During my first visit to Burundi in 2014, I learned that access to clean water was the country's biggest problem. At that time, only 15% of the population had access to clean water, and none of the major water charities were operating in the country. Witnessing firsthand how terrible life is and how common death is when there is no access to clean water was horrifying.

But this is a solvable problem. Clean water is the foundational requirement for communities to rise above abject poverty. Until clean water is addressed, no other development efforts will be effective. Water projects are massively impactful in Burundi as they transform communities — reducing death rates, restoring health, increasing school attendance, and bringing hope and joy to families.

Amazi Water™ became Burundi's first and only in-country water organization, with a mission to ensure every community has sustainable access to safe, clean water. Overcoming Water Scarcity Saves Lives

According to the United Nations, less than half of Burundi's rural population had access to drinkable water in 2019. The World Bank cites Burundi as one of the most densely populated countries in the world. Anticipated population growth of 88% from 2022 to 2050 is expected to seriously reduce the percentage of people with water access.



# State-of-the-Art Equipment and Facilities Serving Burundi, From Burundi, as a US Non-Profit

More than 95% of the ministry's workforce is from Burundi and surrounding countries. The ministry's headquarters is in Bujumbura, Burundi. The facility was built in 2022 and serves as the base of operations support and management. More than 200 employees advance Amazi Water's mission, using the facility as a hub for constructing and safeguarding the functionality of the water systems while building relationships with local partners and international NGO directors.

Amazi Water is registered in Texas as a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization governed by an international Board of Directors. Operations are managed by a senior leadership team comprised of Burundian and multinational staff members.









# Stronger Together Partnering for Life-Saving Change

The solid partnership we have with the Burundi government makes Amazi Water's partnerships a little different from those of many nonprofit organizations. As we strive toward our goal of *Water for All* by 2030, our partners are dedicated to foundational principles, operational strategies, and growth and progress.

**GOVERNMENT** — The Burundi government sanctions Amazi Water as the nation's primary provider of safe, clean water.

NATIONAL STAFF — Experts transfer knowledge and skills to more than 200 national staff for professional development.

**OTHER NGOs** — Global organizations join to multiply impact and achieve shared goals in providing food, medicine, and education.

**DONORS** — Generous donors fund water systems in communities nationwide and provide access to the Gospel.

## Bujumbura Push

### Dedicated and Trained Staff Respond in Record Time

In early 2023, a major cholera outbreak hit Bujumbura, Burundi's economic capital, largest city, and main port. The outbreak affected thousands and revealed economically poor neighborhoods that were receiving only a few hours of water service per month. Responding to the crisis at the request of Burundi's president, Amazi Water rapidly installed 35 solar-powered water systems, providing clean water to high-population neighborhoods in just 90 days. This swift and successful effort, known as "The Bujumbura Push," highlighted the impact of quick and effective interventions in crisis situations and the advantage of having operations based in Burundi.
