



National Service Area Since Inception





Christian was just 5 years old when his family's world was turned upside down. After weeks of unexplained symptoms, doctors discovered a 29.5-pound tumor pressing on his organs. Surgery, chemotherapy, and radiation followed, leaving him exhausted and in constant pain. Some days, he couldn't even stand.

The Austin Hatcher Foundation has been there every step of the way, providing therapy, academic support, and special family experiences like trips to the racetrack, helping Christian and his family heal, connect, and simply be together during the hardest fight of their lives.

Today, Christian is in remission. He's walking, riding his bike, and enjoying the simple joys of being a kid. **His story is just one example of how comprehensive, wrap-around care transforms lives, giving children and families the tools, confidence, and support to thrive even after cancer.** Because no family should walk through childhood cancer alone.



For nineteen years, the Austin Hatcher Foundation's comprehensive therapy programs have been funded entirely through private charitable support from individual and corporate donors, private and public foundations, and fundraising events, **ensuring families facing pediatric cancer receive high-quality care at no cost to them.**

In 2025, donor support enabled us to expand our reach and deliver critical services to families across multiple states. Contributions directly funded professional staff, evidence-based clinical services, occupational and recreational therapies, STEAM programs, and family support initiatives, along with the specialized materials and resources that make this care possible.

Through this collective investment, we remove financial barriers, sustain program growth, and ensure every family has access to the compassionate, comprehensive support they need to navigate cancer with resilience.





Honoring Cancer Fighters at the Track

Resilient Racers debuted in 2025, bringing pediatric cancer fighters into the spotlight at IMSA's **Battle on the Bricks** in Indianapolis. For the first time, the **names of 26 Austin Hatcher Foundation children were featured on race cars** and broadcast nationwide on NBC.

Cosmic Odyssey Space Camp for Families

In 2025, our **Cosmic Odyssey** program once again launched families into connection and discovery at **Space Camp**, hosted by the **U.S. Space & Rocket Center**. The program provided a much-needed break from treatment, allowing children and parents to step away from medical worries and into moments of curiosity and togetherness through hands-on space exploration, teamwork, and shared experiences.

A long-standing part of our diversionary and recreational therapy programs, **Cosmic Odyssey strengthens family bonds and builds hope**. This year, the program surpassed a milestone of **100 funded Space Camp participants**.

Academic Support Helping Students Thrive in School

Children impacted by pediatric cancer face unique academic and social challenges, from missed school days to the physical and emotional effects of treatment. In 2025, our team provided **16 neuropsychological evaluations** and **195 tutoring sessions**, working closely with families and school staff to create personalized plans—including Section 504 accommodations, IEPs, and Student Support Plans. By combining academic guidance, skill-building, and social-emotional support, **we help students stay on track, regain confidence, and thrive in school** despite the challenges of illness.

Family Programs create connection when families need it most. Through camps and community experiences, children, parents, teens, and siblings come together with others who understand. These moments help families feel supported, build resilience, and stay connected during treatment and beyond.

As the program continues to grow, **Hatch's Hero is expanding the Foundation's reach—ensuring that families facing pediatric cancer can access support no matter where they live.**



National + Regional Recognition

Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award Teens Driving Lasting Community Impact

In November 2025, the Austin Hatcher Foundation's **Teen Ambassador Program (TAP)** was honored with the **Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award** by the Association of Fundraising Professionals.

TAP empowers high school students to support families affected by childhood cancer through hands-on leadership in family programs, camps, and mentoring. Since its launch, the program has grown from 17 to over 70 ambassadors, contributing more than **5,000 volunteer hours** and raising over **\$85,000** through the Hit It for Hatch fundraising series.

Through their service, TAP Ambassadors gain valuable leadership and teamwork experience while making a meaningful difference—helping children and siblings feel supported, cared for, and inspired.

IMSA Team Marketing Award

The Austin Hatcher Foundation was honored with the **IMSA Team Marketing Award** for its role in creating and launching the **Resilient Racers** program. The initiative, which debuted at the TireRack.com Battle on the Bricks race, **celebrated more than 50 children facing cancer and other serious illnesses by featuring their names on IMSA race cars** during Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. By uniting drivers, teams, and families, the program showcased how motorsports can inspire, connect, and uplift children while giving families an unforgettable experience at Indianapolis Motor Speedway.


2025 COCACon Awards

2025 Progress

Phase 2 of our THRIVE facilities expansion in **Spring 2025** delivered significant enhancements, making the space more functional, comfortable, and welcoming for our families. These improvements included upgraded HVAC systems, new drop ceilings and lighting, and the installation of roll-up doors along the back of the building.

2025 Factory Five Type 65 Coupe Build

As part of our Industrial Arts Therapy Program, the Foundation's 2025 Factory Five Type 65 Coupe was built with the help of pediatric cancer patients and their families.

Inspired by the legendary Daytona Coupe, this custom Type 65 Coupe blended iconic design with modern performance. More than a car, the build offered a therapeutic, educational, and empowering experience, demonstrating how Industrial Arts Therapy transforms challenges into skill-building, confidence, and connection.

The car also drew nationwide attention, garnering 1.5 million views across platforms and becoming one of the highest-selling Factory Five Type 65 Coupes on Bring a Trailer, second only to our 2023 build. Proceeds from the auction directly support the Foundation's mission to provide free, comprehensive care and programs for children and families impacted by pediatric cancer.

Key Insights & Questions

1. How is the Austin Hatcher Foundation redefining pediatric cancer care?

The Austin Hatcher Foundation is reshaping the landscape of pediatric cancer care by offering a groundbreaking and comprehensive approach that goes far beyond conventional therapies.

This approach blends integrative medicine with traditional healthcare through services such as recreational therapy, mental health therapy, occupational therapy, and nutritional counseling, which work alongside conventional medical treatments to address the mind-body connection and improve overall well-being. The focus is on treating the whole person—mind, body, and spirit—offering families a more balanced and healing approach that is often overlooked in traditional pediatric cancer care.

2. Why is family-centered psychosocial care a critical part of pediatric oncology?

Cancer affects the entire family, not just the child diagnosed. Research shows that effective psychosocial care helps families adapt to the evolving challenges of treatment and survivorship. The Austin Hatcher Foundation takes an interdisciplinary approach, offering early assessments, individualized interventions, and ongoing support to ensure that each family member receives the resources they need to heal, grow, and succeed.

3. How does the Foundation ensure that families have equitable access to care?

We eliminate financial barriers by offering all services completely free of charge, regardless of a family's income or insurance status. Additionally, we address challenges such as transportation, childcare, and education disruptions to ensure that every child and family receives uninterrupted, high-quality support. Our comprehensive care model ensures that families have access to resources for a lifetime, not just during treatment.


