Timeline (so far)...

1986: PLANTING THE SEEDS OF HOPE

A small group of pioneers, led by Pastors John and Joan Pennicook, gathered monthly in a lounge room to pray and plan for the birth of a Christian Life Centre Church in the Wyong Shire. Their unwavering faith and commitment laid the foundation for what would eventually become Hope Unlimited Church.



1987: HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

On February 1st, 1987, they held their inaugural service in Gorokan High School Hall, with just 70 attendees. A regular morning service started on the 7th of June that year, and from there, the church continued to grow.

2011: NEW LEADERSHIP, HOPEUC CHARMHAVEN

From 2011, Pastors Mark and Darlene Zschech relocated from Sydney to become the Lead Pastors of Hope Unlimited Church Charmhaven. HopeUC began to expand rapidly, setting the stage for a new chapter in its history.

2012: HOPEUC GOSFORD

Our Gosford campus began as a life group in the home of Mel and Matt Hope and officially started as a campus in 2012.



2013: HOPEUC PENINSULA

Our Peninsula campus started when Sam and Kylie Collins from Good News church joined HopeUC in April 2013 and has a history that stretches back to when it was started by Pastors Pat and Brian Donovan in 1980.



2018: HOPEUC NEWCASTLE

Our Newcastle Campus was started in the 1980s and grew to become Globe Church with Pastors Bruce and Kate Robertson, and is now known as our HopeUC Newcastle Campus.

2019: HOPEUC MAITLAND

HopeUC Maitland, planted by Grant and Megan Atherton in 2004, joined the church family in 2019.



2021: HOPEUC PORT STEPHENS

Baylife Church, planted by Pastors Greg and Robyn Mckewin in 2002, became part of the HopeUC family, adding to the growing presence of the church in the Hunter Region.

Creative HQ Update

In the past 12 months, we've seen over 100 students attend lessons in Newcastle and Charmhaven. Approximately 40% of these students are community-based and don't attend church. We have supported families walking through life challenges with flowers and meals, and have had community families attend HopeUC events (Easter, Christmas, HopeUC Kids Creative Days) and feel welcomed and loved by our church. This year, we're reaching all ages, running new classes such as toddler music and dance fitness. Our youngest student is one year old, and the eldest is 84!

We are praying and believing for more growth this year via new team leaders and students. We'd also love the opportunity to sponsor more local kids in our communities to attend lessons.



Generation Unlimited

Generation Unlimited has been incredibly fruitful these past 12 months. We saw 490 brand-new teenagers walk into our youth ministry, and 147 committed their hearts to Jesus. Our youth leaders are passionate about making disciples and have rallied 31% of our Friday attendees into a regular life group where we teach God's Word and pray together. Our youth pastors and teams serve in seven high schools each week of the school term. They work with chaplains and welfare workers, running breakfast clubs where they make pancakes and connect with students. In Newcastle last December, a 14-year-old wandered into church from the breakfast program at Hunter Sports High and committed her heart to Christ. Through Hope Local, we've purchased a number of BBQs for local high schools and have blessed many with food hampers and meals.

In January, Summer Camp saw hundreds of teenagers encounter God in a fresh new way, which continued into semester one. A parent fed back to our youth pastors in Port Stephens, boasting of the change she'd seen in her son who had recently committed his heart to Christ. She mentioned he'd been reading his Bible regularly and had genuinely changed. We're so thankful to God for all He's done and have faith for more! Thanks to our church family at HopeUC for always believing in our youth and youth leaders.

ONGOING PARTNERS AND PROJECTS

We continue to work with our five key mission partners in Ukraine, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, the Philippines, and Rwanda. We have committed to long-term partnerships and ongoing financial support with these ministries and projects for the coming Legacy year.

WAYNE & OLYA ZSCHECH -UKRAINE

The wood waste briquette production continues to produce solid heating fuel wood briquettes to bless war-affected families, particularly the elderly. In partnership with the Zschechs and Operation Mobilization, we are seeing people find hope in Jesus and practical solutions to heating and unemployment within war-torn Ukraine.

