Jesus accomplished His mission in the power of the Holy Spirit. Mary conceived Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit descended like a dove upon Jesus at His baptism. Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit of God to be tempted by Satan. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of Him spread throughout the whole region (Luke 4: 14). Jesus continued to be full of the power of the Spirit unto His death and resulting in His resurrection. Peter summed it up well in his discourse: "God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses. Exalted at the right hand of God, he received the promise of the holy Spirit from the Father and poured it forth, as you (both) see and hear." (Acts 2: 32-33).

During Jesus' ministry, mention is made of the Holy Spirit and how there will be an Outpouring upon us as Jesus Himself was filled by His Holy Spirit. John the Baptist contrasted His baptism of repentance with the baptism of Jesus: "I am baptizing you with water, ... He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and with fire." (Luke 3: 16). Upon Jesus' request, the Father gave us another Advocate to be with us always, the Spirit of Truth who will remain with us and in us (John 14: 16-17). Like Jesus, the Holy Spirit will offer us the same kind of assurance, strength, and peace that the world cannot give. And through the Holy Spirit we will be transformed into Christ. Furthermore, like Jesus and the Father, the Holy Spirit will be our God who dwells among us and within us. The Holy Spirit's abode will be in our hearts as it is in God's innermost being.



PREPARING FOR THE JOURNEY

Before His Ascension, Jesus reiterated the necessity of being baptized by the Holy Spirit: "Wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the holy Spirit." (Acts 1: 4-5). The Holy Spirit makes Jesus constantly present to us so that we will never be orphans, and unites heaven and earth as God's community of martyrs, witnesses, and saints. Therefore, the Holy Spirit will prove the world wrong about sin, namely, that Jesus is the only Savior of the world. The Holy Spirit will prove the world wrong about righteousness, because the ultimate righteousness or right order of things is that Jesus, as our Risen Lord, has restored us to the Father whose children we now are; about condemnation, because through His death, Jesus has vanquished Satan, prince of this world.

In Week Two of Revelation Five, we will continue to explore the theme of 'Receiving the Holy Spirit.' We will spend much time preparing ourselves to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. In our prayer, we will be amazed as we witness the power of the Holy Spirit manifesting itself in the early Church. Our hearts will be filled with praise and gratitude for God's wondrous works among His people. And like the Apostles and other disciples who experienced the power and transformation of the Holy Spirit, we will also ask that the Holy Spirit take possession of our lives, become the Keeper of our souls, and re-create us in the image and likeness of Jesus. 'Will you ask the Father to send His Holy Spirit upon you so that you truly have a Pentecost experience?'

When the disciple is living in God's will, they are making progress. They are experiencing consolations or movements from the Holy Spirit that are encouraging and supportive. The Holy Spirit is strengthening their commitment to covenant union with God. They are overwhelmed by God's gracious compassion and love and have an intense desire to reciprocate with generosity and fidelity. The Holy Spirit also acts as a supporter and friend, instilling confidence and courage so that they are not daunted by difficult tasks. The Holy Spirit works things out in such a way that even in difficult situations the challenge becomes possible to accomplish. In every sense of the word, the Holy Spirit is indeed their ADVOCATE!



There is another voice in the disciple's heart that is a negative and destructive force, not originating in God. This source is the evil spirit, either Satan or our own propensity toward evil and destruction. This evil force seeks to diminish and ensnare us by suggesting thoughts and movements that disturb and cause anxiety resulting in a loss of fervor. When we succumb to this evil influence, we experience discouragement and hopelessness. When this state is prolonged, we end up being lukewarm and stagnant. This state of desolation militates against the voice of the Holy Spirit. St. Ignatius of Loyola advises us to train ourselves to ignore the evil spirit's disturbing promptings in time of consolation when we are under the influence and guidance of the Holy Spirit. In times of desolation, He asks us to use every means possible to fight the desolation and return to consolation. Some of these means would be more prayer, service of others, depriving oneself of legitimate pleasures, fasting. Oftentimes, after we have successfully resisted such negative suggestions, we will see clearly that they were a web of deceit and delusion. Come Holy Spirit and enliven me with your wisdom and power!

