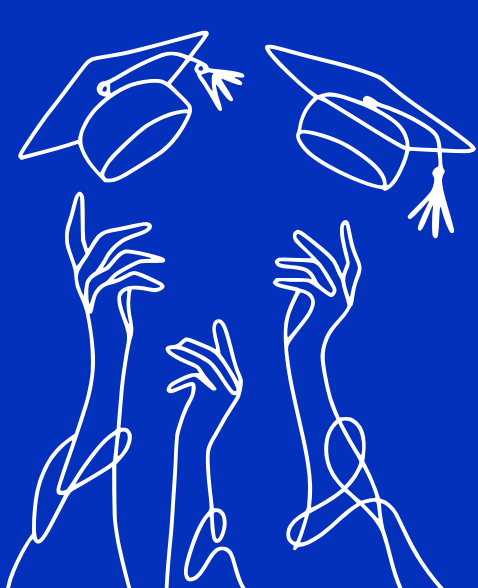

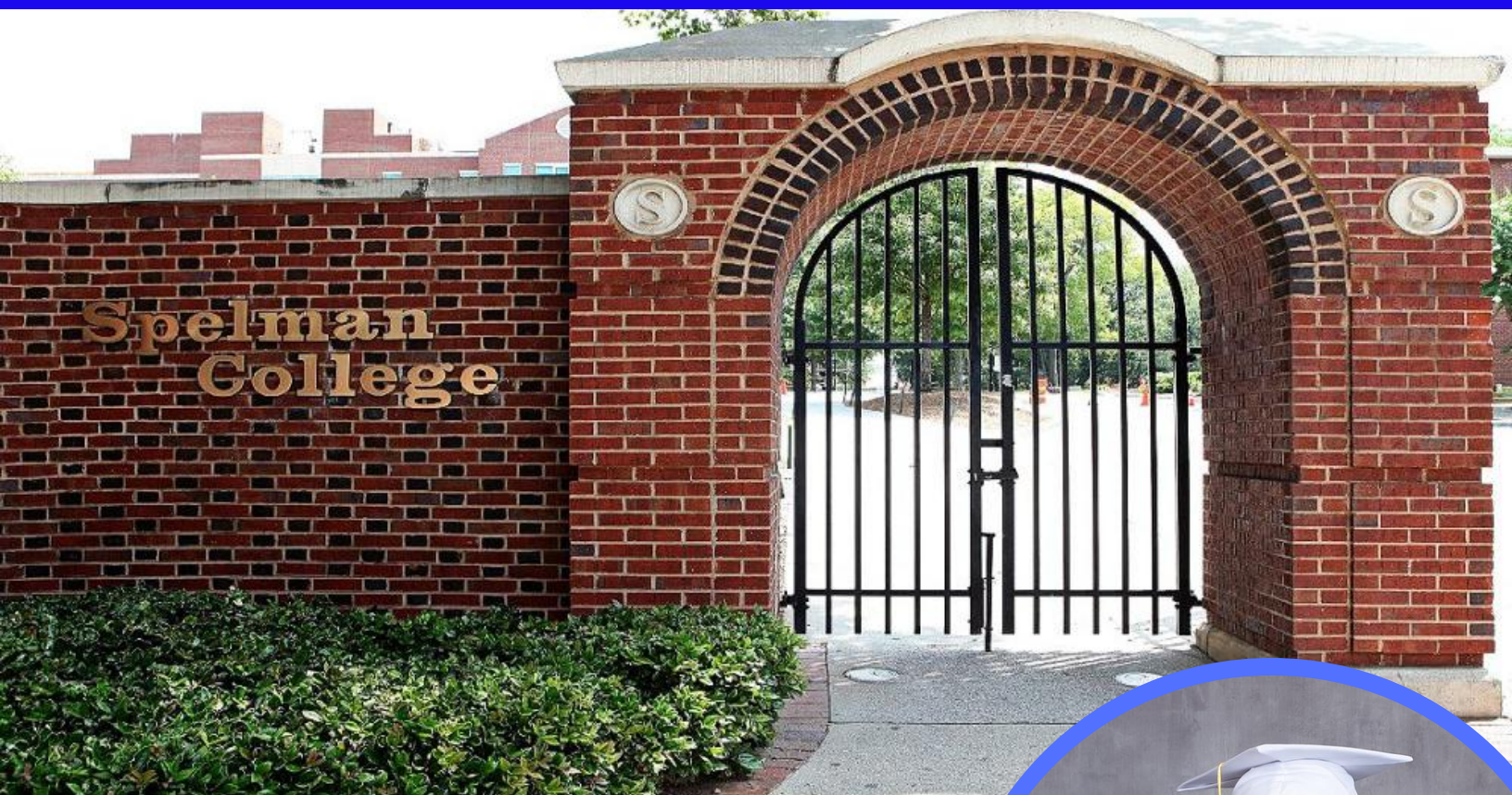

CHLOE BAIRD

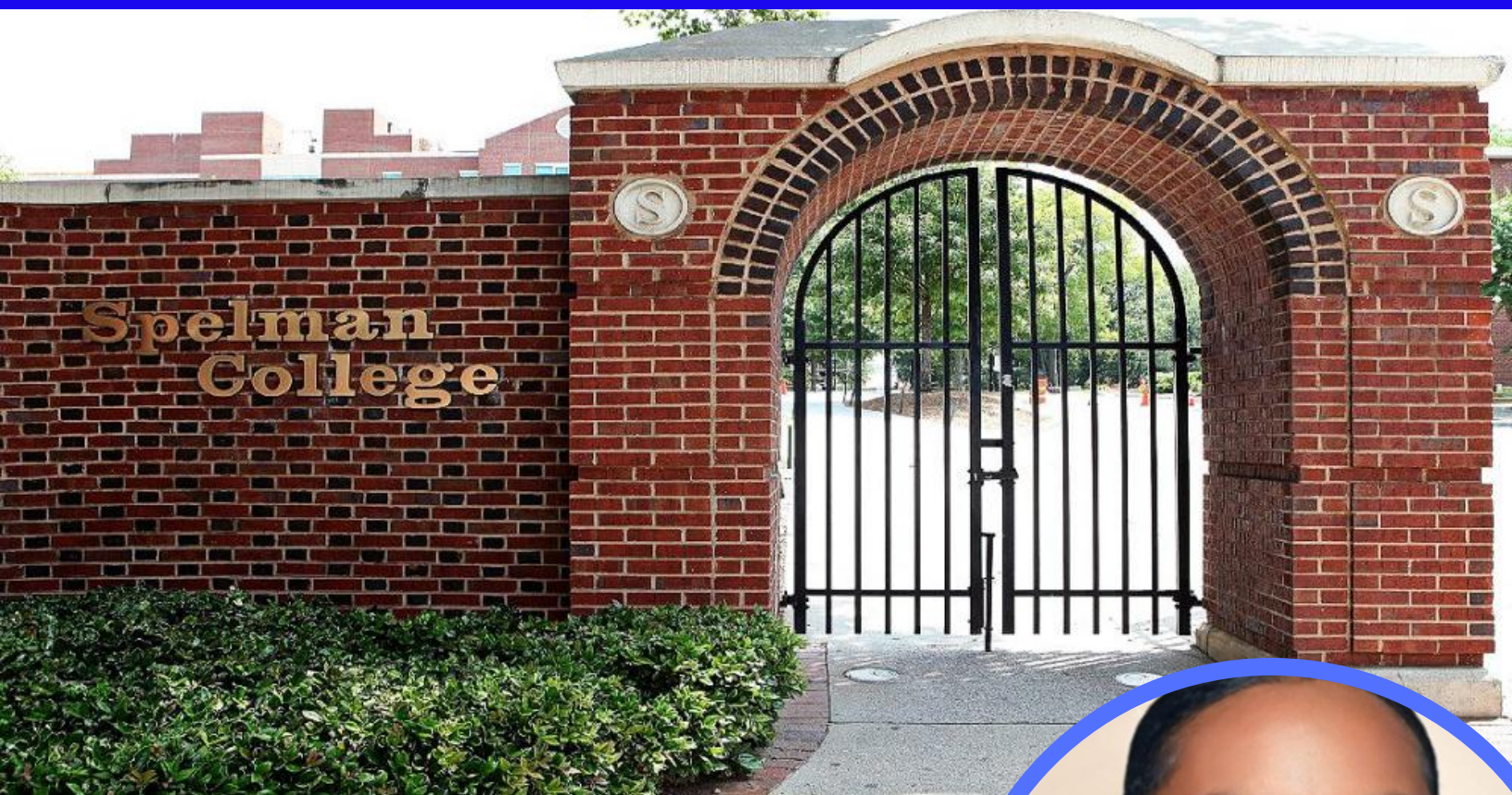

DAKOTA FRIERSON

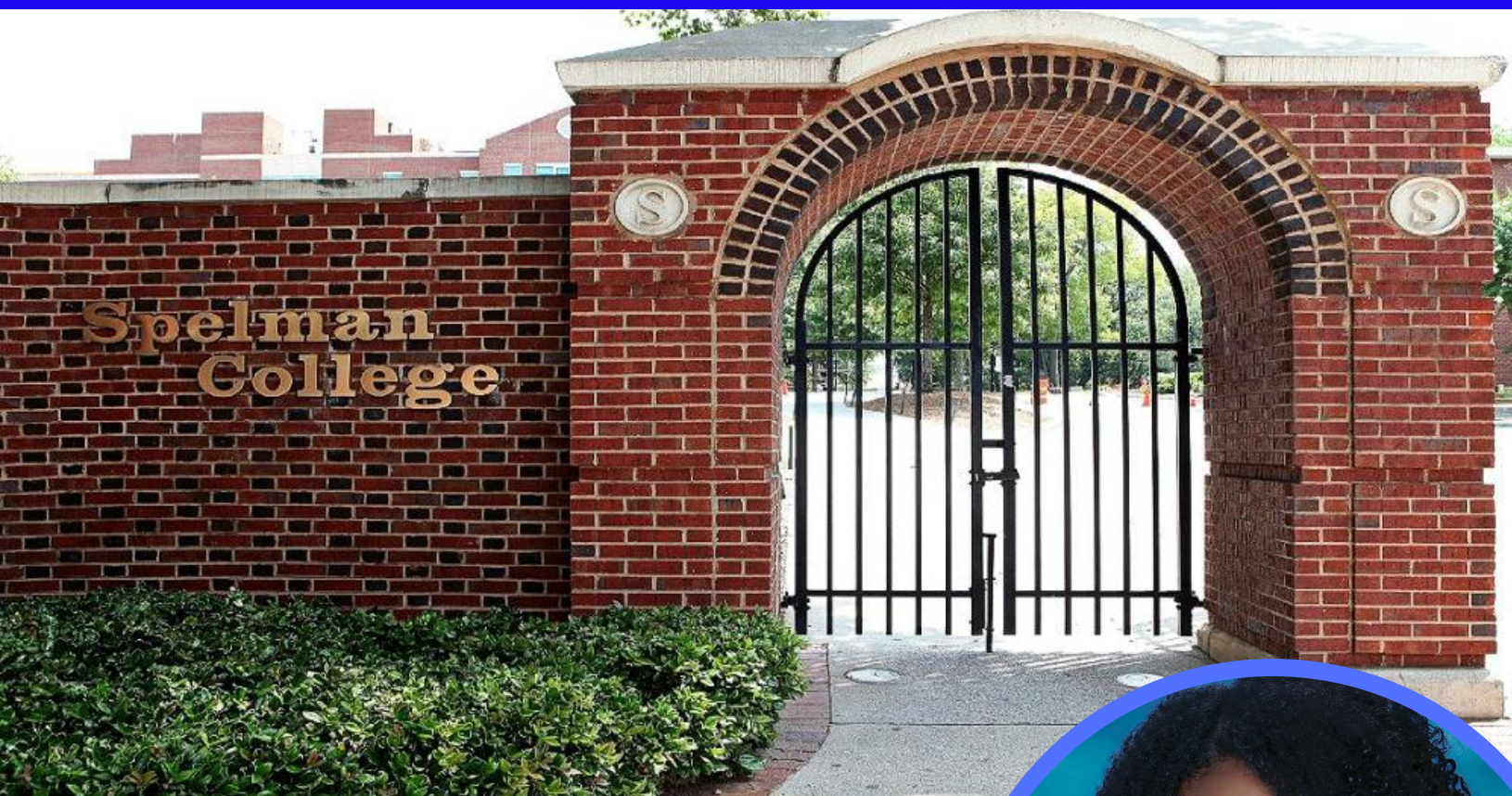

The Archonette Club of the Omicron Rho Zeta Chapter (OPZ) of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, proudly uplifts young women across the Inglewood community by cultivating leadership, academic excellence, and a deep commitment to service. Established as part of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated's national youth auxiliary initiative launched in the 1950s, the Archonette program was designed to mentor and empower young women during their formative years, and OPZ has been actively working with the Archonette Club since 1993, building a strong and enduring foundation of mentorship and impact. In 2023, OPZ's Archonettes celebrated their 30th anniversary, marking three decades of meaningful service and influence in the Inglewood community.

Through intentional mentorship and a structured curriculum centered on cultural awareness, social skills enhancement, educational enrichment, leadership development, and community service, Archonettes gain the tools and confidence to thrive academically and personally while preparing for college, careers, and lifelong impact. Throughout the year, they participate in dynamic programming including college and career readiness panels, scholarship guidance, and resume development workshops, all designed to position them for future success. Their commitment to service is equally strong, leading donation drives, fundraising, and participating in community initiatives that support families and individuals throughout Inglewood and the greater Los Angeles area.

The impact of the program is reflected in its growing legacy, with five former Inglewood Archonettes continuing the sisterhood, growing from Girls to Pearls, by becoming initiated members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated: Xitalitl Escobedo, initiated Fall 2023 at the Nu Mu Chapter at San Francisco State University; Angela Carlos and Nerissa Woodard, both initiated Spring 2023 at the Delta Eta Chapter at California State University, Long Beach; legacy Jazmine Choyce, initiated Spring 2024 at the Nu Lambda Chapter at the University of California, Los Angeles; and Jazmin Medina, initiated Fall 2025 at the Delta Eta Chapter at California State University, Long Beach. Members of OPZ stay closely connected to past and current Archonettes by continuing to mentor and guide them on their path into womanhood.

