The origin of the Sarie Marais origin goes back to early 1900's when all the boats were used for transport, ferries and fishing when it was still Springbok Boating Company and belonged to King & Sons. The Pleasure Cruises came in the early 1970's and then named Sarie Marais Pleasure Cruises. It was a fleet of four wooden boats of which Jolly Roger is the only one left of many from the first fleet. The Jolly Roger was used to ferry students and naval soldiers between the mainland and Salisbury Island which hosted a University and Naval base in the 1970's. 



Tala is home to more than 380 bird species, as well as big game like Rhino, Kudu, Hippo, Giraffe and other plains game. Plant species found in this area include the Fiery Aloe, the imposing Euphorbia and fragrant Wild Sage.

Tala Collection Game Reserve is an excellent destination to choose for celebrating special occasions, or simply relax and enjoy some pampering. In this picture perfect setting, guests are able to escape from the hurried pace of modern life, to a place devoid of stress and crowds. Guests can also explore the reserve on guided game drives and segways.



Day visitors are welcome. Activities include game drives, paintball, archery, segways, mountain biking and so much more offering you the perfect opportunity to tap into your inner adventurer. This venue also has a welcoming fireplace and a boma outside where overnight guests can sit around a fire listening to the African sounds





And no visit would be complete without enjoying the warm waters of the Indian Ocean - from the exhilarating surf breaks to paddling in the shallows with the kids, exploring the rocky shores or relaxing on golden beaches. But there is much more to this region than its beaches, so take some time and add an adventure activity or two to your North Coast holiday experience.



Enjoy a sunrise stroll on the Ballito Boardwalk:

Bring your enthusiasm and energy – don't forget the camera to capture the magnificence of the sun rising over the ocean. The lengthy Ballito Boardwalk, with its beautiful ocean views, is the perfect place to stretch those legs and get the blood pumping - whether it's a gentle stroll, some powerwalking or even a determined run, this is the place to be seen doing it. The raised wooden boardwalk not only protects the dunes beneath it but offers spectacular sunrise views and possibly

the opportunity to see pods of dolphins – a common sight along the North Coast shoreline. There are plenty of coffee shops and restaurants if you need a break and some refreshments. The energetic will enjoy the more challenging hike and the spectacular views all the way to Salt Rock, but there is a tunnel along the route, so this is best attempted at low tide.

Explore the beach at Salt Rock:

The Salt Rock beach offers breath-taking views with the endless stretches of white sand and warm Indian Ocean. Explore the nooks and crannies of the rock formations of the rocky shores - look out for brightly coloured anemones, hermit crabs and maybe even a star fish. Take pleasure in sinking your toes into the soft white sand, taking a dip in the tidal pools, and savouring the sweetness of an ice-cream purchased from one of the ice-cream vendors. Take a dip in Granny's Pool, a tidal pool located near the main beach of Salt Rock but is a little more secluded than the main beach areas. It is

perfect for families offering safe and fun swimming as it is relatively shallow and enjoys waves of warm ocean water pouring into it regularly. It has both a rocky section and a sandy section, making it a real delight for kids to both swim and explore.

Visit the Flag Farm Animal Farm:

Make time for the kids and take them to the Flag Farm Animal Farm, where they can take pony rides, hand feed chickens, ducks, rabbits, cows, goats, sheep, geese, and various types of birds as well as enjoy learning how to milk a cow! All activities are specially made to entertain the young kiddies. But the best part is that 80% of their animals are rescued from unfortunate circumstances and now have a fabulous forever home.

Visit The Hidden Forest Wildlife Sanctuary:

This is a free-roaming multi-species primate sanctuary is a family-friendly eco-attraction. The tour starts with a short drive on a safari vehicle from the reception site to their 23-hectare hidden forest. From there, you will be taken on a guided walking tour during which your guide will help you look for the multiple species of free-roaming primates including capuchin monkeys, ringtail and black-and-white

ruffed lemurs, buff-cheeked gibbons, squirrel monkeys, black howler monkeys and spider monkeys in their forest home. You will also experience countless other natural wonders whilst on your walking tour in the forest.