This evening, you might want to be attentive to your patterns of behavior that keep you in a state of consolation as well as lead you into desolation. In the case of consolation becoming the normal state of your soul, such transformation takes place at the hands of the Holy Spirit. Under the Holy Spirit's guidance and direction, the disciple has developed consistent and productive spiritual habits. In the case of patterns leading us into desolation, they are generally longstanding and deeply ingrained in us. And they lead us into desolation because of their addictive nature. For today's review, I would like to name three sources of desolation: un-forgiveness, an unruly tongue, and the addictive use of the Internet. We become angry, unloving, and bitter when we harbor unforgiveness. We will possess a tranquil spirit only if we forgive ourselves and others. For various reasons, un-forgiveness being one of them, our tongues can become deadly instruments of sin. James 3: 8, puts it very graphically: "But no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison." The Internet is another source that could lead to dissipation and sin. Pornography has become a deadly problem for millions of people. How free are you from lustful curiosity leading to secrecy, guilt, and sin? Are you balanced in the use of the phone and internet? In times of desolation, St. Ignatius of Loyola asks us to use every means possible to fight desolation and return to consolation. They would be more prayer, service of others, depriving oneself of legitimate pleasures. As disciples of Jesus, we owe it to our Savior to humbly acknowledge our sins and make an act of repentance and contrition. After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness, you can pray the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? For what are you grateful? For what are you contrite? What spiritual practices, including fasting, do you need to focus on tomorrow?

"Now when the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent them Peter and John, who went down and prayed for them, that they might receive the holy Spirit, for it had not yet fallen upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them and they received the holy Spirit." - Acts 8: 14-17

Philip the deacon had fled Jerusalem along with other Hellenist followers of Jesus after the martyrdom of Stephen. They made their way to Samaria. Apparently, only the Greek speaking followers of Jesus were being persecuted in Jerusalem as the Aramaic or Hebrew speaking followers like the Apostles were left undisturbed. During His public ministry, Jesus had traveled through Samaria, and His reception among them was a mixed bag. Luke 9: 52-53 tells us that the Samaritans were inhospitable. Jesus and His disciples were not welcome because they were making their way to Jerusalem. On the other hand, in John 4: 39, many Samaritans came to believe in Jesus. Jesus had come for all, Jews, Samaritans, and Gentiles. Now that the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit has taken place, His covenant family is beginning to take wings, and the good news has arrived in Judea and Samaria, albeit through a persecution in Jerusalem, beginning with the martyrdom of Stephen.



Philip was an evangelizer and proclaimed the Messiah Jesus to the Samaritans. Baptism brought the Samaritans into a life-saving union with Jesus who has now become their Lord and Savior. Consequently, there was great joy in Samaria and the good news reached Jerusalem. Peter and John set out on an ecclesiastical visit. The Samaritans had been baptized in the name of Jesus by Philip the deacon, but had not yet received the Holy Spirit. When the Apostles confirmed them by laying hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them and they were filled with joy, peace, and power.

Peter and John's visit to Samaria held great significance for several reasons. Peter held the 'keys to the kingdom.' If Samaria had to be a legitimate church, it had to receive the sanction and blessings of the Apostles in Jerusalem. Secondly, the Holy Spirit was breaking down the age-old hostility between Jews and Samaritans. With Peter and John legitimizing the Samaritan church through their episcopal visit, the Jewish Christians would be more receptive to the workings of the Holy Spirit. And through Peter and John, the full power of the priesthood was being exercised. Baptism in the name of Jesus was being activated through the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Through Baptism you too have been brought into a covenant union with the Holy Trinity through Jesus, and in Confirmation, the Holy Spirit has come upon you as well and is now the Guardian of your soul! Come Holy Spirit and enliven me with your wisdom and power!

"While Peter was still speaking these things, the holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the holy Spirit even as we have? He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for a few days." - Acts 10: 44-49

The workings of the Holy Spirit never cease to amaze. Through the ministrations of the Holy Spirit, a new chapter begins in Peter's ministry. It is revealed to Peter that the Gentiles are to receive the good news and be brought into the church. He is summoned to go to Caesarea, about 30 miles north of Joppa and the capital of the Roman Province of Judea, to visit Cornelius, a centurion of the Cohort called Italica. The Holy Spirit has prepared Cornelius and his household to receive the life-giving waters of Baptism.



Until now, the Holy Spirit was being poured out only on Jewish believers. Jesus had said that He was sending His disciples to the ends of the earth, yet His disciples could not imagine or foresee that He was sending them to the Gentiles as well. The Holy Spirit's Outpouring upon the Gentiles astounded the disciples. The brothers from Joppa who had accompanied Peter on his visit with Cornelius are now undergoing a deeper renewal and understanding of their faith in Jesus. The boundaries of God's covenant family are expanding in ways they never could have imagined. Jesus is Savior and Lord of the Jews. Jesus is also Savior and Lord of the Gentiles! There was clearly a chasm between what they thought and what they now beheld and heard. Their minds would have to accept the evidence and replace their way of thinking with God's. They are indeed astounded!

For Peter, the evidence is overwhelming. The Holy Spirit has prepared Cornelius and his household to receive the life-giving waters of Baptism, in the name of Jesus. It was baptism by water and the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins. It made the disciples realize that with the resurrection of Jesus, they were in a revolutionary change. The Risen Lord has brought about a paradigm shift that will reverberate till the end of time. Since the resurrection of Jesus, the world has never been the same. It is only fitting, after such a momentous event, that Peter would stay with his new converts for a few days, to celebrate God's love through praise and thanksgiving, and to encourage and strengthen Cornelius and his household in their faith in Jesus. Come Holy Spirit and enliven me with your wisdom and power!