NAREL & ALISON ATKINSON -SRI LANKA

The Atkinsons continue to impact lives throughout Sri Lanka. Some recent highlights include 1000 women attending the Alokaya Women's conference in the East and 122 low-income families positively impacted by attending the HelpKids Centre.

PAUL & DEB HILTON -VIETNAM & BEYOND

The Hiltons have continued to mentor and coach mission leaders globally, including recent missions in the Middle East and Kenya. It's amazing to see their faithful work in Vietnam for the last 30 years being multiplied in nations worldwide.

SCOTT & RUTH BUCHANAN -PHILIPPINES

The Buchanans report exciting new church planting efforts through Mindoro. They are a huge encouragement to local leaders through coaching, Bible teaching, and we are pleased to report great progress with the church building at Lapantay, which we are partnering to build.

FRUITS OF HOPE & HOPE GLOBAL LEADERSHIP CENTRE - RWANDA

Our Fruits of Hope Academy is growing, and with that, the need for student sponsorships is increasing. We have been able to contribute towards student sponsorships as well as funds towards the nutrition program, ensuring children have access to a healthy breakfast and lunch during their school day.

Plans for the Hope Global Leadership Centre Rwanda have been finalized. Partnering with architects Silvester Fuller in Sydney, the result is a centre that we believe will provide a greater opportunity than ever before to serve and empower the wonderful people of Rwanda and beyond.



We have witnessed many teams, pastors, and leaders released into global mission fields through the GOING 2023/2024 initiative, including trips to India, Vanuatu, Sri Lanka, and Bali. Each trip has raised significant funds and seen incredible impact through projects and ongoing relationships. We have four trips planned for the latter half of this year to Bali, Vanuatu, the Philippines, and Rwanda.

Through the various 2023 Going teams' fundraising efforts, we raised \$115,000 towards building projects, community outreach, and leadership events. We aided team leaders with partial financing for some of these trips.



THE GOING

India Testimony

The trip was truly incredible and life-changing; words can't fully capture its impact. I urge you all to consider joining one of the teams.

Reading "No Longer a Slumdog" years ago opened my eyes to the millions in India affected by the caste system, lacking hope in Jesus. It compelled me to act.

When the opportunity to go to India arose, it was a no-brainer. It was all I had ever dreamed of—my first time overseas, going to a place I had prayed and dreamed of, and sharing the love of Jesus with all people.

My favorite moment was volunteering in our HopeUC Kolkata church and being part of their kids' outreach day. The kids from the "Daisy Project," coming from challenging backgrounds, stole my heart. It was mind-blowing to see how this ministry was changing their lives.

I donated money to support their cause, but it didn't go through right away. However, God's timing was impeccable. In the process, I learned that one of the girls from the Daisy Project had a simple birthday wish: to have a meal at a restaurant with her friends. The money came through a week later, exactly in time for her birthday, and also sponsored 5 children for a year.

This is just a glimpse of what God can do. I can't even begin to imagine what He will do if each of us says, "God, I'm willing to go."

Local Community Mission

MEALS OF HOPE, THE WELCOME PLACE, AND MORE

It is incredible to see many come to faith and find community at HopeUC through a meal and a smile. We are continuing to see these things transforming people's lives, physically and spiritually. Across our campuses, we are giving out thousands of meals and hamper packs every year. Four out of the six campuses now have a Foodbank account, and many continue to partner with Ozharvest and Aldi for food distribution.

HOPE LOCAL TRIP TO PEAK HILL

Our Peak Hill team recently returned from a hugely successful second trip this Legacy year, partnering with local churches through a combined men's breakfast, kids' fun afternoon, and a worship night, plus a combined Sunday service. This visit, the team stayed at Engeti ministry and were able to paint the dorms throughout.

