Rendezvous — outings galore, usually on or around water


Long-time members – you can learn so much from seasoned members of our squadron

## **Essential knots in boating**

What knots do you use during your boating activities? Most of us do not think about this much until we need to do something with our boat lines or to help someone secure their boat at a dock.

How do you attach a line to your boat for docking? How about tying to a dock? How do you attach an anchor? Do you attach the end of your anchor line to your boat? (The bitter end?) How do you make a longer line by tying one line to another? What knots are easy to tie, easy to untie and does the job intended well? Can someone else identify your knot type?

Depending on what we are doing, the correct knot can make a big difference. Which knots are reliable enough and strong enough to hold your life?

My first exposure to proper knot tying was in the Boy Scouts. The Boy Scouts have knots required for achieving the Tenderfoot level, Second Class level and First Class level. These are mostly associated with outdoor (land) activities. Several of our nautical knots are <u>not</u> included in the Boy Scout list of required knots.

Knots and knot uses historically listed in various America's Boating Club literature include:

- Cleat Hitch Attaching line to a cleat. (Note: This knot may not work well with polished cleat due to slippage.) Watch this video of how to tie a cleat hitch: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2CLt4BEBMRk">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2CLt4BEBMRk</a>
- 2) Bowline Called one of the most useful knots. It makes a loop that will not slip or tighten up. This is the knot I use when towing so I do not need cut the line to disconnect it. Secure around a piling or wrap around the horns of a polished boat cleat. Slightly complicated to tie but easy to untie after it has been subject to strong loads. - 3) Round Turn and Two Half Hitches Often used to attach a line to a piling. The round turn takes the strain and the two half hitches secures the knot. Watch this video of how to tie a round turn and two half hitches: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=daAM234GIV8
- 4) Clove Hitch Similar to a round turn. It is used alone often to secure coiled lines. If used on a piling to hold a vessel, it should not be used alone as it may slip. Secure a Clove Hitch with two half hitches and you got a secure knot that's easy to untie. Watch this video of how to tie a clove hitch: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L0VPM1h399c
- 5) **Square Knot** (Reef Knot) Joins two lines (often joins the ends of the same size line). Watch this video of how to tie a square knot: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=r2UoNizNx-U">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=r2UoNizNx-U</a>
- 6) **Sheet Bend** Joins two lines (especially lines of different diameters). Watch this video of how to tie a sheet bend: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jO8Xu-D0Wi0">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jO8Xu-D0Wi0</a>
- 7) Figure Eight (Stopper Knot) Often used on sailboats to keep lines from passing completely through blocks or sheaves. I once witnessed someone not using stopper knots on a small sailboat. One stopper knot should have been on the main sheet (sail adjustment line) to keep the line from completely leaving a boat mounted block. The other stopper knot should have been on the halyard (the line that raises the sail) going through a deck mounted block. Those lines were the only thing that attached to the rigging (mast, sails and boom) to the boat. The boat turned over in a high wind. They lowered the sails to upright the boat; all the rigging went to the bottom.) Hence the power of the stopper knot or figure eight knot.

Bonus: **Whipping Knot** — One more useful topic that most of us overlook is securing the fibers of the end of a line. Historically this is done using a form of "Whipping" hemp or other natural fiber lines so the ends do not come undone or fray. Whipping actually is a cord or twine used to bind or cover rope. Modern pre-manufactured store-bought line ends are typically fused and whipped. Lines bought off a spool are typically just taped after being cut. Fusing with heat and whipping the ends may be needed to keep line ends from becoming frayed. There are many methods of whipping. A less sophisticated but a quick and easy method of whipping is called the "Common Whipping Knot"

or just "Common Whipping." This method can be seen at the following YouTube videos:

Only two knots are featured in the current America's Boating Course: the Cleat Hitch and the Bowline. These are most likely the two most useful knots in boating therefore **Essential Knots in Boating**.




