In addition to PSR's doctoral, masters, and certificate programs we also offer courses through the Ignite Institute and our Theological Education for Leadership (TEL) program. PSR is also home to the Center for LGBTQ and Gender Studies in Religion (CLGS), the first seminary-based LGBTQ+ Center and the Badè Museum of Biblical Archaeology. 

Overall Financial Goals

As an institution, PSR is committed to meeting a "double-bottom line" of delivering on our mission while achieving financial sustainability. Thanks to your generous support, grant awards, growing enrollment, and good stewardship of our resources in 2024 we achieved another year of break-even operations.

An operating surplus provides us critically needed resources to invest in "regenerating the ecosystem" of theological education, offering an innovative stackable approach to our graduate education as well as developing an extensive distributed network and collective of learners and partners.

Resource Allocation

Most of our expenses are invested in academics including faculty, scholarships and our academic programs in alignment with our mission.

Endowment

Generous gifts, careful stewardship, and efforts to leverage our property assets towards our mission, have allowed us to significantly grow our endowment to a record high of \$56M as of December 2024. Living out our mission over 40% of our endowment funds are now managed by investments led by women and people of color. This is in stark comparison to the national average. According to the Knight Foundation only 1.4 % of assets under management in the U.S. are invested with firms owned by women and people of color.

Year of Impact

Spring Student Awards

Each year, Pacific School of Religion honors student excellence in building community, preaching, and ethics. These awards were presented at the Graduates' Chapel on May 7, 2024.

The Koinonia Community Building Award went to Maurice "Mo" King. The Marcella Althaus-Reid Award in Queering Religion and Theology went to Jessie "Jay" Ratcliff. The Michael M. Mendiola Prize in Ethics went to D. Lopez. The Paul Wesley Yinger Preaching Award went to Rev. Sarah TevisTownes.



157th Commencement Graduation

On Sunday, May 19th Pacific School of Religion celebrated its 157th commencement with the theme, Emerging Unafraid: Living Out the Courage of Our Compassion. The graduating class chose the theme to honor the knowledge that they are emerging into a world where the courage to fight for social justice and a commitment to approaching the world with compassion are needed in equal measure.

The speaker, PSR alumnx and Executive Pastor at the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, GA, Rev. Dr. John H. Vaughn (MDiv '85) echoed the theme of emerging unafraid, saying: "'Do not be afraid, for I am with you,' says God. I challenge us to emerge unafraid. Live and love out of the courage of our compassion...and unconditional love."

Each year, the graduating class raises funds for a Senior Gift to be given either to PSR, for a specific project, or on behalf of the school to an organization or initiative aligned with PSR's mission. This year, the gift, presented by Beth Pfeiffer (MDiv '24), was split between the school's "Shelter in a Time of Storm" student emergency fund and the Sogorea Te Land Trust.




Earl Lecture Series

The rise of Christian Nationalism in the U.S., along with other forms of religious nationalisms around the world, threaten to turn back the clock on hard fought progress on issues of equality, diversity, and justice. At the same time, the speed at which AI is developing raises serious concerns about its largely unregulated impact on everything from the way we work to the way we govern. Together, these profound challenges raise significant questions for both democracy and civil society today.

PSR's 2024 Earl Lecture Series, Disruptive AI, Christian Nationalism, and Democracy ran from September 17 through October 8 and sought to speak to the intersection of these forces.

The lecture series was led by John Robichaux, Executive Director for U.C. Berkeley's Coleman Fung Institute for Engineering Leadership, and PSR's Dean Susan Abraham, with responses by Leonard McMahon, Assistant Professor of Pastoral Care, Spirituality & Political Theology at PSR, and PSR President, David Vásquez-Levy.



Kwaray: A Bold Initiative to Reimagine Theological Education


Pacific School of Religion is excited to announce the launch of Kwaray, a bold and collaborative initiative designed to reimagine theological education. Drawing on the best of the Bay Area's technological innovation and expanding the reach of PSR's academic programs, Kwaray will be a distributed learning network that connects diverse voices and experiences, creating an inclusive, dynamic educational ecosystem. This groundbreaking initiative has been made possible by a generous grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. A primary aim of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s grantmaking in religion is to deepen the religious lives of Christians, principally by supporting efforts that enhance congregational vitality and strengthen the leadership of Christian communities.

In addition to PSR's rigorous and growing theological graduate program, Kwaray will reimagine traditional educational pathways by providing accessible, incremental learning experiences tailored to the needs of each participant. The platform will allow learners of all backgrounds to step into educational opportunities without barriers, thereby expanding PSR's inclusive environment that values diverse experiences.

Kwaray's development has been supported by extensive research and successful pilot programs, including PSR's Ignite Collective and Project K, which brought together current students and external participants to test the platform's capabilities. These pilots demonstrated Kwaray's potential to engage learners from various backgrounds, including those outside traditional theological education networks.



Unafraid Symposium

In April, the Office of Academic Affairs presented the Unafraid Symposium, the third annual gathering to celebrate academic excellence at Pacific School of Religion. This year's theme was Creating a World Where All Can Thrive: Deconstructing, Healing, Rebuilding, Imagining.

The Unafraid Symposium is designed to be a beacon for scholars, practitioners, and dreamers who share PSR's dedication to a fearless approach to building knowledge and creating a world where all can thrive. It celebrates the academic achievements of our students and facilitates a robust dialogue to transform our world.

The presented work will reflect PSR's mission to build collective knowledge; demonstrate how emerging theologies and spiritual practice can inform and transform our communal life; and provide insight into applying these ideas within and beyond spiritual communities, emphasizing innovation, resilience, and inclusivity.

It's also a day to be together in community and to spark conversations that will lead to future collaboration and innovation.

Fearless Generations: Alumnx in Action