SRE & GU IN SCHOOLS

We continue to invest in our local schools across all campuses through GU school ministry programs, SRE teaching and booklets, and with the purchase of new BBQs for several schools. Our youth teams continue to flip pancakes in seven schools across the regions and provide great connections for school welfare teams and in our youth programs.

HOPE LOCAL PROJECTS

We continue to identify needs within our community and partner with quality charities like CAP, Hope in a Suitcase, and Got Your Back Sista. Last Christmas, in addition to distributing thousands of hampers, we also gave hundreds of toys to Hope in a Suitcase to support vulnerable families across the holiday period.

OUTREACH, COMMUNITY & LIFE GROUPS

Our greatest joy this year has been watching the doors of the church open wider and the community finding 'home' at Hope. Three mornings a week the church is a hive of activity: Meals of Hope, Sisters, Platinum, maintenance, cooking, admin, pastoral care, sewing for missions. On a Thursday, 15-20 community members participate in a Bible study before the food arrives, enjoying friendship. Some now serve on the team, and some also attend Sundays.



EVERY NATION CELEBRATION

Since July 2023, we have given 1923 hampers, plus dozens of frozen meals each month. 'Return & Earn' brings people on the property daily. New community opportunities included a circus and dance school hire. Creative HQ had up to 28 students - church and community. We have a weekly presence in two local high schools and a fortnightly presence in an aged care facility.

Another highlight has been the continuity of the Next Steps and Foundations of Faith programs. In the past nine months, there have been 133 salvation responses (Sundays + GU).

Life group engagement is growing, and Sunday services are flourishing. A team committed to regular prayer and intercession undergird all activity of the church.

BUILDING UPDATE

- Multipurpose Room upgrade: sound desk / children's bathroom toilets
- Kitchen: new freezers / exhaust fan / air conditioner
- Junior Room: paint refresh
- Rear exterior wall painted
- Car park bumpers
- CCTV cameras: internal and external

Looking ahead, we are excited for an all-weather courtyard space for connection, both midweek and Sundays with the addition of a portico (plans are underway). Our Meals of Hope program will expand to include Alpha, money coaching, and regular chaplaincy, and we are looking to create a community garden space. We look forward to strengthening and building connections and partnerships with other local community organizations. Our prayer is that by God's grace Charmhaven will

continue to grow in the prophetic mandate to be a lighthouse to our community.

OUTREACH, COMMUNITY & LIFE GROUPS

As we reflect on the past year, we're grateful and excited to share some incredible updates with you.

In the past year, we've witnessed numerous individuals finding salvation within our community, with many also requesting Bibles during our Christmas Eve services. Additionally, we celebrated multiple baptisms, signifying new beginnings and spiritual growth. Our Easter Kids production successfully engaged 115 children with the story of Easter, while the Alpha course has significantly grown, fostering spiritual exploration and clarity. Through our Meals of Hope initiative, we've supported 140 families during challenging times, distributing 1000 meals to those in our community facing a cancer journey. Our partnership with MMAD (Musicians Making A Difference) has extended our reach, particularly among young people facing tough circumstances. Meanwhile, our Life Groups continue to thrive, offering deeper community and discipleship opportunities, with more people joining weekly.

BUILDING UPDATE

Our commitment to enhancing our campus facilities continues fervently. With regards to the Kids Room upgrade, we made significant improvements:

- Full repaint of the Primary and Junior Room using jute colour to create a calming atmosphere, replacing the previously bright and overstimulating colours.
- Purchased new rugs, toy boxes, clocks, and toys for the rooms.
- Utilized paintings and other decorations from the rooms and in our corridors to brighten the walk down to the kids' spaces, addressing the previous hospital corridor feel and reducing the sense of overwhelm for some children by the time they reached the rooms. Champions Club remains a great blessing for many wonderful kids.






Future Gosford Campus

Behind the scenes, a dedicated team has been working on plans for our new Gosford building. This endeavour has led us to engage in meaningful discussions with the state government, exploring opportunities to address community needs, including affordable housing and essential services.





