WHAT ARE YOU READING?

Here's how you can tell them!

STEP 1: REGISTER!

Registration is super simple! Go to www.hursttx.gov/SRC or download the **Beanstack** app onto your mobile device.

STEP 2: READ!

If you're reading (or listening), it counts! Books, audiobooks, comics, magazines, emails, even websites! Reading together? Count it for everyone involved! TV captions? Don't push it...

STEP 3: TRACK & LOG!

Record the minutes you read between **May 16 and July 31** in **Beanstack** or through www.hursttx.gov/SRC.

STEP 4: PICK UP PRIZES!

From the first week of June through the first week of August, come into the Library to pick up prizes earned!

All prizes are available while supplies last and may not be sold, traded, or otherwise used by participants for financial gain.
Prizes must be picked up by **Monday, August 31, at 6 p.m.**
No prizes will be available after this time.

GRAND PRIZE TICKETS



Once you reach 2,000 reading minutes, the fun keeps going! For every additional 500 minutes you read, you'll earn one Grand Prize ticket to enter into a drawing for a chance to win an awesome prize. The more you read, the more chances you have to win!

HERE'S HOW TO ENTER:

- Pick up your Grand Prize tickets at the Youth or Info Desk.
- Visit the Historical Gallery windows to browse the available Grand Prize options.
- Fill out your tickets with the prize you'd most like to win.
- Return your completed tickets to the Youth or Info Desk to enter into the drawings.

You can enter your tickets in as many prize drawings as you like, or you can enter all your tickets in the same prize drawing to increase your chances of winning!

Reading prizes end at 7,500 minutes, but Grand Prize tickets continue beyond that—so keep reading all summer long to earn even more entry tickets.

Tips and Tricks!



CHALLENGE YOURSELF!

Start with a low-pressure goal, like 10 pages or 10 minutes—you'll likely keep going!

Avoid “decision fatigue” by picking your next read from a jar of pre-written titles!

Flex your reading muscles with some sprints. Keep an eye on our social media for virtual sprints with HPL staff all summer long! Set a timer for 20 minutes and see how many pages you can read.

MAKE IT SOCIAL!

Read together with a friend, join a book club, or make it a family affair. Reading aloud to kids or pets is a great way to stack up everyone's minutes at once and practice those literacy skills for growing readers.

If you're stuck, ask a librarian! Helping you find your next favorite story is genuinely one of our favorite things to do!

THINK OUTSIDE THE BOOK!

Don't limit yourself to just books. Graphic novels, audiobooks, magazines, and online articles all count! Even reading technical manuals at work or recipes counts toward those minutes.

Make sure you check out Libby and CloudLibrary. We have thousands of titles available online 24/7, so you never have to worry about the Library being closed.

GO EXPLORING!

Packing your bags? Grab a travel guide or a novel set in your destination to get into the spirit of your trip.

Use the summer to explore a genre you've never tried before. If you usually read thrillers, try a cozy romance or a biography to shake things up.

In a reading slump? Use the 2026 HPL Annual Reading Challenge to help find something special you might otherwise skip. Plus, you get to log reading for BOTH challenges!

MAXIMIZE YOUR MINUTES!

Re-read an old favorite: Fast, comforting, and great for momentum.

Use the “Wait Time” Strategy: Keep digital books ready for long lines and waiting rooms.

The 50-Page Rule: Don't waste time on books you don't enjoy—ditch them! Pick books that hold your interest.

Habit Stacking: Pair audiobooks with chores like laundry or listen on your commute.

No Distractions: Leave your phone in another room, so you can focus entirely on your book.

Get in the Zone: Create a dedicated space to help you get into the zone quickly.

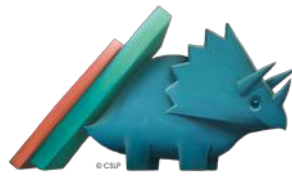
