- ★★★★★ **Great:** uniformly good wines, but they may be brooding when young.
- ★★★★★ **Very good:** conditions may not have been perfect, but the wines may be better value.
- ★★★★ **Good:** more variability in style, but better producers will have made some super wines.
- ★★★ **Useful:** usually less concentrated, but well selected wines will have immediate charm.
- ★ **Poor:** modern techniques have made such years less of a problem in recent times.

Claret

The **2025** vintage was harvested around ten days earlier than average. Just enough rain fell in July for the vineyards not to suffer during the August heatwaves. Quality is very good, thick skins meant plenty of colour, with care taken in the winery not to over-extract the tannins. They are similar to **2022** but with more freshness. A lighter, fresher style is to be found from the **2024** vintage following a year that required extensive work in the vineyard to bring in ripe, clean fruit. The **2023** vintage is good, but the yields are down, some warm damp weather in summer means the Cabernets have outperformed the more delicate Merlot. The wines of **2022** are excellent showing a lovely balance of ripeness and juiciness that give them great poise. The **2021** vintage has made wines that are medium-bodied with good freshness, in a similar style to 2017. The **2020** vintage yielded wines that are aromatic and concentrated, quite big in structure with freshness and balance. The wines of **2019** are very concentrated, fresh, ripe and plentiful; all in all a very well-regarded vintage.

Red Burgundy

2025 is a somewhat heterogeneous picture for yields, the end result is extremely low but more than in 2024. Quality seems to be very good for the reds. A cool and wet 2024 season reduced yields, but diligent growers produced some promising results albeit in small quantities. A hot growing season in 2023 meant sorting was required when the grapes came in to avoid any raisined fruit, but the results are very good and in decent quantity. The region basked under the summer sun in 2022, and thanks to cool nights, the wines have avoided excess alcohol while retaining elegance. The 2021 vintage was severely affected by frost in the spring which means yields are historically low, the wines are fresh and juicy. 2020 was one of the earliest vintages on record following a warm summer but the wines have an appealing freshness too, like a combination of the previous two vintages. There was an absence of frost in 2019, but yields were still restricted, this time by drought, the resulting wines have great richness and concentration.

Rhône Red

A mild winter and spring in 2025 saw an early start to the growing season, summer continued in the same vein. In common with other regions the yields are small. The harvest was historically early with many starting mid-August and some finishing before September. The quality is good with concentrated fruit and structure but with freshness and moderate alcohol levels. The 2024 vintage required a lot of work in the vineyard but those that persevered have produced some very promising looking wines albeit in small quantities. 2023 was also a very good vintage, with the Southern Rhône having an easier time of things but the results from both are showing great character. The North and South of the region both excelled in the hot conditions of 2022. The 2021 vintage has seen some good results particularly in the North where attractive, aromatic, elegant wines have been made, albeit lighter in style. The wines from the 2020 vintage are a little fresher and more approachable earlier than those of 2019 which is a high-quality vintage with yields on a par with 2018.

Italy

2025 looks good across the country following a wet winter, mild spring and a largely benevolent summer. Italy is one country that had decent yields too, particularly in the south putting Italy back on top spot as the world's biggest producer. Opposing problems, in the North (too wet) and in the South (too dry), have delivered a modest harvest for **2024**, larger than **2023** but still below average, of good quality, fresher in style than of late and harvested later. The **2023** vintage proved complicated, good in Barolo but trickier in Tuscany and southern regions, resulting in one of the smallest vintages of recent years. A dry winter followed by a hot summer certainly affected yields in **2022**, but the quality is excellent across the country. Small but perfectly formed seems to sum up the **2021** vintage here in Italy. Across most of the country the **2020** vintage is very good indeed with ripe fruit and lovely aromatics. A classic if not straight forward vintage, **2019** has delivered some excellent wines but in smaller quantities.

Spain

A very good harvest across Spain in **2025** but with some regions, notably Rioja, having the smallest production this century. A small vintage in **2024** following a tricky growing season that, on the plus side, saw many regions come out of drought, but disease pressures have meant yields are small, just a little ahead of the tiny **2023** vintage. The wines of **2023** are in short supply but good quality, while those of **2022** – a hot, dry year – are excellent and concentrated. The **2021** vintage is very good after a warm dry season with wines showing good concentration and aromatics. A wet first half of the **2020** vintage meant a lot of work in the vineyard was needed but a better, more consistent second half resulted in some juicy young wines, while those ageing in barrel are excellent. A very good year, **2019** had warm, dry conditions but yields were limited by a tricky flowering period.

Port

2025 was a trying vintage with extreme heat, with three months of drought culminating in 10 days over 40°C in August. However, the second half of August and early September saw a marked cooling which provided near perfect conditions for the grapes to mature. Some are reporting the smallest harvest in 40 years but plenty of praise for the quality. **2024** has been generally declared, this being the first general declaration since 2017. The wines are wonderfully elegant reflecting the slightly cooler growing season, they show a rare delicacy and freshness and will drink well in their youth, but also have the capacity to age for decades. A classic vintage! The weather pattern in **2023**, fresher and less extreme than **2022** which was baking hot, suggests there could be an interesting comparison to come. In **2021** a small amount of top Single Quinta wines were produced but not a full declaration. There was plenty of beneficial rainfall early in **2020** but also plenty of heat which has given exceptionally low yields. What there is, is deeply concentrated and very like 2009 in style. **2019** was a very dry, but not hot, vintage which has given some characterful wines with great elegance; some excellent single quintas have been made.