Newcastle Campus

Our Newcastle campus is experiencing remarkable growth, and we are incredibly excited to witness people of all ages becoming part of our church community.

OUTREACH, COMMUNITY & LIFE GROUPS

Our Welcome Place ministry continues to thrive, welcoming an average of 26 families per week for groceries, free coffee, and lunch. Many of these families have visited or joined the church as a result of this ministry.

Our EAPA relief program operates midweek. In the first quarter of 2024, We have administered \$7500 in electricity vouchers to 20 families in need.

Our youth ministry is flourishing, with an average of over 100 young people attending every Friday. We also run a Brekkie Club every Tuesday at Hunter Sports High. Our Scripture teachers also minister regularly at Dudley Public, Floraville Public, and Mt Hutton Public.

Additionally, our life groups continue to grow and flourish, providing avenues for deeper community and discipleship.

In term three, we plan to launch "58," a devotional-style study group operating during the Sunday message for kids from Years 5 to 8. Our aim is to empower our kids to grow in their personal relationship with Jesus and prepare them for youth ministry.

BUILDING UPDATE

We expanded volunteer parking onto cleared land at 51 Pacific Highway, significantly easing Sunday parking congestion.

Plans are underway for a large weather awning for the front fascia area, providing shelter during inclement weather and alleviating foyer congestion.

In April, we completed the PA system upgrade, improving the quality and clarity of our Sunday and youth services.

We're exploring options to renovate our children's area downstairs, aiming to create a more spacious and engaging environment for our kids' ministry. Though in the early stages, this project holds great promise for enhancing the

experience for our youngest members.

COMMUNITY GARDEN

This year, we established a community garden. By selling the old shipping container at the back of our campus, we obtained funding for fencing. Turf was donated, and together we created a garden for both us and the community. During the official opening, a gentleman from the Welcome Place declared it open and cut the ribbon, making it a very special moment.

BUILDING UPDATE

We've also installed new soundproofing boards in the Kids Primary space. This space is increasingly used during the week, hosting Sisters in the day and Sisters at night Bible studies, as well as the Strong Disciples program and our HopeUC Kids Primary programs.

Other campus updates include new speakers in the auditorium, a lighting system upgrade, new ceiling tiles, and the installation of CCTV for added safety and security.

In the upcoming year, we aim to refresh and renovate our Kids Primary and Junior rooms with murals, additional soundproofing, and new carpeting with underlay. It's time for our kids' rooms to get a makeover.

COMMUNITY, DISCIPLESHIP & LIFE GROUPS

Our December Christmas Festival has become an annual highlight, combining services into one 9:30 am gathering, followed by extended outdoor activities in the side car park for all ages to enjoy. It's a beautiful expression of our church family coming together, and it's an easy invitation for people to bring their friends along.

Strong Disciples, a course deepening one's walk with Jesus, is becoming more integrated into our church's discipleship pathway.

Our Life Groups are thriving more than ever, with various options including art groups, Sisters, Brothers, and families, inviting more people into community and discipleship.

We are earnestly praying (and knocking on doors) to establish a pancake program in a local high school. While we've encountered closed doors, we're not giving up. Can you join us in prayer for an open door into the schools?

During the Christmas season, we partnered with Hope in a Suitcase to donate thousands of presents to families in need.

BUILDING UPDATE

We've enhanced our campus facilities to create a warm and inviting space. This includes a new waterproof sail over the kids' playground, a 40ft container for storage, and a renovated back room serving as a versatile meeting space. Efforts to maximize auditorium space have ensured comfortable seating arrangements for our growing congregation.

Looking ahead, we're excited to launch new initiatives, including a drivethrough coffee business on our front lawn. We're also so excited about the upcoming construction of our new portico, which is set to begin very soon. This addition will not only enhance the aesthetic appeal of our building but also serve as an outdoor foyer, creating additional space in our auditorium for seating. 
