Site Visit and Event Planner Workshop at Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre



A site visit and event planner workshop was held at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre (HKCEC) for mentees of the Big Brothers and Sisters Scheme (BBSS) and students of the BBA(Hons) in Convention and Event Management. Guided by mentor and alumnus Mr Tank Chow, Sales Manager at HKCEC, participants explored event planning from concept to execution. The workshop included a practical site visit, interactive discussions, and real-world case studies. The state-of-the-art facilities at HKCEC enhanced the enriching experience, fostering collaboration and empowering participants with skills for future event planning endeavours.





Cheung Chau Cultural Exploration

The Cheung Chau Cultural Exploration was organised for BHM students on 5 April 2025, offering a range of enriching activities. Students explored local food discovery points by visiting a variety of casual eateries along the island's streets. They participated in two engaging workshops: a safe bag workshop and a sculpture relief session, learning about the origins of *Ping'an Bao* and *Taiping Qingjiao*. The visit also included a tour of a traditional ice factory, providing deeper understanding of Cheung Chau's cultural heritage.

The workshop enhanced students' knowledge of global finance and equipped them with practical skills for analysing financial data.

Ms Karen Hau and Ms Posey Ho, HR professionals from Betterman Asia Limited, delivered an insightful talk on the roles and challenges of personnel recruiters. The session also emphasised attractive remuneration and career opportunities in recruitment. 
Insights on China's Travel Changes & Scholarship Support

Joint Student Activity: Piano Land Cruise Visit






