President and Tallangatta farmer Peter Star said the VFF has written to the government seeking the plan's renewal, after 11 years of positive results protecting farmers, livestock and native wildlife from the effects of wild dogs.

"Since launching in 2012, the Wild Dog Management Plan has been instrumental in a 75 per cent reduction in livestock loss and attacks on properties neighbouring public lands in east and south-west Victoria."

"Livestock farmers have come to rely on this plan to protect their livestock from the harrowing impacts of wild dogs and renewing it is a complete no-brainer."


"Wild dogs cause untold damage to livestock and native wildlife, while the impact of losing livestock to wild dog attacks takes a massive toll on a farmer's mental health."

"Wild dog control in the three-kilometre livestock protection buffer is delivering genuine conservation outcomes. It also has positive impacts on Victoria's dingo population by reducing the risk of crossbreeding with domestic dogs, while reducing the impacts of attacks by dingoes and wild dogs on neighbouring livestock production and domestic pets," Mr Star said.

The VFF's calls to renew the program come as a Victorian Government review is being undertaken in response to the Parliamentary review into ecosystem decline, which recommended that dingoes, which are considered a threatened species in Victoria, are protected across the state.