PAUL IN EPHESUS

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PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

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"He (Paul) said, "How were you baptized?" They replied, "With the baptism of John." Paul then said, "John baptized with a baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul laid [his] hands on them, the holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied." - Acts 19: 3-6

In A.D. 55-56, during his third missionary journey, Paul visited Ephesus and remained there for two years. Ephesus became the focus of his activities and evolved into an important Christian community. Some Ephesians were baptized with John's baptism of repentance. They had not yet heard of Jesus. Yet, John had told his audience that his baptism was a preparation for the true baptism in Jesus which would be with fire and the Holy Spirit. In John 1: 33-34, John the Baptist offers his testimony to Jesus when he says, "I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the holy Spirit.' Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God." As can be seen from this event, John the Baptist's assessment of his baptism of repentance versus the baptism of Jesus was accurate.



Through Paul, the Holy Spirit now completes the process that was begun in them and leads them to life in Jesus. Paul baptizes them in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when he lays hands on them, the Holy Spirit's power is unleashed in them. They experience a similar Outpouring of the Holy Spirit that the Apostles experienced at Pentecost, and Paul at his baptism in Damascus. Through Jesus, the Apostles begin to experience a profound transformation through the gift of the Holy Spirit. They move from hopelessness and despair to hope and joy, from anxiety and fear to peace and enthusiasm. Their horizons have been vastly expanded. Just as the Father sent Jesus to be the Savior of the world, in the same way, Jesus is sending them as His witnesses to the ends of the earth.



Two points are worthy of note in this resurrection event. Jesus, the Risen Lord, breathes the Holy Spirit into His Apostles. He breathes into them His own divine life through His Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit's power will be released in them after Jesus ascends to the Father. Only through the Holy Spirit, can God's life in Jesus be activated. Secondly, through the Holy Spirit, Jesus gives His Apostles the power to forgive and retain sin. In entering into covenant with us, God shared everything of Himself with us, including His power to forgive sin. Earlier, in the Upper Room before His death and resurrection, Jesus had given His Apostles (and their successors) the power to make Him present in His death and resurrection in the Eucharist. God took an amazing risk to allow humans to exercise this power in His name. Twenty centuries of chosen humans, our bishops and priests exercising this power in Jesus' name, has turned out to be an immense grace. God always knows best. As with Jesus, so with us, we will live and serve in the power and overshadowing of the Holy Spirit. Come Holy Spirit and enliven me with your wisdom and power!

Through such a cleansing and transformation, the disciple comes to know that Jesus is alive and truly Savior and Lord of the Universe! Salvation can only come to us with an honest admission of our hypocrisy and sin, without which the Holy Spirit cannot be recognized. When we move into desolation through our own fault, the Holy Spirit's voice will be disturbing but not condemning, calling us back to repentance and being right with God and ourselves. We will only experience peace when we listen to what the Holy Spirit is asking of us.

Desolation can also be present as purification. The saints tell us that the Holy Spirit needs to purify us, as left to ourselves, we will never be able to do an exhaustive clean-up of our sinful attachments and disorders. In the case of purification, one is not really in desolation. Sensible consolations (on the level of feelings and sentiments) will be absent, creating a sense of 'God's absence.' However, spiritual consolations, in the form of a yearning for God and a deeper commitment to Him in daily actions, will continue to be present and might even intensify during a state of purification.



During a time of purification, we are given the opportunity to strengthen and deepen our faith and trust in God. It is necessary to stick to one's resolutions that we made in time of consolation. The temptation will be to renege on them and adopt self-serving decisions in time of desolation.

During desolation, it is important to stick to the decisions one made in time of consolation. During desolation, it is important to remind ourselves that God has not abandoned us, and God's grace is still available to aid us in our struggle. Desolation is a time for extra prayer and taking stock of our spiritual life. It is a time for suitable penance and self-discipline. It is important to remember that consolation will return and the Holy Spirit will again be a lively and familiar Presence. Come Holy Spirit and enliven me with your wisdom and power!

When the nightly review is done sincerely and seriously, it leads to a strong desire to be in communion with God throughout the day. With practice and familiarity with the different traditions of the practice of the Presence of God, a disciple will develop a consistent awareness of God's presence and love throughout the day. Keeping this long-term benefit in mind, we can now go over the day to see how God has been present to us. With grateful hearts, we express our praise and amazement at God's immense love and compassion for us as His sons and daughters. We then do an examination of conscience, both Particular and General, to see how we have responded to God as disciples of Jesus. Have we been obedient to the guidance of the Holy Spirit? In what specific ways have we sinned? After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness, you can pray the Act of Contrition.