Take Surfing Lessons:

The North Coast, with its amazing beaches and world class waves, is one of South Africa's top surf destinations. The Ballito Surf School offers a unique surf experience suitable for beginners as well as intermediate surfers. The surf lessons are subject to weather conditions and tides on the day, with the most suitable spot chosen for each lesson. Their surf instructors are all local surfers, and qualified in basic first aid and ocean rescue techniques, making it both a fun and safe experience. Another option is to try kitesurfing, an exciting water sport that is becoming very popular globally. And the KZN North Coast offers some of the best kitesurfing conditions and playgrounds in the world. At Surfers Ballito Bay instruction is offered by IKO (International Kiteboarding Organisation) qualified instructors and, they say, that whether you are 8 or 88 their courses will provide you with the skills that you need to tackle the wind and waves.







Located just 16kms from exit 222 of the N2 in the Dolphin Coast, The Hidden Forest Wildlife Sanctuary is the largest free-roaming multi-species primate sanctuary in Africa and a must-do outing the whole family will love.

Your adventure starts with a short drive on an open-top vehicle past lush sugar cane fields to the "hidden forest". Then you will head into the stunning 23-hectare indigenous forest on a guided walking safari, a truly unique and unforgettable experience. You might see ringtailed lemurs soaking up the sun or capuchins and squirrel monkeys foraging for insects; maybe you'll hear the call of the black howler monkey, the loudest land mammal in the world. The "hidden forest" is also naturally home to a wide range of indigenous wildlife so maybe you'll also spot a natal duiker, bush buck or banded mongoose on your forest adventure.

The Hidden Forest Wildlife Sanctuary is a true sanctuary, fully supported by Wild Choices and 2023 winners of the SKAL International Sustainable Tourism Award in the category of Major Tourist Attraction. The sanctuary has a strict notouching policy; this ensures the animals in their care don't feel threatened by the presence of visitors and don't have to perform for them either – a truly safe place for these animals to live as natural a life as possible. Here you'll have a unique opportunity to see the primates behaving as they would in the wild, marking their territories, forming social bonds and foraging. Visitors are welcome to take unlimited photos and videos.

Tickets are valid for the whole day so why not go on tour, enjoy a pizza lunch at the licensed restaurant and then go on a second tour; the kids will love playing in the jungle gym whilst you're pizzas are being made.

The Hidden Forest Wildlife Sanctuary is open from 8.20 until 4pm every day, including all weekends and public holidays. Bookings are recommended to be sure of a place on tour. If you do just turn up without a booking, the team will endeavour to ensure that you won't have to wait for more than 30 minutes.



Reasons to visit the BATTLEFIELDS



The rugged splendour of the landscape is dotted with haunting memorials, reminders of the bloodiest battles in history that were fought between Zulu, Brit, and Boer. The Battlefields region, however, not only plays host to innumerable monuments and well-preserved artefacts, its towns, hills and valleys are home to game reserves, crafters, art galleries, hot springs and a wealth of adventure activities.



Go Birding:

Don't miss the chance of 'ticking' one of the nearly 400 species of bird that have been identified along the Amajuba Birding Meander which offers a wide range of activities for birding enthusiasts, particularly for species where 'grassveld meets the berg'. A whole range of species normally associated with grassveld, bushveld and mountain habitats are found in the Meander which is also well known for its water birds. Some of the special birds of the area include the ground woodpecker, blue korhaan, Botha's and Rudd's lark, all three cranes, buff-streaked chat, mountain chat, bush blackcap, yellow-breasted pipit, pale-crowned cisticola, the black egret, all five of the harriers, both sparrowhawks, and most of the kestrels. The Meander has been developed to give birdwatchers easier access to most of the wonderful birds found in this region.

Spend some time in nature:

Explore the trails of the Ncandu State Forest Nature Reserve, KZN's second biggest indigenous forest, with its grassy plains, impressive yellowwood trees and majestic waterfalls. Or go hiking, trail running or mountain biking in the scenic splendour of Grey Goose Game Lodge Nature Trails or spend a night out on the Ingogo Hiking Trail which starts at the Vulintaba Estate office – don't stress, the overnight accommodation offers electricity, hot water & flush toilets!

