Dear Friend of Community Prep,

Thank you for your support of our school over the past year. Rosanna had a strong start to the year but faced major health issues even before she started as head of school. I came in as an interim head from the middle of February until July 1. Then, Rosanna needed to resign on August 18 because of her battle with metastatic cancer. Everyone in our community wishes her well in the battle for her health and is deeply grateful for the love and work she put into the school during her time as head. I will be interim head as the school decides on its next step in this regard.

Graduation was wonderful. The 40 students who sat on the stage in our second graduation in the Elenowitz Center were vibrant, accomplished, and joyful. This was the largest graduation class in Community Preparatory School's history! They are attending: Classical, Cranston East, Cranston West, J.M. Walsh School for the Arts, LaSalle, Lincoln, The Met, Mount Pleasant, Newton, Philips Academy Andover, Providence Country Day, and St. Raphael Academy. Together, they received a total of \$1,503,000 in scholarship assistance. Their parents, teachers, and our entire community can share in their remarkable successes.

Having graduation on our own campus gave us the ability to go back to the graduation custom of having the entire school attend the celebration. We not only rejoiced for the graduates but also for each of the other grades stepping up into the next grade. This is the return of a wonderful Community Prep tradition.

As I look to the beginning of my 42nd year at Community Prep I am grateful for all the work that our hardworking teachers and staff have put into the school. It was just a month ago that our endowment hit the \$50M mark. Thank you to the development staff and our generous donors who made this remarkable achievement possible. It is a pleasure to be a member of this Community. Thank you for all you do for our students!

Sra. Corley's pursuit of lifelong learning reflects the very values Community Prep strives to instill in its students: curiosity, resilience, and a commitment to making a difference. As she returns to campus this fall, she brings with her not only new tools and strategies, but a renewed sense of purpose for shaping a more just and joyful educational environment.

All of us at Community Prep congratulate Sra. Corley on this extraordinary achievement. Her continued dedication to learning and leading is a gift to our school and a powerful reminder that education is a journey - one that transforms not just minds, but lives.



FINANCIAL AID

Every student accepted is welcome regardless of the family's ability to pay the full \$18,400 tuition. All families are expected to make a reasonable contribution to their child's tuition.

FUNDING

82% of the school's operating budget is funded through donations and other sources; tuition and fees cover only 18%. Traditional independent schools generate 80-90% of their budgets from tuition.

Endowment provides for Community Prep's future. The school's long-term goal is to have at least 40% of its annual operating costs covered by the income from endowment. Each year we budget spending 4% of our endowment fund's four-year average. Endowment will be the chief method of funding the expansion of our student body in the coming years. As of June 30, 2025, the endowment was \$49.2 million.

Janine A. Lee Honored with Susan B. Wilson Civic Education Merit Award

We're proud to announce that Janine A. Lee - Community Preparatory School's Creative Arts Teacher and Director, Technology Teacher, Technology Coordinator, and Grade 8 Senior Events Coordinator - has received First Place (Grand Prize) in the 18th annual Susan B. Wilson Civic Education Merit Awards, presented by the League of Women Voters of South County. The award includes a \$2,000 prize and was presented during a ceremony held at the Rhode Island State House on April 23.

The award honors Rhode Island educators whose teaching enriches students' understanding of civic rights and responsibilities, encourages participation, and connects classroom learning to real-world civic issues. Janine was nominated by Hannah Resseger, a past award recipient and teacher at SouthSide Elementary Charter School, for their collaborative project promoting student awareness of civic issues through creative expression.


"At Community Prep, students explore civic, real-world connections alongside visual art, music, dance, technology, and performance," Janine shared in her acceptance speech. "There are opportunities for Artivism—the combination of art and activism—to bloom."

Janine also reflected on a classroom project centered around a work by artist Joseph Norman. While the artwork itself wasn't created by Community Prep students, she guided students in contributing paper cutout words representing civic issues they care about—such as hunger, homelessness, and environmental justice—adding layers of meaning to the piece and sparking powerful dialogue about community responsibility.

"Some of those issues still exist today—and even more have emerged," she said. "This shows students that civic engagement and Artivism are ongoing, and deeply needed." Please join us in celebrating Janine A. Lee, whose dedication and creativity exemplify Community Prep's mission and the spirit of civic education.