The Legacy ContinueZ

First chartered in Spring 1974, the Nu Epsilon Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, holds a proud and enduring legacy at Loyola Marymount University and within the greater Los Angeles collegiate community. As the first National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) sorority established on LMU's campus, Nu Epsilon has long stood as a beacon of Scholarship, Service, Sisterhood, and Finer Womanhood.

The chapter's six charter members—Gail Mitchell, Cheryl Mize, Renee Carpenter, Brenda Atkins, Linda Coleman, and Edwina Beebe—laid a strong foundation rooted in vision and purpose. Their commitment to service and sisterhood quickly established Nu Epsilon as an influential campus presence. Early initiatives included the Black History Festival, student-centered workshops, and guest speaker events. Members also made a meaningful impact through community service efforts such as the Special Olympics, the Campus Beautification Project, and tutoring programs—each reflecting Zeta's guiding principles.

After 42 years of dormancy, the chapter entered a new era. On May 4, 2025, Nu Epsilon was officially reactivated and rechartered by the Inglewood Zetas, with support from the UCLA Zetas and under the guidance of Danielle Munguia. This milestone marked a bold continuation of its legacy. The reactivation was led by two exceptional young women, Lindsey Groom and Brooklynn Carter.

The chapter continues to grow, welcoming a new initiate, Tosin Oladoku, in 2026. Today, Brooklynn and Tosin are focused on expanding Nu Epsilon's presence through programs such as Holiday Toy Drive, Cookies & Cram, Paint and Sip, Community Garden Clean-Up, and Tea with Z. They also collaborate with the LMU Sigmas on campus initiatives and partner with the Inglewood Zetas on community efforts like Healing and Hope for the Homeless.

ZETA AMICAE OF INGLEWOOD

Dedicated to Friendship & Service

Since 1940, chapters of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated, have recognized the contributions of women who chose a different educational path than college. Many served in organized auxiliaries, but their place in the sisterhood was formalized when National President Lullelia Harrison recommended in her 1948 Boule' report that chapters be allowed to form Zeta "Amicae" (Friends of Zeta) auxiliaries. The Amicae auxiliary offers professional women the opportunity to affiliate with Zeta and advance the sorority's mission of meaningful, far-reaching community service nationally and internationally.

Chartered on August 5, 1997, the Zeta Amicae of Inglewood Auxiliary was founded with a spirit of service, sisterhood, and celebration. On that day, eight visionary women, Hope Flood, Jamie West, Jennifer Lofin, Norma Bullock, Pamela Jones, Prudence Richardson, Regina Hawkins, and Sheri Tarvin, became its pioneering charter members, creating a legacy rooted in purpose and connection. The inaugural induction ceremony, held at Sheri Tarvin's home in Los Angeles, marked the start of a vibrant friendship.

Sponsored by the Omicron Rho Zeta Chapter of Inglewood and guided by Sheryl Underwood, Sonja Wilson, Sharis Rivers, Trena Hope, Peggy Whyte, and Gia Neil, the auxiliary quickly found its rhythm. Its first leadership, Jamie West (President), Jennifer Lofin (Vice President), Norma Bullock (Secretary), Prudence Richardson (Sergeant-at-Arms), and Regina Hawkins (Chaplain), set a tone of growth, excellence, and enduring friendship.

After a period of dormancy, the Zeta Amicae of Inglewood rechartered in 2011 with renewed energy and has continued to flourish. In 2015, the auxiliary committed to supporting March of Dimes, a partnership that continues to this day. They have also championed St. Jude Hospital and Healing 4 Hope's community food program since 2022, bringing compassion and service to the forefront. In 2026, the Zeta Amicae hosted their first joint informational with other Southern California auxiliaries and launched their inaugural Junior College Book Scholarship in honor of Amica Bridge Morgan Harris (d. 2025), whose legacy continues to inspire.

Today, the Amicae of Inglewood remain steadfast partners with the Inglewood Zetas, promoting public relations, supporting community initiatives, and fostering sisterhood through new member programs and bonding activities such as perfume making, casino trips, and Chili's fundraisers. New programs are creating platforms for young voices, while scholarship initiatives continue to open doors for the next generation. Every effort reflects how far BHF has come and where it is headed next.

From its start in 2021 to the momentum of today, Blue Haven Foundation has grown with purpose every step of the way. The mission remains the same, but the impact continues to rise, creating a future filled with opportunity, connection, and possibility.
