EMPOWERING GIRLS



- With clean hands hold the base of the tampon between the index finger and the thumb.
- Insert the tampon into the vagina.
- Push the tampon inside, gently, with the middle finger while leaving the string hanging out of the vagina.
- Remove the finger while leaving the string of the tampon hanging out of the vagina, to be used later during the removal process.
- A tampon should not be left inside the vagina for more than 6 hours because leaving a tampon inside for a prolonged time can cause a rare but potentially fatal illness called Toxic Shock Syndrome (TSS). After use, tampon is pulled out by the string of the tampon which is left hanging out of the vagina.

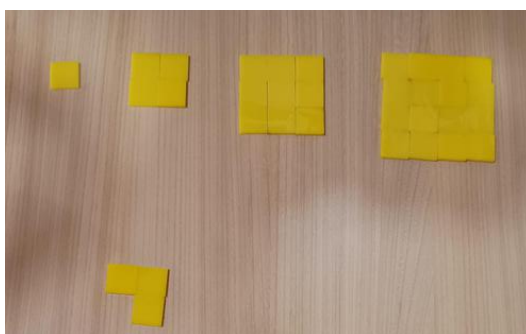
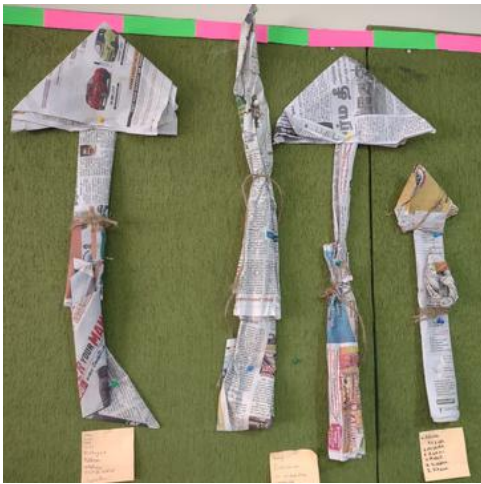
With captivating melodies and interactive activities, they embarked on an exploration of anatomical components, turning education into a thrilling journey of entertainment and significance.

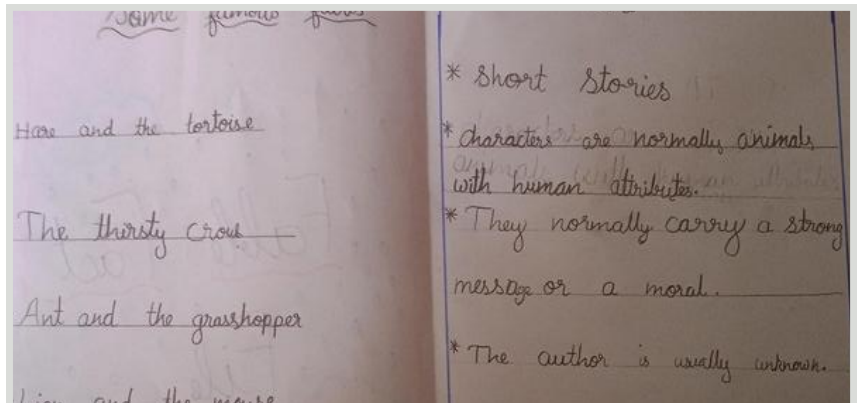
UNIT OF INQUIRY

In the realm of Information and Communication Technology (ICT), learners of grade 5 were introduced to the concept of flowchart and their importance in programming. They were motivated to design their own flowchart, displaying their creativity while addressing real-life challenges.

