



All itineraries, programs, and optional tours are subject to change and will be operated as advertised on Heritage Line website or through collaterals at the time of boarding. During the months of January – April, dis-/embarkation in Cambodia for sailings aboard Heritage Line Jayavarman takes place at Kampong Cham. The overall experiences remain unchanged.



DAY 2

Discovering Saigon

This morning, take a 2hr drive northwest to the famous Cu Chi Tunnels, an immense network of connecting underground tunnels started in 1948 to protect the Viet Cong guerrillas from the French air and ground sweeps. The tunnels also served as living quarters, communication and supply routes, and housed hospitals, food and weapons caches. Touring the underground compounds will provide a better understanding of the history of the tunnels, the hardship of life in the tunnels and the Vietnamese resilience during combat. Return to Saigon. Stop at a local restaurant for lunch.

Afternoon we continue to the highlights of city tour. With over eight million inhabitants and four million motorbikes, Saigon is truly a city that never sleeps. Despite its modernity, Saigon maintains a strong link to the past and our city tour takes in some of Saigon's most historic landmarks including the Notre Dame Cathedral, a red brick edifice with twin spires constructed from materials imported from France (entrance is only permitted when no services are being performed).

Then head across the square to the Central Post Office, completed in 1891. A short drive away is the former Presidential Palace, the headquarters of the Saigon Government during the American War. Continue to the War Remnants Museum for a vivid perspective of the American War through the eyes of the Vietnamese. (Please note that some of the displays are very graphic.) Experience Saigon's famed street coffee culture while your guide provides a brief language lesson as well as insights into daily life of a Saigonese before returning to your hotel.





DAY 3 Embarking on the Mekong



Saigon – My Tho – Tan Phong Island (Cai Be)

Your journey begins in Saigon with a warm welcome at the lounge before transferring to My Tho to board your luxurious floating home. After settling in, enjoy a lunch buffet as the ship sails upstream, then gather with fellow travelers for a welcome reception of canapés and prosecco as twilight casts a golden glow over the Mekong. Anchoring near Tan Phong Island by Cai Be, the evening continues with dinner and optional late-night entertainment in the cinema featuring classic films or documentaries.

DAY 4 Traditions of the Delta

Tan Phong Island - Binh Thanh Island - Gieng Island

Rise early to enjoy the peaceful dawn of the Mekong Delta, followed by morning Tai Chi and breakfast. A local boat takes us to Cai Be to see traditional products like rice paper, rice wine, and coconut candies, then onward to Tan Phong Island to visit fruit gardens, taste tropical delights, and meet families weaving water hyacinths into crafts.

In the afternoon, explore Binh Tan Island, where communities cultivate water hyacinths and practice traditional mat-making, meeting an elderly couple who have dedicated their lives to this craft. The day concludes with a presentation on life in the Mekong Delta as the ship sails to its overnight mooring near Gieng Island.







Discovering Phnom Penh

Once known as the "Paris of the East," Phnom Penh blends colonial elegance with vibrant modern life. After breakfast, set out on a full-day city tour beginning with a cyclo ride through the bustling streets. Visit the Royal Palace and the Silver Pagoda, then explore the haunting "S21" prison, a reminder of Cambodia's turbulent past, before pausing for lunch in town.

In the afternoon, tour the Sosoro Museum and stroll through the French Quarter, concluding at the landmark Wat Phnom. Back on board, enjoy an expert lecture before a gala barbecue dinner with a mesmerizing Apsara dance performance. The evening is yours to explore the city's lively riverside promenade or sample its nightlife.



DAY 7

Timeless Countryside

Low Water Season

Phnom Penh – Kampong Laeang – Kampong Luong (Tonle River)

At dawn, the ship enters the Tonle River, a natural wonder lined with captivating scenery. In the morning, guests venture into Kampong Tralach for an ox-cart ride through rice paddies to a village, with the choice to visit a local NGO school and library project or explore a 300-year-old temple and Buddha shrine. After lunch onboard, the crew presents traditional Khmer fashions before the afternoon excursion to Kampong Laeang, a rural hamlet near Kampong Chhnang, where pottery-making, a pre-Angkorian temple, and panoramic views of floodplains and rice fields await. The day concludes as the ship sails to Kampong Luong to anchor for the night.




Phnom Penh – Prek Bangkong -Angkor Ban - Kampong Luong

Leaving Phnom Penh early, the ship makes its way to Prek Bangkong, a riverside village famed for silk weaving and once home to the Royal family. Here, guests observe the intricate process of silk production and visit the heritage house of H.E. Sam-El, a former royal architect. Back onboard, a presentation on the Mekong and Tonle Rivers precedes lunch, before an afternoon excursion to Angkor Ban, where a monastery and charming village offer opportunities to meet monks, engage with locals, and capture glimpses of Cambodia's rustic lifestyle. The day ends as the ship sails back down the Mekong to overnight at the confluence of the two rivers.


Kampong Luang – Prek Bangkong – Angkor Ban (Mekong River)

Begin the day in Kampong Luang, famed for its master silversmiths, where raw materials are transformed into intricate works of art. Visit Wat Prang, a royal Buddhist temple offering moments of reflection, and engage with monks to learn about their spiritual traditions. Continue to Prek Bangkong to witness silk weaving and tour the heritage home of H.E. Sam-El, a royal architect, before returning on board for a sunset cocktail hour, dinner, and evening cinema as the ship sails upstream.

High Water Season

Kampong Luong - Kampong Tralach - Kampong Laeang (Tonle)

The day begins with Tai Chi on deck before visiting Kampong Luong, a silversmith village where families craft intricate pieces, and Wat Prang, the Royal Buddhist Temple, to connect with monks and local traditions. In the afternoon, an ox-cart ride through Kampong Tralach leads to a village with an NGO school or an ancient 300-year-old temple. The day ends with sunset sailing, happy hour, dinner, and a classic film onboard.



High Water Season

Kampong Laeang – Tonle Lake

This morning we visit Kampong Laeang, a rural hamlet near Kampong Chhnang, where tuk-tuks take us through the countryside to see pottery making, a pre-Angkorian temple, and sweeping views of floodplains and rice fields. Back on board, the ship enters the vast Tonle Lake, offering ocean-like scenery and onboard entertainment throughout the afternoon. The journey concludes with a farewell dinner and festive celebrations as we moor mid-lake near Siem Reap.







DAY 10

Farewell to the Mekong

Low Water Season

Kampong Cham – Siem Reap

Enjoy a final breakfast on board before disembarking for a four-hour bus transfer to Siem Reap. Along the way, guides share insights into Cambodia and the passing landscapes. Arriving in the early afternoon, you leave with lasting memories, new friendships, and stories of the mighty Mekong to cherish and share.

High Water Season

Tonle Lake – Siem Reap

Savor your final breakfast on board before disembarking on the Tonle Sap, Cambodia's UNESCO-designated Biosphere Reserve teeming with fish and birdlife. A local boat takes you past floating communities to the Siem Reap pier, where you transfer into the city center. With this, the river journey ends, leaving you with lasting memories of the mighty Mekong.

DAY 11 Siem Reap

Today, explore the ancient walled city of Angkor Thom, the former great capital of the Khmer Empire from late 12th century until its ultimate decline in the 15th century. Inside the compound, you will be able to visit some of the most mysterious and fascinating structures of the Angkor complex. Start this morning entering the city by the impressive 23-meter-high South Gate and head to Bayon temple. With its 37 towers and enigmatic smiling faces, it is one of the most emblematic temples. Once your guide has shared with you its knowledge and secrets, continue to Baphuon and learn more about the gigantic project of conservation it has undergone to get back at its monumental appearance. Then join the Terrace of Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper King via Phimeanakas, a small yet wonderful temple hidden in a multi-century old forest behind the terraces.

Go back in town for lunch at a local restaurant and relax before going back to visit the world-famous masterpieces that are Ta Prohm and Angkor Wat. Enter Ta Prohm by the West Gate, and be amazed by its detailed and refined bas-reliefs along with the presence of giant trees and roots that are slowly taking over the stones. Finish up your exploration with a visit to Angkor Wat and enjoy the sunset over the emblem of the Kingdom of Wonder.









