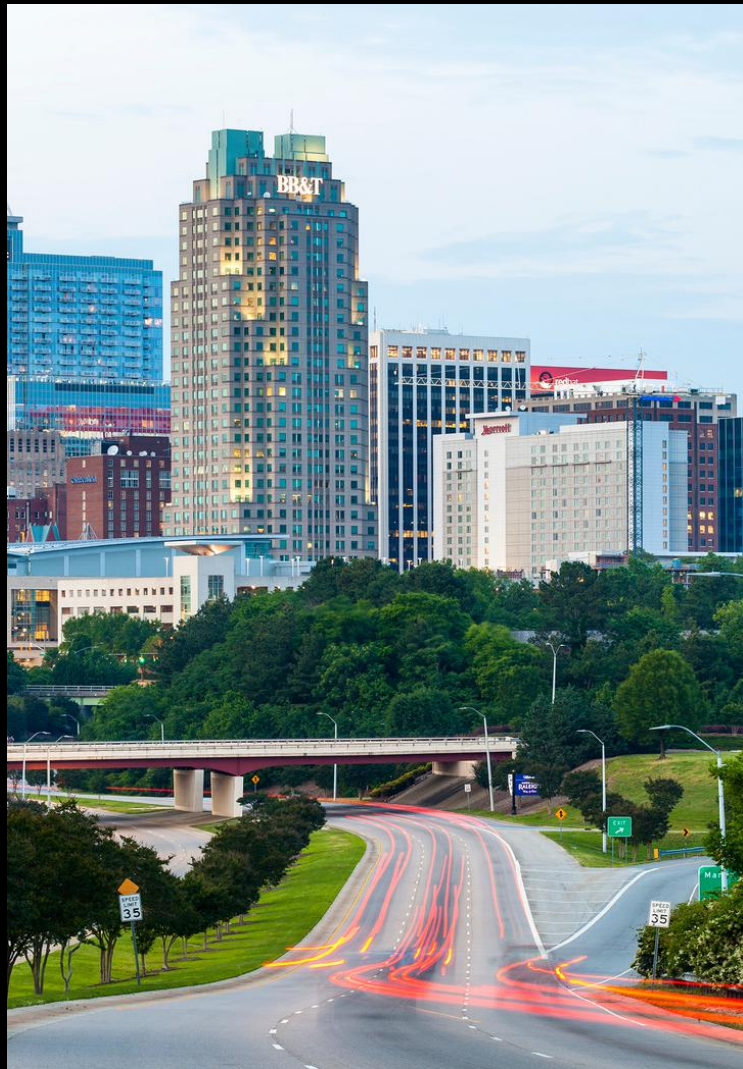

TAXES EXPLAINED

TO THE TRIANGLE AREA OF NORTH CAROLINA?



INCOME TAX

North Carolina has a flat state income tax rate of 5.25% (as of 2025), which applies to all income brackets.

SALES TAX

The state sales tax rate in North Carolina is 4.75%, but local jurisdictions like Raleigh and Durham apply an additional 2%, bringing the total sales tax rate in these areas to 7.75%.

PROPERTY TAXES

The average effective property tax rate in North Carolina is around 0.85%, which is slightly higher than the national average but still relatively affordable compared to other states.

Additionally, the Triangle area boasts a relatively low cost of living. Housing, groceries, and healthcare costs are all below the national average, while utilities and transportation expenses align closely with national averages.

AIRPORT ACCESS

Raleigh-Durham International Airport (RDU) is centrally located between Raleigh and Durham, offering easy access to nonstop flights to major hubs such as New York, Atlanta, Chicago, and Dallas. RDU is about 15 minutes from downtown Raleigh and 10 minutes from downtown Durham, making air travel quick and convenient.

AVERAGE COMMUTE TIMES

The average commute time in the Raleigh-Durham area is approximately 25 minutes, which is slightly shorter than the national average of 27 minutes. The area's well-planned infrastructure and major highways contribute to the relatively low commute times.

The Raleigh-Durham area offers a balanced mix of convenience and accessibility for residents:

PUBLIC TRANSIT

GoRaleigh and GoDurham provide bus services across Raleigh and Durham, respectively. While public transit options are limited compared to larger metros, these services cover major routes, including connections to suburban areas like Cary, Apex, and Knightdale.

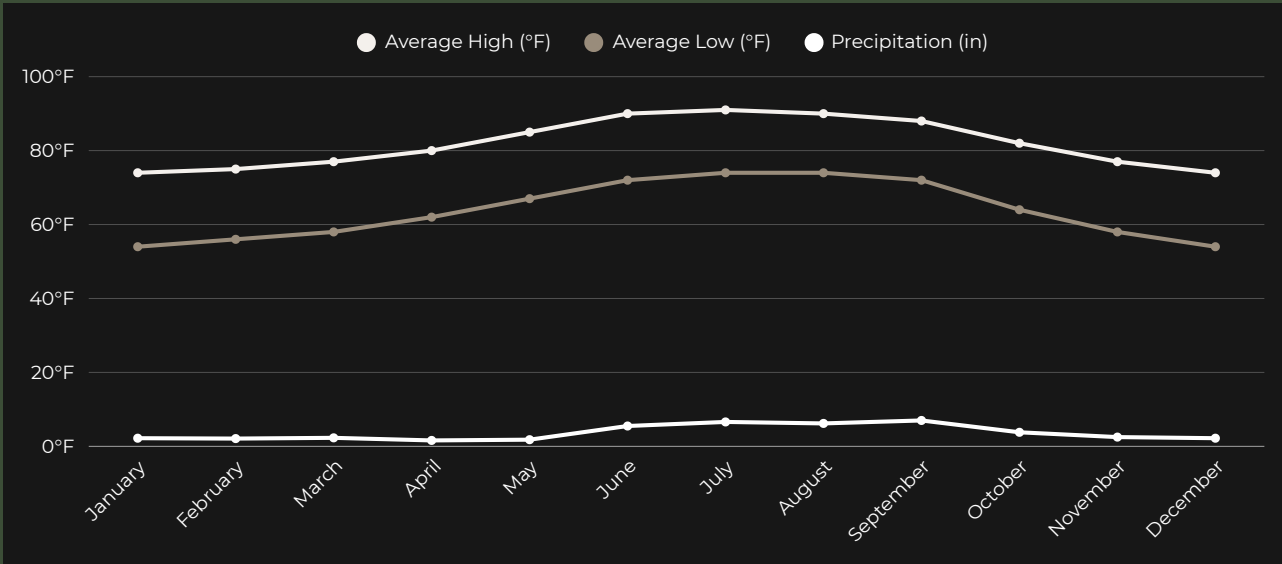
Seasons