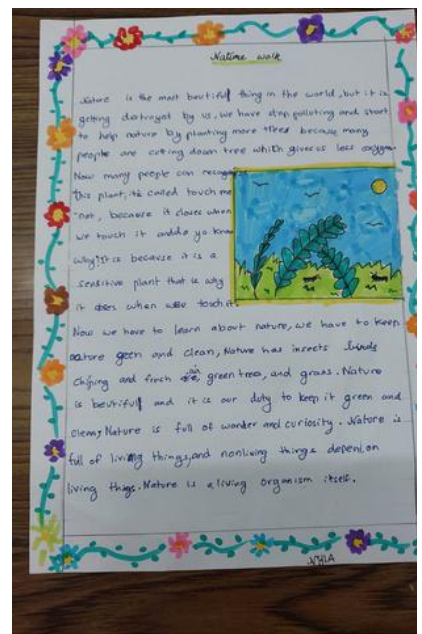

In Biology, they explored the process of diffusion and gas exchange in humans. They were also engaged in a debate, articulating their perspectives on the role of the state government within society. 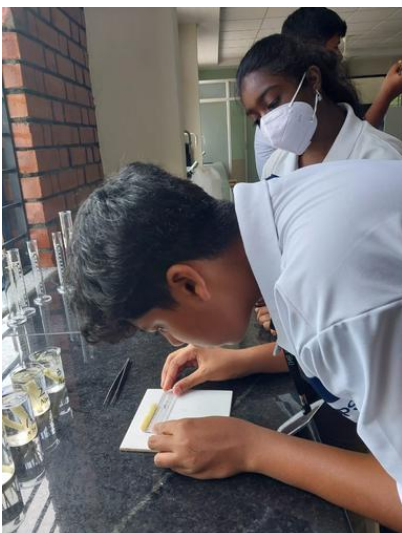
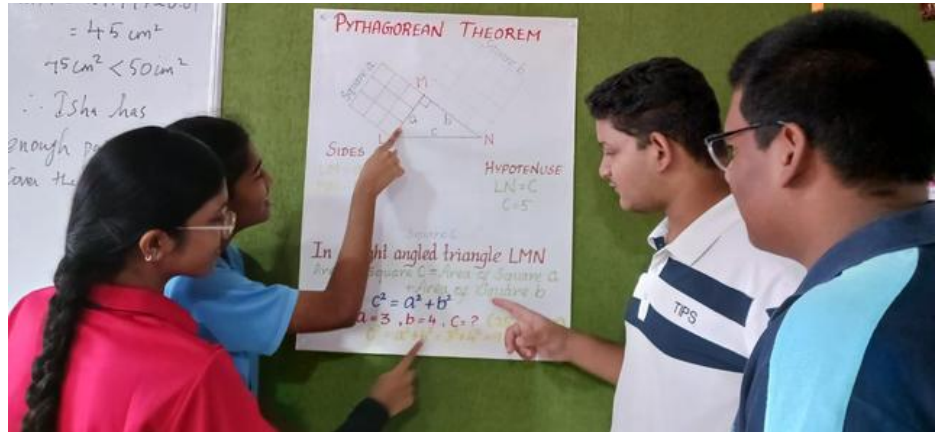
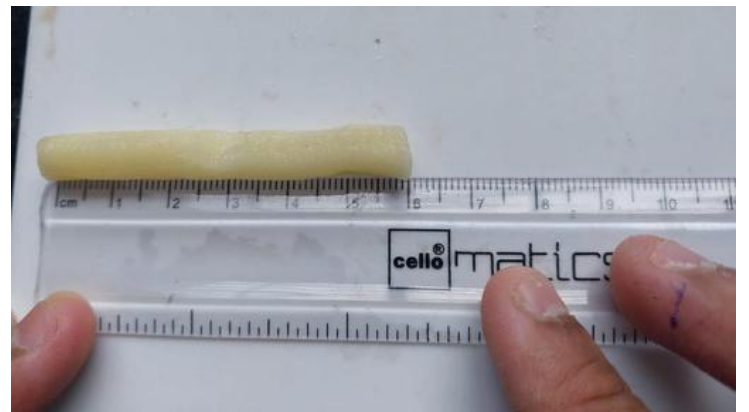
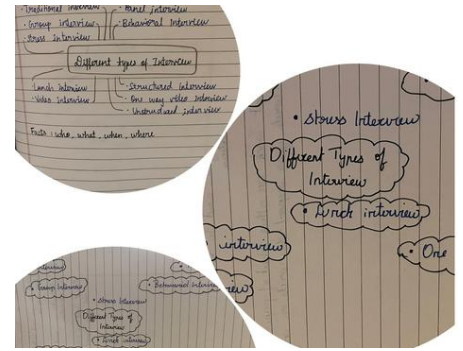
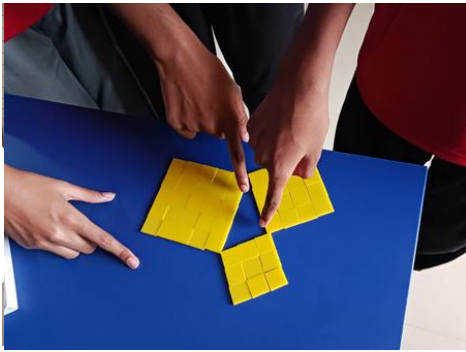


In English, our students mastered the art of persuasion and the appropriate format for expressing it in writing. In Chemistry, learners explored the fascinating world of periodic trends through an engaging group activity. Equipped with charts and interactive materials, students embarked on a journey through the periodic table, deciphering the patterns that govern atomic properties. In Biology, they studied the evolution of oxygen during the process of photosynthesis. In Social Studies, they learned about various types of resources and conducted outdoor research to categorize resources in their environment.





Grade 9 students identified differences between perspectives and issues from their activities. Perspectives included cultural views on water usage, government policies, and economic interests. Issues highlighted were water scarcity, pollution, and climate change impacts. Additional points included conflicts over shared water resources and the role of technology in addressing water shortages.



Throughout this week, tenth-grade students delved into various subjects. They explored the Pythagorean theorem in Mathematics, examined plant cells in different solutions in Biology, focused on interview techniques in English, and engaged with the concept of limiting and excess reagents in Chemistry. The week proved to be both diverse and stimulating across all academic disciplines.

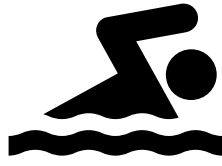
BASKETBALL