Champagne

The **2025** vintage looks promising in Champagne with the region walking the tightrope between ripeness and freshness. A cooler year, **2024** has made some promising wines with Chardonnay doing particularly well, after a tricky growing season across the region. **2023** was a complicated but abundant year with Chardonnay and Pinot Noir on the best sites performing well. Yields needed to be managed, and some were picked too early during a warm harvest period. **2022** was another warm vintage with decent yields and as a result, an early harvest with clean fruit and good potential. By comparison **2021** – on paper at least – looks like a litany of woes but as so often in this region, out of hardship comes reward with some very classic wines being produced. **2020** also looks like it has the potential for great wines, but in a riper style following a warm year and a very early harvest, a year for Pinot-dominated wines to excel. Another challenging vintage in the vineyards that has given some very positive results, **2019** saw heatwaves and hailstorms reduce yields but with good fruit delivered at harvest.

White Burgundy

2025 is a somewhat heterogeneous picture in terms of yields, the end result is historically low in quantity but more than in **2024**. Quality seems to be very good for the whites. Very good results for **2024** in terms of quality see a fresher feel to the wines and slightly lower alcohol, but at the price of quantity, with Chablis particularly affected. With hot dry weather for the vintage, **2023** is excellent with a good quantity, stylistically similar to its predecessor. A warm season but with cooler nights, **2022** brought both excellent quality and, importantly, a decent quantity. The **2021** vintage was heavily affected by frost meaning quantities were well down though the quality is very good. **2020** was historically early and regarded as a great vintage. **2019** is a worthy successor to the excellent 2018s and low yields have given very concentrated wines.

Bordeaux Dry White

A warm vintage has given rise to some deliciously opulent dry whites in **2025** with an early harvest date to preserve freshness. The generally cooler conditions of the **2024** vintage has seen some super results in Bordeaux with the whites outperforming the reds this year. Similarly **2023** produced some super whites, with the extra freshness and lovely aromatics balancing ripe fruit perfectly. **2022** was a warm vintage leading to a record early harvest start in the first weeks of August giving opulent, aromatic wines. The cool conditions of the **2021** season favoured the whites, giving the wines vibrancy and wonderful aromatics. By contrast the **2020** vintage was hot but careful vineyard management and early picking has delivered concentrated crisp wines from this low-yielding vintage. Something of a Goldilocks vintage, **2019** was hot at times and cool at others with beneficial rains giving the perfect balance of ripe fruit and crisp refreshing acidity.

Germany

2025 is generally regarded as a successful vintage though rain during harvest made life tricky at the end of the season. The weather continued warm and sunny through the summer and an early harvest starting 8th September with Pinot Noir followed by Riesling for Kabinett wines. The results are good with excellent quality, likened to 2005 and 2022. All styles including some Trockenbeerenauslesen were made. A rollercoaster of a ride in **2024** saw frost reduce yields initially, then a yo-yo of wet and warm weather meant much work in the vineyards to combat disease was required. A small harvest of excellent quality has been reported, mostly at Kabinett level. A tricky **2023** vintage where the dedication of the grower had a big impact, the resultant wines are very good for those that did the graft. The warmest year on record, **2022** produced some super results. The wines of **2021** are lighter in style and more aromatic with evident acidity compared with the previous two vintages. **2020** saw a warm summer, giving ripeness, while a prolonged harvest gave freshness and perfect quality fruit. The **2019s** show wonderful rapier-like style, good weight and depth; yields are lower than the generous 2018 vintage.

Sauternes & Barsac

The warmth of the **2025** vintage was broken in September by some rains which saw the early onset of noble rot. The resulting wines have great depth and concentration. The **2024** vintage is much lighter and fresher in style with the wines showing more vibrancy and racy acidity. In contrast, **2023** was a vintage with richness in the wines but with plenty of acidity bringing balance. **2022** was very similar to 2023 but a little richer. The cooler **2021** vintage has delivered some super wines but in tiny quantities. They have lovely balance and purity with good botrytis character. The **2020** vintage was hot and dry producing wines concentrated by the sun rather than botrytis which arrived very late in the season, as it did the previous two years in **2019** and 2018, both of which produced some decent wines, but the growers required nerves of steel to wait for botrytis to arrive.

Loire Sweet

2025 was a year in which heat and hail played a part in the story, keeping yields low and concentration high while some beneficial rain in August helped maintain freshness. It looks set to be a promising year for sweet wines. The weather was challenging in 2024 with much work required in the vineyard to avoid mildew. The results show good freshness and some balanced sweetness but lacking the intensity of a great year. While 2023 was almost an embarrassment of riches with yields potentially huge if not kept in check by careful vineyard management. Those who did and sorted heavily in the winery (a year they could afford to be ruthless!) were rewarded with some very good results. The conditions of 2022 proved excellent for sweet wine production with a hot dry summer broken in September by some rain that helped noble rot to develop; the results are superb. The complicated conditions experienced in 2021 led to some exceptional sweet wines, the cooler conditions bringing natural freshness into the wines which balances the concentration brought by botrytis and much improved weather late in the season. 2020 gave small yields of very concentrated wines following a hot dry season, but the results are very good with nice balance and some botrytis character amongst almost tropical fruit. The conditions in 2019 just didn't suit the production of sweet wines with few being produced.