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Follow the Fugitives Trail:

In the company of a local guide (enquire at either Isandlwana Lodge or Fugitives Drift Lodge) one has the opportunity to follow the escape route that the fugitives from the Isandlwana massacre on the 22nd of January 1879 took. This was the first major encounter of the Anglo-Zulu War, and a mighty defeat of the British at the hands of the Zula army. This 8km hike takes you from the imposing rock of Isandlwana, past the whitewashed rocks that mark the graves of those who died that day, through peaceful grasslands and up a rough hillside to view the spot where the fugitives tried to cross the fast-flowing Buffalo River.

Visit the Talana Museum:


Talana Museum, Battlefield and Heritage Park was established in 1982 to coincide with the centenary of Dundee - the name Talana is Zulu and means 'the shelf where precious items are kept'. The museum houses extensive collections relating to the area's rich coal mining history, glassworks, agriculture, cultural diversity, and the military heritage of the area with exceptional displays of weapons, uniforms, photographs and other military artifacts. The battle of Talana took place across the peaceful lawns of what is now the museum on Friday



20 October 1899. The verandas of the Smith cottage and Talana house were used as British dressing stations during the battle and the plantations of gum trees were used by the British troops for cover. The museum is unique in that it is the only one in South Africa located on a battlefield and where the buildings from the time of the conflict still exist.

Go on a game drive:

At the luxurious Nambiti Plains Private Game Lodge guests have the option of twice-daily game drives included in their stay, as well as the option of guided bush walks. In addition to wonderful wildlife sightings, which include the Big5, enjoy the sights, sounds, smells, and textures of the African bush. If you'd love a luxury game lodge experience but can't quite manage an overnight stay, then Nambiti Plains Private Game Lodge has just the answer – a day trip game drive.

NTSHINGWAYO DAM AT CHELMSFORD NATURE RESERVE

Chelmsford Resort lies 23 km from Newcastle in northern KwaZulu-Natal, just off the N11 between Newcastle and Ladysmith. It is a short, threehour drive from Johannesburg. Chelmsford Nature Reserve surrounds the Ntshingwayo Dam, which lies on the iNgagane River and is the third largest dam in KwaZulu-Natal.

The surrounding grasslands and acacia veld are the playground of several large game, including wildebeest, hartebeest, springbok, and blesbok. The Reserve makes a wonderful day's outing for those taking a break from the Battlefields route, or for those who want to enjoy the freedom of the great outdoors and the excitement of windsurfing, canoeing and jet-skiing. Ntshingwayo Dam is a renowned fishing destination, with carp, barbel and scaly being the most popular fish caught.

There is also a 1000 ha game park, which is well stocked with a range of Highveld game. Bird and game-viewing are particularly rewarding. Visitors may game from their own vehicles or requested a guided game drive by prior arrangement. Sailing, power boating, water-skiing and swimming are all popular pastimes on the 3 400 ha dam.

Visitors are free to walk or cycle anywhere within the game park as there are no dangerous animals. A shop with bait, liquor, wood and other basic provisions is open daily. Ample facilities for day visitors are available, including playgrounds and boat launching ramps.

Medical assistance, police and all other amenities are available at Newcastle, about 26 km away.












This coastline is a haven of unique and less-explored places, set amidst rolling hills and fringed by palm fronds and wild strelitzias. In addition to all things beach, there are several fun and family friendly activities and experiences to consider.

Get active at the Wild Coast Sun:

The Wild Waves Water Park, located at the Wild Coast Sun, provides hours of family fun and enjoyment on an assortment of fun water rides, from slides and tubes to loops and gentle rivers. Some of the fun rides include the Aqua Loop, SuperBowl, and Speed Slides – and if you're into thrills, then don't miss out on the Boomeranga, an exhilarating ride complete with high-banking turns and heart-pounding plunges. Those less inclined to the adrenalin rush will appreciate the leisurely Lazy River rides. But whether you are aged three or 63, the Wild Waves Water Park has a water world ride perfect for you.



Or feel the freedom of riding along the shoreline as waves break onto the sandy beach, feel the exhilaration of the wind through your hair and fresh salty air on your face. This experience, under the care of experienced guides from the Ocean Trails Equestrian Centre (based at the Wild Coast Sun) offers both experienced and new riders an experience of a lifetime. Take time to explore the wide-open beaches, the rocky shores and the fossil caves, and revel in the breathtaking scenery of the Mzamba River and gorge.

