
THIS IS WHO I AM - the magic of books and creativity


Big Love for Bellies

WORKSHOP Ages: 3-7 Language: English

Event Description: Participants will join Thao for a read-aloud of her newest book, *Everybelly*. Afterwards, she will share the inspiration and creative process behind the story. This event is a joyful celebration of bellies in all their wonderful shapes—big, round, soft, or firm. Together, participants will practice kindness toward others and explore what bellies can do through playful movement. And since one cannot talk about bellies without food, the group will also dive into collage-making to build a positive relationship with eating.



Materials Required: textured and patterned scrap papers, colour construction paper, recycled materials like magazines or gift wrapping paper, white cardboard paper (size 8.5 inches x 11 inches), glue, scissors, colour pencils, and markers.



The Journey of a Story

WORKSHOP Ages: 5-12 Language: English

Event Description: In *The Paper Boat*, Thao's signature collage art tells the wordless story of one family's escape from Vietnam - a journey intertwined with an ant colony's parallel narrative. Thao will introduce the art of wordless picture books through visual storytelling. Together, we'll examine a range of techniques illustrators use to tell a story without text, including body language, facial expressions, composition, pacing, the use of colours, motion lines and graphic symbols.



What's In A Name?

WORKSHOP Ages: 5-8 Language: English

Event Description: Participants will share the stories behind their names and celebrate what makes each special. Using *THAO: A Picture Book* as a guide, they will explore why saying someone's name correctly is an important way of honouring who they are. For younger students, they will use collages to create self-portraits that draw inspiration from the class photos illustrated in the book's endpapers.


What Is Home?

Shana will share her journey—from the first sketch to a published book—and teach you the secrets of how words and pictures work together. Turn your creative playtime ideas into your very own new stories! **Shana will read her book aloud in Chinese or translate for English audiences.**




Wild Crossings: How Humans Impact Animal Habitats

TALK Ages: 5-12 Language: English

Event Description: In this talk, students will explore why animals migrate and the impact humans have on different habitats. Rachel will reveal how wildlife crossings are used to help animals cross man-made roads and railways all over the world: from canopy rope bridges for Hainan gibbons in China, to tiny tunnels for toads in South Africa. Rachel will share her notebooks and talk about how she researches and writes nonfiction followed by a Q&A session.
