



#### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LABOR FORCE JANUARY 2025

#### THE BORDERPLEX REGION


- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 1,419 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY 716 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 2,135 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

#### **EL PASO, TX MSA**

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT 4.2%, WITH A TOTAL OF 17,795 UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 7,600 NONFARM JOBS SINCE JANUARY 2024
- EL PASO, TX MSA LOST 4,100 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

#### RURAL COUNTIES (BREWSTER, CULBERSON, JEFF DAVIS, HUDSPETH, AND PRESIDIO COUNTIES)

- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 123 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 64 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 59 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

The three Super Sectors with the **GREATEST** employment for the El Paso MSA in January 2025 were:


- 1. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities

- 3. Information


These three Super Sectors represented 9% of the total nonfarm employment.






#### **UNEMPLOYMENT in January 2025**










#### Industries Sectors that lost jobs


#### **ACTIVE UI CLAIMANTS BY MONTH BORDERPLEX REGION**










