A Word from the Senior Minister

Hi everyone, and greetings in the name of Jesus.

This fourth edition of our Handbook for Members and Visitors (HMV) gives you a glimpse into what God has in store for Hebron BPC in 2026. May this peek lead you to trust God for big things and be willing to do big things for Him.

Since mid-2024, we have been in a kind of “wilderness,” worshipping at borrowed premises while No. 10 is being renovated. In the Bible, the wilderness is often where God’s people like Joseph, Moses, David, Jesus and Paul met Him and got ready for future ministry.

So, how has this season been for you? Has relocation spurred you to think differently about worship, fellowship and service? Or has it been a waiting season, learning to slow down and listen to God as He prepares to bring us back to No. 10? Either way, I pray you have grown closer to Jesus.

We are excited for 2026 because the renovation will end and we will return to No. 10. When we reopen, both the English and Mandarin congregations will meet in their new sanctuaries on Sundays at 9am. To use our resources well, we will start with one worship gathering and add more only as needs arise.

Church is family. We want to welcome every Hebronite back to No. 10, especially those who have not joined us at Bukit Panjang Gospel Chapel or the Methodist Church of the Incarnation. We also expect newcomers at our refreshed facilities, and we want them to feel at home fast. With more people coming, we will need everyone to help welcome, serve and care for others. Do ask God where He wants you to step in and serve.

The year 2026 is also Hebron’s 55th anniversary. We will observe it as usual in April. But we have also set aside the afternoon of Saturday, 29 August, for a thanksgiving service and celebration tea to mark both our 55th anniversary and the reopening of No. 10. Do save the date.

Our theme for 2026 is: *People Must Know Jesus*. With a renewed building, we have new opportunities to show and share the gospel with everyone who walks through our doors. As we continue to grow in the good news of Jesus, let us be ready to speak to anyone anytime anywhere about what He has done for us.

Do read through the rest of this HMV for highlights in Hebron this year. If you are new, we believe God has led you here. We would love to know you and help you find a place to belong in Christ and in this church family. Reach out to us—we’ll be looking out for you too.

HEBRON'S WORSHIP SERVICE FLOW

In Hebron, our worship service moves through three simple but meaningful moments each week.



Assemble to Worship

We show up as a family in Christ, gathering from our busy week to praise the God who made us and saved us. In this space, we reset our hearts together and remember who God is and who we are in Him.



Attentive to God's Word

We quiet down, lean in, and listen as God's Word is preached in the power of the Holy Spirit. This is where truth confronts, comforts, and shapes us for real life outside church walls.



Align for Gospel Work

We end by looking outward, recharged by God to represent Christ in our workplaces, schools and homes, build up fellow believers, and be a witness to the world in the coming week.

*Each movement is designed to help us unplug from the noise,
recharge spiritually, and then head back out
to live and love like Jesus where He has placed us.*





Some things you'll notice in the Hebron worship service



Standing for Scripture

We stand to read the Bible to show honour and respect for God's Word. It's a simple physical reminder that what we're hearing is not just another text, but God speaking to His people.



Kneeling (or sitting) for prayer

Our usual posture in prayer is to kneel, when space allows, as a sign of humility and submission before God. If kneeling is uncomfortable or physically difficult, please feel free to remain seated and pray with us from where you are. It's the posture of the heart that counts.



Offering

The offering is a moment for Christians to respond to God in worship by giving financially to support His work through the church. If you're not a Christian, there's no pressure to give — just let the bags pass you by.



Benediction & Threefold Amen

At the end of the service, the minister speaks a blessing from God over the whole congregation. We then sing the "amen" together as our way of saying, "Yes, we receive and agree with all that God has spoken to us today."



Water Baptism

Hebron practises water baptism by sprinkling or pouring, in line with the Reformed faith (see Westminster Confession of Faith 28.3). Baptism is a sign and seal of God's covenant promise to His people, and every believer is commanded to receive it as a public sign of belonging to God's covenant family (see Matthew 28:19).



Infant Baptism

We also baptise infants whose parents are believers (one or both), because their children are included in God's covenant promise (see Acts 2:38–39). In Hebron, these baptised children are counted as non-communicant members until they are ready to profess their faith and come to the Lord's Table.



The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper once a month. It reminds us that we belong to Christ and to His covenant people, and points us to the blessings we have in Him, both present and future. Communicant members of Hebron and baptised communicants from other Bible-believing churches worshipping with us are invited to partake.

PROJECT EZRA

What is Project Ezra?

Project Ezra started when our 30-year land lease was about to expire and our building was clearly aging out of its season. We knew renewing the lease and renovating would be costly, so we called it “Project Ezra,” inspired by Ezra 6, where God moved a pagan king to fund the rebuilding of His temple—trusting that God could again provide generously in our day.

Why we needed to rebuild

Our church building went up in the early 1990s and, while the structure is still solid, the layout no longer served an aging congregation and community well. A major refresh also lets us install newer technologies and design the space for more effective ministry in a post-COVID world.

How God provided

In God's timing, we secured a new 30-year lease in 2023 and began A&A works in 2024 at a cost of nearly \$19 million—without taking a bank loan. God has been providing through the faithful, cheerful giving of Hebronites and supporters, interest-free loans from a few Bible-Presbyterian churches to smooth cash flow, and a government switch from competitive tender to a ballot system that drastically reduced our lease renewal premium.

