Vocational

If you're aged between 16-18 years old you will have a study programme specifically tailored to meet your educational needs and career aspirations. It consists of your main chosen course as well as further development of maths, English and employability skills.

A Levels

If you're looking to study A Levels, our Ludlow Sixth Form College provides an excellent choice of A Level subjects. Students often progress on to higher education and secure places at Russell Group universities.

Apprenticeships

We currently offer a variety of different apprenticeship subjects and routes ranging from Level 2 qualifications right up to Degree Level. This route allows you to combine work and study through on-the-job training with classroom learning.

T Levels

These courses offer you a mixture of classroom learning with workplace experience. During the course you will put your skills and knowledge into practice during an industry placement of 315 hours.

GCSE's

This is a one-year GCSE course designed for students wishing to develop their maths and/or English skills and improve their grades. Students will require a grade 4 (grade C) in both subjects to progress to any A Level course or Level 3 Vocational course.

The course will help you to improve on the areas you find the most difficult, building your confidence as well as your understanding and skills. For students who do need to re-sit either (or both) GCSE maths or English, it will be accommodated into your programme of study, as day and evening classes are available.



Getting to College.

Walford College is located in the small village of Baschurch, Shropshire.

Travelling by bus? Walford College offers subsidised travel on all bus routes. Travel remains free on all routes where students are eligible for a travel bursary with a household income of £30,000 or under. Alternatively, to spread the cost, payment plans and termly passes are available.

Travelling by car? Walford College operates a free parking permit system for students and staff. Students can park in any of the allocated car parks on site. To use the car park you must apply for a parking permit, which is then displayed on your windscreen.

We also have a bike parking shelter available so you can securly lock your bike during the day.

Students aged 16 to 18 who have an SY or TF9 postcode can purchase a travel pass directly from Shropshire Council.







Student Accommodation

Our Residential accommodation is a key element of College life and is fully compliant with National Minimum Standards (NMS) for residential accommodation in colleges. Our residential students achieve well and our aim for residential students is to provide them with a safe, friendly and positive environment that enhances their opportunity for academic success and develops their life skills, confidence and sense of responsibility. We want our students to feel comfortable and well looked after. We want them to develop positive relationships and experiences.

All under 18 students are accommodated on the main college campus, where students are supported by high standards of welfare and safeguarding through a designated team of residential accommodation officers and other cross college departments. All rooms are single occupancy.

Equestrian Centre

At our Equestrian Centre we have stabling for 30 horses in our American barn and n'ew wooden stable block. Each yard has allocated wash down areas with warm water and a solarium on the main yard. The main yard is used for the horses who come to us on loan for the students to use whereas the wooden yard is for liveries and some stables are kept for the use of students' own horses whilst they are on their weeks duties.

We also have 13 acres of grazing land and two sandpit turnout pens. There are two arenas both 60m x 30m, one indoor and one outdoor. The indoor arena features a full set of mirrors, seating gallery and Wi-Fi access. If students have their horses here for their duty week then they may use the arenas and jumps in their free sessions. We can also ride out the back of the farm and access the local area for students to hack out the horses under supervision of staff.

Animal Care Centre

The Animal Care Centre has specialist facilities to cater for over 80 different species, including meerkats, snakes, birds of prey, alpacas, rats, kookaburras and bearded dragons. Practical workshops are held within the animal care centre where students learn the professional skills necessary to understand the behaviours and enhance welfare of a broad collection of animals, from domestic pets to exotic birds and reptiles.







Motor Vehicle Centre

The motor vehicle workshop at Walford College is comprised of three sections. The main workshop has fantastic equipment for the students to learn with including a Lazer 4 Wheel alignment, run-flat tyre removal facilities, wheel balancing equipment, two and four post vehicle ramps, trolley jacks and axle stands, a battery charging and testing area, soldering stations and exhaust extraction systems to enable engine running with doors down.

The Level 3 workshop has full vehicle diagnostic facilities for electronic systems management and assessment. Air conditioning courses are run within this workshop for Level 3 and Apprentices and manual and automatic transmissions are explained and assessed at this level.

We will work with the Local Authority to make sure we can provide the right support for your needs and then secure funding so we can put this in place. Without this funding, you may not be able to access a specific level of support. Transition support will be available for all EHCP students.

Our Student Support team will then ensure you have the right support in place when you start and throughout your studies and will co-ordinate annual EHCP reviews.

Transition to college life

Preparing for adulthood and starting at Walford College might be a bit of a worry, so in addition to our usual open events, you can request a guided tour to come and look around the college campus and ask any questions you may have about the college.

Over 19?

Tuition fees will vary. But you may be eligable for free tuition. As everyone has individual circumstances the best way to work out the fees relevant to you is to call and speak to us.

Looking to study Level 3, 4, 5 or 6?

Advanced Learner Loans from the UK government can cover your course fees providing your course qualifies.

Transport

We offer subsidised travel on all routes for the 26/27 academic year. Costs are based on how far you have to travel from your home to the College. Visit our website for up to date costs.

Walford College Farm

The farm is an autumn block calving dairy farm. We currently milk 250 cows over a large grazing platform. Our cows are housed in winter months and graze for 9-10 months a year. We calve the herd in a tight 12 week block and rear all our own replacements.

The farm has had significant investment in infrastructure over the last few years to improve facilities for staff and students. We also have access to a small sheep flock that are kept at Walford to give students experience of handling and looking after sheep in general.

My role as Walford Farm Manager is to be responsible for the running of the farm for staff and students. I'm a hands-on farm manager and help the team out with all tasks on a daily basis. I rear all the young stock during the calving period and oversee the running of the dairy herd. I'm responsible for financial decisions and all decision making of the farm. I meet with external specialists including consultants, vets and nutritionists and represent the college farm at national conferences discussing our journey so far.