Hike the Umtamvuna Nature Reserve:

The Umtamvuna Nature Reserve in Port Edward is famous for its magnificent views of the deep Umtamvuna River Gorge. This southern-most nature reserve in KZN is a botanical paradise with its rolling hills, riverine forest and steep rocky cliffs. There are three magnificent trails, from the 30-minute Kingfisher Trail to the more extensive two-hour Loerie Trail and the four-hour Fish Eagle Trail, a circular route providing hikers the opportunity to discover diverse habitats, an amazing array of birdlife including some rare bird species and breath-taking views - look out for the Cape vulture and fish eagle, both of which breed on the reserve. Bushbuck, baboon, samango monkeys as well as blue and grey duiker and reedbuck also occur in the reserve.

Hit the MTB trails:

This region is a paradise for mountain bike enthusiasts, offering a plethora of thrilling trails that blend natural beauty with exhilarating challenges. Mountain bikers of varied skill

levels can explore an extensive network of trails that wind through indigenous forests, meander along rivers, and ascend to stunning viewpoints, rewarding riders with aweinspiring vistas of the Indian Ocean. So, whether you're craving fast-paced downhill descents, technical singletrack adventures, or leisurely rides immersed in nature, there's a trail just waiting for you to explore.

Explore Oribi Gorge

Marvel at the breathtaking views offered as one explores the Oribi Gorge - don't miss the legendary Leopard Rock. The Oribi Gorge Nature Reserve offers wonderful walking trails revealing hidden treasures, including the picturesque Samango Falls. In addition to over 300 documented bird species, visitors can observe a breeding colony of rare Cape vultures on a guided tour to the vulture hide and restaurant. And for the adrenalin junkies there's the Wild Gorge swing - an unbelievable experience that leaves you breathless yet exhilarated. Situated at the top of Lehr's Waterfall, this is the highest swing in the world. Hurl yourself (or simply step) off the edge of the waterfall to swing into the gaping depths of the gorge – 165m (55 storeys). Unlike a bungee, where you are strapped by the ankles, you experience the swing securely and comfortably fastened in a full body harness. You can also go rafting or abseiling.

Beach Time:

Walk along the sandy unspoilt beach where the only footprints are your own, and the crashing waves and cry of a seagull the only refrain. Hunt for relics from old shipwrecks along the coast or take a guided walk to the petrified forest and Mzamba cretaceous deposits. Explore the rocky shores and appreciate the marine life that calls these pools home, let the waves wash over your feet and cool off with a dip in the ocean. Another popular beach activity is horse riding on the beach and can be combined with a petrified forest experience.

Wild Waves:

Head to the Wild Waves Water Park for a day of fun and adventure that the entire family will enjoy. Choose from a gentle Lazy River tube experience, to fast paced, heart-pounding body slides, tube rides and flume experiences, which will certainly result in an adrenalin rush. There's even a Kidz Zone offering as safe, fun, and inter-active water-play area for the little ones.



Quad Biking:

The multi-terrain quad biking tours, for over 16's, offer the opportunity to get off the beaten track and explore some of the incredible vistas that this region has to offer, from lagoons, rivers and breath-taking sea views from the top of a craggy cliff.

The championship 18-hole Wild Coast Sun Golf Course is famed for its magnificently curated

fairways and greens that cross rugged terrain of hills, ravines, rivers, dams, waterfalls and the lagoon until the final hole, with unforgettable views of the Indian Ocean. Are you up for the challenge?







Find your perfect escape under the hot African sun and experience vibrant Zulu culture and wonderful wildlife, gaze upon the Indian Ocean or wander through indigenous forests. This is Zululand, located just north of the Thukela River and extending up to Richards Bay in the north and into the rural heart of the region as you head inland. Zululand is an area of breath-taking hills and valleys, where hiking and nature trails abound, and game viewing opportunities are never far out of reach. Come and experience all that this region has to offer.



