

FOUNDATION STAGE UPDATE




Year 1D have been learning about Forces and Magnetism in Science. They found out that magnets can pull some objects but not others and that this is called attraction.










EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS


