

It's big, bright, and beautiful:

The Winchelsea Station precinct mural now complete

Surf Coast Shire

Last week, local artist and resident Lauren Green completed a colourful, vibrant mural adorning a 42-metre wall facing Winchelsea's railway reserve.

The mural on the rear north-facing wall of Journey Early Learning Childcare Centre, is thanks to the efforts of a Community Project Working Group, led by Growing Winchelsea.

Lauren commenced works at 63 Hesse Street in February, seeking to beautify the blank wall, add interest to one of Winchelsea's key visitor gateways and capture and celebrate what makes the town and district special.

"Anyone that knows me, knows how much I love Winch. So, when I got the huge opportunity to paint this massive 42-metre-long wall on the back of my boys' kinder and daycare I was absolutely beside myself," Lauren said.

"This is the project I had been looking for without realising. It feels like all these teeny tiny steps of life led me here to this wall, to the most soul filling, joyful work I've ever experienced."

John Tebbutt from Growing Winchelsea said the project has strengthened the sense of community, with local Winchelsea Primary School students joining Lauren to help paint during two workshops held on February 14 and 21.

"It has brought younger and older generations together promoting a healthy and active town. I encourage everyone to come and have a look and feel a sense of pride in this project, initiated and completed by locals, and involving our local students," John said.

"It is important we value and support our local artists and acknowledge the key contributions they make to our community."

Growing Winchelsea's Station Precinct Sub-Committee registered the proposal for a community inspired mural project with Surf Coast Shire Council's Community Project Development Program last year.

The mural has been made possible thanks to joint funding from the:

- Surf Coast Shire Community Initiatives Grant (\$5,000)
- Property owner of 63 Hesse Street (\$5,000)
- Regional Arts Victoria Regional Arts Fund Quick Response Grant (\$5,000)
- Lions Club of Winchelsea (\$3,000)
- Community Bank Winchelsea and District Community Initiative Grant (\$3,000).

"This project has been such a wonderful example of the good passionate community groups can do for their towns," Cr Wellington said. "This beautiful piece has brought such colour and joy to the area, given school students a wonderful sense of pride, and captures the essence of Winchelsea so perfectly."



Housing crisis in negotiations

Victoria State Government

The State Governmnmenent is continuing calls for the Albanese Government to significantly increase funding for housing and homelessness services as part of negotiations for a new National Housing and Homelessness Agreement.

Population growth, ageing social housing and a rise in homelessness have led to unprecedented pressure on all states and territories. To assist the most vulnerable people in our communities across Victoria, we need to deliver support, care, workforce capacity, and more homes all over the state.

Through our landmark \$5.3 billion Big Housing Build, more than 9,200 homes have been completed or are underway – and we are on track to deliver more than 12,000 muchneeded new social and affordable homes and create more than 40,000 jobs in construction. We're also providing \$1 billion for at least 1,300 new social and affordable homes across rural and regional Victoria.

This work can and should continue with combined funding from the Commonwealth that counters the current shortage of social housing in Victoria and delivers measurable improvements in supply into the future.

Through our Homes First Program, we are building on the nation-leading Homelessness to a Home program, which provided housing and support to 1,845 households experiencing homelessness over a period of four years during the COVID-19 pandemic.

We are getting on with the job, but there is much more to do.

This week's Housing and Homelessness Ministerial Council meeting between states, territories and the Commonwealth continued the consensus approach in addressing the nationwide housing crisis.

In addition to our call for further funding, the Government is also backing calls from the Victorian Aboriginal housing and homelessness sector for a separate First Nations National Housing and Homelessness Plan. In doing this, we can address the lived experience of hardship and disadvantage that so many Aboriginal people face in finding safe, connected, and accessible homes.

We also support a First Nations schedule to the new National Housing and Homelessness Agreement for dedicated First Nations housing funding, and capacity-building for the Aboriginal community-controlled sector. This is an important part of meeting responsibilities under Closing the Gap and builds on entry points that enable First Peoples to access culturally safe homelessness services.

Get ready for Conquer the Corrugations with Hesse!

The weekend of April 13 and 14 brings the Conquer the Corrugations mental health awareness walk to Winchelsea. In the lead up to Conquer the Corrugations, the team at Hesse Rural Health have prepared some helpful tips and tricks to get you ready to go! Whether you are doing one day of the walk, two days, or even just a section, it's important to make sure you are hydrating and eating enough of the right foods. Keeping your fluid levels up and nourishing your body with fuel will help you get through the walk feeling good and recovering faster.

Keep reading for tips on hydration and nutrition to support you in the lead up, during and after Conquer the Corrugations.

Hydration

Prior to 13 and 14 April	On the day of 13 and 14 April	During the walk	After the walk
Maintaining 2 lit water intake for the 2-3 days prior to the walk ensures you will be well hydrated prior to the walk.	Try consuming an electrolyte replacement, such as Hydrolyte prior to commencement	Consumer water and alternating with electrolyte replacements, taking small amounts on a frequent basis	Continue to drink water and replace electrolytes, following the instructions on the pack

A great way to tell if you are adequately hydrated is to check the colour of your urine. Straw coloured urine indicates adequate hydration. A stronger yellow colour indicates more fluids (water!) are required.

Food Intake

An intake of foods containing carbohydrates the day before helps to build glycogen supplies to be used for energy the next day. A pasta based meal is an excellent choice for the evening prior to the walk.	Suitable breakfasts eaten 2-4 hrs prior to the event include: • Breakfast cereal with milk and fresh fruit •Bircher muesli with yoghurt and berries • Porridge with sliced banana + almonds • Raisin toast with peanut butter • Baked beans on toast •Toasted ham and tomato sandwich If solid breakfasts are not tolerated well, a liquid source of protein and carbohydrate, like a fruit smoothie are suitable ontions.	Foods high in carbohydrate and low in fat are suitable choices. These foods provide you with an energy source to keep you going. Small amounts of protein assist in avoiding hunger, and can help you to avoid a drop in energy throughout the day. Some examples are bananas (natures energy snack!), dried fruit or dry biscuits.	Refuel with a source of carbohydrates and protein to help muscle recovery and repair. Great examples - • Chicken, avocado and salad focaccia • Chocolate milkshake or flavoured milk tetra pack • Yoghurt + muesli with nuts and seeds • Burritos with beef, cheese, avocado and salad

'Blue-green algae no longer poses a threat to recreational river users

Water quality in the Barwon River through Geelong is safe for recreational activities, following a reduction in blue-green algae in water samples tested this week.

The test results received by the Corangamite CMA this week, show

that current levels of blue-green algae, in accordance with Victorian Government guidance, no longer pose a risk to recreational users.

There is no longer a warning for users of the river to not come into physical contact with the water in the Barwon River through Geelong from below Baum's Weir to the Lower Breakwater.

Monitoring will continue, with weekly tests conducted and the public kept informed of any changes.

At Melbourne Zoo, visitors can venture along paths not normally open to visitors to discover 16 huge Dinosaurs, their nests, and newly hatched young. For budding palaeontologists, there's the chance to uncover a fossil in the sandpits, watched over by the mighty Tyrannosaurus Rex.

In an Australian first, Dinos at the Zoo will also provide unprecedented access to the deaf and hard of hearing community, with Expression Australia creating a series of videos in Australian Sign Language (Auslan) to provide information on every exhibit, which is instantly accessible by scanning a QR code.

At Werribee Open Range Zoo, expect the unexpected as you encounter 14 awe-inspiring Dinosaurs, smoking volcanoes, bubbling swamps, dino footprints, and unearth life-like dino fossils.

For an evening adventure like no other, Dinos After Dark will be available at Werribee for one week from 7 April, offering a unique nighttime experience with these ancient giants.

Within the Yarra Valley, step back in time along Healesville Sanctuary's bushland Nature Trail where 16 Dinosaurs roam. Or, for those who prefer a guide, join a free walking tour with a ranger.

Regional Victorians won't miss out, with 15 prehistoric beasts taking up residence at Kyabram Fauna Park. Visitors will experience Kyabram's new dinosaur population roaming in a newly created area of the parkland, with the opportunity to make their own discoveries in the fossil dig sandpit.

The Government is giving more families the chance to explore the zoo with free entry for children under 16 years on weekends, school holidays, and public holidays. Dinos at the Zoo will be free with zoo admission and run from 29 March until the end of the Winter school holidays.



Golden opportunities to find a Nugget

Victoria State Government

Holidays are a great time to head out to Victoria's historic regions and experience the excitement of hunting for a gold nugget – and it could result in a valuable discovery.

Warmer than average autumn weather makes it an ideal time to have fun with family and friends in regional Victoria.

As well as being great fun, recreational prospecting can also bring a windfall with the gold price at over \$3000 an ounce.

In October last year a nugget weighing 119 grams was found between Inglewood and Wedderburn by two prospectors using a metal detector- one of the men was trying his hand for the first time.

Earlier in 2023 a prospector using a metal detector discovered a 4.6kg nugget, valued at around \$240,000, in Victoria's Golden Triangle in the state' central west. A gold nugget worth about \$200,000 was also discovered in the same area in 2019.

Prospecting is a way of looking for gold or gems using metal detectors, picks, shovels, sieves and pans.

The use of mechanical equipment or explosives is not permitted, vegetation and Aboriginal objects must not be removed or damaged.

Recreational prospectors need to understand where they can prospect as well as be cognisant of local weather and road conditions.

Recreational fossicking is a regulated activity in Victoria which means you need to possess a miner's right, which for just \$27 allows you to keep any gold you find.

There are over 87,000 active miner's rights in Victoria and the rush to get involved shows no sign of slowing with more than 11,000 purchased in 2023.

With more Victorians hunting for gold, it's important that prospectors are doing the right thing to protect the environment.

The Earth Resources Regulator's inspectors frequently check that prospectors are licenced, panning in permitted areas and complying with environmental safeguards.

Fossicking and recreational prospecting is permitted in state forests and in designated areas of some national, state, historic and heritage parks.

Prospectors must also obey all other public land rules, including driving only on public tracks or roads, taking all rubbish home and immediately restoring the area by backfilling any holes and replacing leaf litter.

2024 planned burning program set to start

Forest Fire Management Victoria

Forest Fire Management Victoria will take advantage of favourable weather and forest conditions across the Barwon South West to keep Victoria safer from the threat of bushfires.

FFMVic Deputy Chief Fire Officer David Rourke said planned burning is one of the tools FFMVic uses to keep Victoria safer from bushfires. "Delivering our planned burning program takes a lot of planning and preparation," Mr Rourke said.

"If you live in or are visiting an area where planned burning is taking place, there's a good chance you'll see FFMVic firefighters preparing locations or delivering planned burns. They'll be the ones in our distinctive green firefighting uniforms.

"In the Otways, areas around Lorne and Kennett River are a focus this year, as well as areas around Anglesea and further inland near Carlisle River and Gellibrand.

"We acknowledge that tourism is important in the region and take every effort to minimise impacts on communities. As our work continues, visitors may see smoke from burns already completed or from new ignitions if conditions are right. We ask everyone, locals and visitors alike, to respect any road, walking track and site closures that may be in place.

"In addition to delivering burns to help reduce fuel loads, planned burns are also undertaken for ecological purposes to benefit native flora and fauna. "This includes grassland burns at places like Cressy, burns in the Anglesea heath and burns to benefit species that need fire to regenerate.

"The bushfire risk management program is focused on creating a strategic network of fuel reduced areas on public land. We're building on the work we have done previously and into the future to help keep our communities safer.

"Our climate is changing and that means finding the right days for safe and effective planned burning is also changing. We've experienced a dry summer and start to autumn across the Barwon South West region, and we're balancing fire response with opportunities for planned burning.

"This includes burning later in the afternoon or evening to manage drier fuels when conditions are suitable and the use of aircraft to support burn operations.

"The bushfire risk management program is underpinned by scientific evidence, local knowledge and continuous improvement to make sure our work is focused where it will have the greatest impact in keeping Victoria safer."

FFMVic is made up of skilled and experienced staff from Victorian fire and land management agencies. Our partners under the FFMVic banner include the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA), Parks Victoria, Melbourne Water and VicForests.

We know that smoke from planned burns can cause concern. However, smoke is an unavoidable by-product of this essential work. We endeavour to keep smoke impacts as low as practically possible while delivering the required program.



WINCHELSEA HISTORICAL SOCIETY



In December 1842, Charles Beal, aged 21, and Prosper Nicholas Trebeck, aged 20, built the "Barwon Inn." Almost immediately it was almost burnt out by a fire that swept across the plains. Rebuilding started at once.

In 1842, Governor Latrobe was attempting to reach Cape Otway from the west because of the need of a lighthouse there. The party rendezvoused at "Beal's Inn" at Barwon. His comments were: Not a noisy, filthy, bug infested hostelry as might have been expected, but as clean and quiet and well ordered a

little place as you might wish to meet with on a Derbyshire trout stream or in a Welsh valley.

Searchers looking for lost explorers, Gellibrand and Hesse also called at Barwon Inn.

In 1846, Charles Beal, Prosper Trebeck and Thomas Austin built the first church. It is now the Church of England Hall.

In 1853 "Barwon lnn" had been sold to Elliott Bros.

In 1854 Charles Beal married Amy Murch. In 1855 Prosper Nicholas Trebeck married Eliza Beal.

In 1853, Beal and Trebeck rented Mt. Gellibrand Station for seven years. In 1860 Prosper Trebeck went to Sydney and Mt. Gellibrand Station was subdivided. Charles Beal purchased 6.563 acres of the station, which was named "Bleak House."

Charles Beal was killed in an accident, thrown out of his dray returning from a Water Trust meeting held at Winchelsea in January 1888. Prosper Nicholas Trebeck died 1904 in Sydney.

Kids to hit the books for Premiers' Reading Challenge

The State Government is calling on Victorian children and young people to explore, learn and enjoy the world through reading as they embark on this year's Premiers' Reading Challenge.

The Challenge encourages students between early childhood and Year 10 to read a set number of books during the year, with their efforts recorded online. A book list recommends age-appropriate texts that children might like to try, but any book counts towards their Challenge totals.

Last year, Victorian kids read a huge 3.4 million books between them – so this year's Challenge sets an even higher goal of 3.5 million books, encouraging children to become voracious readers across different genres, authors and styles of literature.

This year's 'Explore, Learn, Enjoy' theme captures the excitement and sense of adventure that reading gives us all – and the theme is also reflected in the Prep Bags given to every new student at a Victorian government school, which also includes a range of carefully chosen books and educational play materials.

Children who have not yet started school are also encouraged to join the Challenge by reading 40 books with the help of their families – with picture books, short stories, poems or non-fiction books in any language all eligible for the Challenge.

Since the Challenge began in 2005, 4.3 million students across Victoria have read more than 60 million books. Victorian students are the strongest performers in the country for the all-important Year 3 Reading NAPLAN results.






