QUARANTINE: Your Inbox's First Line of Defense

Can't find an email you were waiting on? The Information Technology Department provides a service that helps protect the City from unwanted or harmful emails. Sometimes, legitimate emails may be held in "quarantine" instead of being delivered to your inbox. You can review and release any messages you recognize as safe through summary reports that you're emailed twice a day, or you can check your quarantine inbox anytime by visiting https://roundrocktexas-gov.fortimailcloud.com and signing in with your work email address using Single Sign-On.

SAFETY TIP OF THE MONTH: Best Practices for Preventing Workplace Eye Injuries

Protect your eyes; they are irreplaceable! There are 65,000 work-related eye injuries in the U.S. each year, yet 90% of them can be easily prevented. The following tips can help keep your eyes safe at work:

- · Use the appropriate glasses for the job
- Prescription eye glasses and contacts do not protect your eyes
- Operational employees with a prescription should take advantage of the City's safety glasses policy
- Standard safety glasses with side shields are fine for dust, dirt and most flying debris
- · Goggles/face shields must be used when handling chemicals