More than just a building

From the start, Project Ezra was never only about walls and tiles; it has always included the spiritual “reno” of Hebron as a church family. During our time away from the building, the pastoral team and many Hebronites have been intentionally investing in discipleship so that our spiritual growth keeps pace with our physical upgrade.

From “CCKBC” to “No. 10”

We've also retired the old building name “Choa Chu Kang Bible Centre (CCKBC)” and started calling it “No. 10” (“10” in Chinese) after our actual address, 10 Choa Chu Kang St 52. “No. 10” gives us a simple, memorable way to talk about our home base in Limbang/Yew Tee.

and returning to No. 10

What to expect when we return

When we move back to No. 10, we can look forward to:

- New worship sanctuaries
- More classrooms
- Bigger and better toilets
- More community spaces on level 1
- New and improved facilities for our pre-school childcare centre on level 4

We'll also resume our Sunday morning focus on worship, fellowship and discipleship as our main pathway for growing with the Lord.

Sunday morning at No. 10

Here's what a typical Sunday morning will look like:

- 0900-1030: Worship service (with Holy Communion every first Sunday of the month)
- 0900-1030: Children's Ministry every Sunday except the first Sunday of the month
- 1030-1100: Tea fellowship for everyone
- 1100 onwards: Youth activities, Christian education classes, Bible reading gatherings

The journey continues

When the physical works for Project Ezra finish and No. 10 reopens, the fundraising will still continue until all bills are cleared and all interest-free loans are fully repaid. We're trusting God to keep supplying every need as He has done so far.

Don't forget the lessons of the "wilderness"

Our time away from No. 10 wasn't wasted. It taught us:

- Not to get too comfy: our true home is in Jesus.
- To be creative in ministry: cafes, food courts, living rooms can all become mission fields.
- To keep stepping out of our comfort zones.

God placed Hebron at No. 10 in Limbang/Yew Tee for a reason: to be the salt of the earth, the light of the world, and the pillar and buttress of the truth in our community.

May Hebron continue to be a radiant church where the gospel is A.L.I.V.E.

What is BPCIS?



BPCIS helps Hebron stay connected, accountable, and rooted in a larger Bible Presbyterian family, instead of functioning as a stand alone church. But what exactly is it and what does it do?

Hebron is part of the Bible Presbyterian (BP) denomination, whose doctrines and traditions are substantially similar to Presbyterianism. In this tradition, churches are not meant to be totally independent but linked together in layers of leadership.

Presbyterian church government works broadly like this:

- Each local congregation is led by its own Session of ordained presbyters (pastors and elders).
- Several Sessions from nearby churches come together to form a Presbytery.
- Several Presbyteries can then come together to form a Synod.

How BPCIS came about

The original BP Synod in Singapore was dissolved in 1988, which left each BP church (BPC) functioning independently, even though that is not how Presbyterian churches are meant to operate. In 2011, a few BPCs began exploring how to reconnect in a more intentional and accountable way.

These discussions eventually led to the formation of a new Presbytery, called the Bible Presbyterian Church in Singapore (BPCIS). BPCIS was registered as a society in 2018 and now has its own constitution to guide its life and ministry.

Hebron's place in BPCIS

Hebron joined BPCIS as a member church in 2022.

How BPCIS functions

The lead ministers of each member church form the Standing Committee of BPCIS and meet monthly to handle presbytery business and shared concerns.

Once a year in September, all ordained presbyters (pastors and elders) are invited to an annual presbytery meeting to deal with regulatory and governance matters.

Once a year in July, the ministers and ministry leaders are invited to attend an overnight retreat for learning and relationship-building across the member churches.

In recent years, the wives of the ministers have also organised their own annual meetings for encouragement and mutual support.

For the wider church family, BPCIS also organises joint worship services. Members of all BPCIS churches are invited to gather each year for Good Friday and Easter Sunrise services, expressing our unity in Christ across congregations.

BPCIS also seeks to help struggling BPCs to stabilise and renew through supplying manpower and financial assistance. Currently, three larger BPCs have “twinned” with three smaller BPCs to provide such help.

BPCIS also publishes a quarterly update of its activities for publication on every fifth Sunday of the month. It is carried in the Hebron News whenever it is released.

MARRIAGE SOLEMNISATION in Hebron

Getting married at Hebron is a privilege for Hebron communicant members who plan to continue to worship and serve here after their wedding. We believe having a caring church family is key to building a strong marriage and home. If you're thinking about getting married, please tell the ministers at least a year ahead. You and your partner will then complete a marriage prep course together.

The facilities at No. 10 may also be used for weddings by:

- Communicant members of Hebron who don't plan to stay in Hebron after the wedding,
- Communicant members of BPCIS or other Bible-Presbyterian churches in Singapore, or
- Communicant members of a Bible-believing church that does not have its own worship space.

To book No. 10, send us a written request no earlier than six months before your wedding. Include a letter of support from your lead pastor. Your marriage must be solemnised by a pastor from your church. The wedding service must not include elements that are outside of Hebron's usual worship style such as speaking in tongues.

For now, until the renovation of No. 10 is completed, we will not be accepting bookings for weddings.