Visit Fort Nonggayi in Eshowe:

For a glimpse into the history of the region, pop into the Zululand Historical Museum located within Fort Nonggavi, the striking white mudbrick and three-turreted fort established in 1883 as the base for the most unusual peacekeeping Zulu force, called Nongqayi. Amongst its many displays, the Museum offers a rare look at John Dunn, South Africa's only official white Zulu iNkosi and husband to 48 Zulu wives!

Go game viewing in the HluhluweiMfolozi Park:

This park, which is said to be the oldest proclaimed reserve in Africa, is home to Africa's Big 5 as well as a variety of other game species. With approximately 96,000-hectares of conserved wilderness the park contains an incredible diversity of fauna and flora and offers plenty of opportunity for visitors. Experience the vast open spaces and abundant wildlife on a guided game walk, atop an open game viewing or by self-driving in your own vehicle (purchase a map on entry). The roads are well-marked and there are several viewing hides overlooking waterholes enabling visitors to view game at close range.

Conservation:

Visit for a day and you'll want to stay for more. Thula Thula Private Game Reserve, which is home to a variety of game including elephant, buffalo, leopard, hippo and giraffe offers visitors a safari whilst enjoying the peace and tranquillity of the bush – the literal meaning of the Zulu word thula. In addition to a wildlife experience one can support Thula Thula's conservation efforts by helping to expand the elephant habitat by sponsoring one acre of the extended land, buying one metre of fencing, or adopting a Thula Thula elephant.

Go birding:

Zululand has much to offer avid birders, and a great place to start is Mtunzini with its lush mangrove swamps and forests and is considered a birders' paradise. Some of the special birds to look out for are the African finfoot, Narina trogon, green malkoha and mangrove kingfisher. It is also famous for having a colony of rare palm-nut vultures that live in the raffia palms, near the railway line - there is a timber boardwalk through the swamp forest that will get you closer to the palms.

A must-do is a walk in the treetops at the Dlinza Forest Aerial Boardwalk - the 125-metres long boardwalk with an elevation of 10 metres, allows visitors to walk right under the canopy and climb a tower that offers expansive views out across the treetops. It's a place where eagles soar, and where the calls of trumpeter hornbills and purple-crested turacos ring out over the indigenous scarp forest, and where, if you're lucky you may catch a glimpse an elusive Narina

trogan. The Dlinza Forest is probably the most accessible forest and is visited by birders from all over the world hoping to catch a glimpse of rare bird species such as the spotted ground thrush and eastern bronze-naped pigeon. It is best visited at dawn in the company of a local birding guide. If you have some time to spare, then a walk along the forest trails is a must – there's the short Impunzi Trail and the 1.8km Unkonka Trail, both of which enable you to experience the wonder of the forest.


Learn about Zulu Culture:

Visit the KwaBulawayo Heritage and Cultural Site, it is the site where King Shaka established his military headquarters and is also where the legendary Mzilikazi betrayed him. Legend has it that, during its hevday, KwaBulawayo boasted 30 000 bee-hive huts, making it the biggest city in Africa at the time. Be sure to also allow time to stop in at Emakhosini, the traditional burial ground of Zulu Kings, aptly known as the Valley of the Kings, and the 'Spirit of Emakhosini' monument and uMgungundlovu, the Royal Residence of King Dingane and kwaMatiwane where Voortrekker leader Piet Retief and his men were killed, and subsequently buried. A must-do is King Cetshwayo's royal settlement at Ondini (near Ulundi) which was razed to the ground after the final battle of the Anglo-Zulu War, as well as the KwaZulu Cultural Museum, which was opened in 1984 and houses one of the most representative collections of the rich cultural heritage of the region and is famous for is collection of beadworks. There are also several items which belonged to King Cetswayo who ruled the Zulu nation during the Anglo-Zulu war of 1879.

The Eshowe Butterfly Dome



Situated adjacent to the Fort Nonggayi Museum Village in Nonggayi Road Eshowe.

Owned and operated by Dr Americo Bonkewitzz, PHD

He provides a consultancy service with the goal of educating people about the need of protecting the local indigenous forest in order to protect the biodiversity of the environment.

