



Basketball League (NBL) is formed, the first professional basketball league.

Basketball becomes an Olympic sport at the Berlin Olympics.



1949

The BAA merges with the NBL to form the National Basketball Association (NBA).



LeBron James establishes himself as one of the greatest players of all time, winning multiple championships with different teams.



1950s-60s

Wilt Chamberlain and Bill Russell dominate the NBA, becoming legendary players.



1990s Michael Jordan

leads the Chicago Bulls to six NBA championships.



2000s

Kobe Bryant and Shaquille O'Neal dominate the Los Angeles Lakers.



1976

The ABA and the NBA merges, strengthening the league.



1980s

Magic Johnson and Larry Bird become rivals and elevate the game.



1970s

The ABA (American Basketball Association) challenges the NBA's dominance.

Career Highlights

NBA CHAMPIONSHIPS: He has won four NBA championships, with the Miami Heat (2012, 2013) and the Cleveland Cavaliers (2016, 2020).

NBA FINALS MVP: LeBron has been named the NBA Finals MVP four times.

NBA MOST VALUABLE PLAYER (MVP): He has won four NBA MVP awards.

NBA ALL-STAR: LeBron has been selected to the NBA All-Star game 19 times.

ALL-NBA TEAMS: He has been named to the All-NBA First Team 18 times and the All-NBA Second Team twice.

ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAMS: LeBron has been selected to the All-Defensive First Team six times and the All-Defensive Second Team five times.

OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALS: He has won three Olympic gold medals with the United States men's national basketball team.



FREE-THROW LINE: Adult Male Friendship

At its core, this is a play about friendship. Over the course of 12 years, the friendship between Shawn and Matt develops, highlighting the challenges, complexity, and importance of friendship. secret ballots in the way we are generally accustomed to.

However, friendship is often elusive for adults - especially male-identifying adults.



"American men are stuck in what's been dubbed a friendship recession, with 20 percent of single men now saying they don't have any close friends, and more than half of all men report feeling unsatisfied with the size of their friend groups." (NPR)

"As young boys, they haven't yet felt the societal pressure to "be manly" and hide their feelings. But as they age, it often becomes harder for them to buck the stereotypes of how men are "supposed" to act. And those stereotypes include not showing emotion and not depending on others—both of which can be interpreted as weaknesses." (Newport Institute)



So how do you make friends?

Below are some tools that experts suggest.

- 1. **Join a club**. Being around the same people regularly can help you make friends.
- 2. **Embrace your interests.** Go out and do the things you like to do in the world. Meet people who have similar interests.
- 3. **Start a conversation**. Being brave and just striking up a conversation is always the first step.
- 4. **Be a good friend**. Doing favors and being genuinely interested in others helps you know more about them.
- 5. Go out into the world. Staying home means there are no chances to make new friends.
- 6. Rejection is ok! Often we are afraid of someone might reject us, so we don't put ourselves out there. It's scary. But chances are, the other person is just as nervous as you.
- 7. Embrace your heritage. Sometimes cultural groups can be a place to find new friends that have similar backgrounds to you.






Early Years and Segregation

1950: The NBA integrated for the first time with the signing of Chuck Cooper, Nat "Sweetwater" Clifton, and Earl Lloyd.



1960S: The league saw a significant increase in the number of Black players, and they began to dominate the game. Players like Bill Russell and Wilt Chamberlain became icons of the sport.



The Civil Rights Era and Beyond

1960S AND **1970S**: The NBA was a microcosm of the broader societal changes taking place during the Civil Rights Movement. Players like Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Julius Erving used their platforms to speak out against racial injustice.

1980S AND **1990S**: The NBA continued to evolve, with players like Magic Johnson and Michael Jordan becoming global superstars. However, the league also faced challenges, including the drug-related controversies of the 1980s.

21ST CENTURY: The NBA has become increasingly diverse, with players from all over the world competing at the highest level. However, issues of race and equality continue to be relevant.
