## Recapping a Euro Broomball Adventure

**If you needed another reason to travel to France for Worlds, check out Elizabeth and Bryan's write up in their recent trip to the 2023 European Broomball Championship in Switzerland!**

Last November, we had the pleasure of participating at the 2023 European Broomball Championship in Lausanne, Switzerland.

Lausanne is the home of the Olympics, and they take sport seriously. The stadium had two indoor rinks, one with stadium seating, as well as an outdoor rink for winter skating, and a swimming pool complex in the same building. The city is nestled between the Swiss Alps and Lac Lemman, easily accessible by train, about an hour from Geneva. We came via Italy and took the train through the Alps, rolling past beautiful scenery. Lausanne also hosts the Olympic Museum, which is well worth the trip if you're in the area.

Euros is a great tournament that brings together teams and players from across Europe, but also teams from North America and individual players from as far afield as Japan (and Australia!) who were paired up with various teams. The short 3 day tournament featured both Mixed and Mens Divisions. The Mens Division featured 7 European teams from across Switzerland, France, and Italy. The mixed division had 8 teams, starting with international round robins and then split into European and North American divisions for the finals. It was great to play against a wide variety of teams from across the world.

We were lucky enough to play with teams from Switzerland in 2019 at Angers in France. This time, Bryan was matched up with the Black Hawks (a Mens team from Switzerland) and I played with Creations Michel D'Astous (a mixed team from New Brunswick).





It was great to meet up with friends we'd made at previous Euros, players who had played with and against the Aussies at Worlds, and of course with our favourite CanAussie, Don Godmaire. There were a handful of other Aussies there as well, which was great to see.

I speak French which is a definite advantage, although the Canadian French my team spoke was a bit tricky and my Aussie accent was tough for some of them. But both our teams had a mix of French, English and bilingual speakers so we were able to get by. In the end, we all speak broomball.

My team ended up champions of the North American division! I definitely learned a lot and saw my skill level increase in a short time playing with such a great team. While Bryan's team didn't win any trophies, they had a lot of fun and most importantly, he came home uninjured (despite some intense games!). The celebratory dinner was held in the function rooms above the main stadium which was a great way to finish an excellent tournament.

Thank you again to Bertrand Grossenbacher, Sabrina Gerber and the EBA organising committee for an excellent competition. Looking forward to seeing you again in France for Worlds 2024, and then onto Euros 2025!

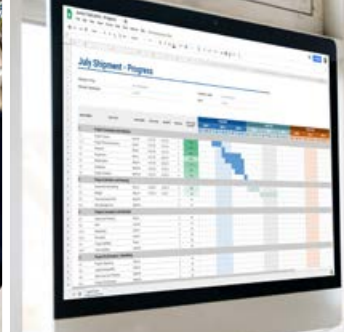

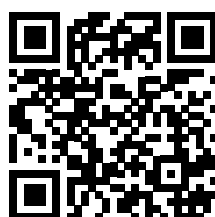

# Tournament Format by Division

## Men's Competition (Elite & Intermediate Divisions)

- 3 Team Divisions
- 3 Rounds Played
- 1st v 2nd Final



## Women's Competition

- 5 Team Division
- 1st Round - All teams play each other (4 games per team)
- After 1st Round, competition splits to Elite & Intermediate divisions
- Elite Division comprises teams placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd after 1st Round
- Intermediate Division comprises teams placed 4th and 5th after the 1st Round

## Women's Competition (Elite Division, After 1st Round)

- 3 Team Division (1st, 2nd & 3rd placed after 1st Round)
- Points carry forward from 1st Round
- 1 Round Played (all elite teams play each other once)
- 1st v 2nd Final

## Women's Competition (Intermediate Division, After 1st Round)

- 2 Team Division (4th & 5th placed after 1st Round)
- 2 Game Grand Final Series
- Both games must have a winner - no draws
- In the event of a draw, the game will be decided upon by 3-on-3, no goalies, until there is a winner
- If the series is tied 1-1 at the end of the second game (even if that game was decided by the above 3-on-3 rule), then the Nationals overtime rules apply to decide the series



## Nationals Tournament Overtime Format

- Applies for all finals (including if Women's Intermediate Division is a series tie after game 2)
- 10 minutes, 3-on-3 with goalies, Golden Goal
- If still tied after 10 minutes, 3 v 3 penalty shootout



## Benches & Change Room Protocol

- Take note of Home and Away bench designation in the draw, that is your team's starting bench
- After your game, exit change rooms by half-time of the game following yours, and therefore;
- Teams preparing for their next game, enter the change room at half-time of the current game
- Players are not to leave gear bags or other equipment in change rooms between games