Among the services are:

- constructing butterfly habitats (butterfly gardens and butterfly exhibits) for educational or commercial use.
- conducting invertebrates and butterfly courses
- providing butterfly watching opportunities in certain parts of KwaZulu-Natal
- assisting environmental specialists with butterfly surveys.

For the wildlife garden, I additionally offer the following items:

- Eco-rocks
- Nectar and host plants for butterflies

AMÉRICO NÉSTOR BONKEWITZZ, PH.D



Zoologist and Biologist. Americo studied Licenciature in Biology at Universidad Nacional del Sur in Bahia Blanca, Argentina and then earned his doctorate in Zoology at University of Natal (now University of KwaZulu-Natal) in Pietermaritzburg.

He established Biological Application Software in 1994 developing expert systems, among them the Black Fly Control of the Orange River for the Onderstepoort Veterinary Institute. In late 1990 he started butterfly farming using the indigenous species, targeting particularly the breeding of the Emperor Swallowtail.

In 2007 carried out several butterfly surveys in KwaZulu-Natal, in particular the extensive butterfly survey of Mkhondeni-Mpushini area in Pietermaritzburg contracted by G. Nicholson CC.

In 2010 he got involved in a butterfly project with African Conservation Trust establishing four large butterfly domes.

In 2013 was contracted by African Insight to carry on invertebrate modules. Later on, from 2015 onward, run several butterfly training courses and invertebrate modules for Bhejani Nature Training. recently started to produce Eco Rocks, a faux rock that connects all animals of the ecosystem.





The Elephant Coast stretches from Lake St Lucia in the south to Kosi Bay in the north and extending inland across to the Lubombo Mountains in the west. This exceptional area offers the perfect outdoor escape and is fast growing in popularity with its incredible variety of habitats and eco-systems, delivering an unforgettable blend of adventure, unspoilt scenery, and unique experiences such as those found in Kosi Bay.



Go snorkelling at the Kosi Bay Mouth:

Not to be missed is a snorkelling experience in the warm waters of the rock pools and the estuary, a natural 'aquarium' with an abundance of marine life. The inflowing seawater of high tide offers the best visibility to spot boxfish, Moorish idols, moray eels and the spectacular lionfish as well as the devil fire fish along the estuary reef. You will need to have access to a 4X4 to drive to the Kosi mouth. Should you not have a 4X4 or not be travelling as far as Kosi Bay, there are several operators that offer guided snorkelling trips along the coastline.

Turtle Tours:

A highlight at this time of year (generally from November to end February) is turtle viewing at Bhanga Nek beach. Witness

the extreme effort and determination of a loggerhead or leatherback turtle as they come out of the surf and across the shore to lay their eggs in carefully prepared nests, often on the exact beach that they themselves hatched from. And approximately 70 days later, see the hatchlings making for the safety of the sea. Another popular spot for turtle tracking is at Sodwana Bay with Ufudu Turtle Tours.

Birding:

Birding is also excellent in Kosi Bay – a special of the region is the palmnut vulture which feeds on the fruit of the Kosi Palms. Other species to look out for along the estuarine lake system are Pel's fishing owl, African finfoot, swamp nightjar, bar-tailed godwit and if you're lucky a Mongolian plover. Other popular birding spots are Ndumo GAme Reserve, Mkhuze Game Reserve, and of course the iSimangaliso Wetland Park.

Fish Trap Tour:

Dotted along the Kosi Lake system you'll see the intricately woven fish traps. Embark on a guided tour of the fish traps with a local fisherman. He will explain the rich history of fish traps to the Thonga people, the cultural significance of the fish traps and how they are handed down from one generation to another. Learn about the process, from the construction of these traditional woven traps to the skill (and patience) required to spear a fish. This tour can be booked through most of the lodges in Kosi Bay.

Three Lake Boat Cruise:

Traverse three of the four lakes by boat, meander through the channels, drift between the fish traps, snorkel in the protected mangroves and view an incredible diversity of birds. A wonderful way to spend a day – include a picnic on the beach of the Kosi estuary.

Canoe Safaris:

Enjoy a guided canoe safari with your guide from Utshwayelo Lodge and paddle around the fish traps and into Lake Kahlu – get up close views of nesting cormorants, flamingos, fish eagles and if you're lucky the rare palmnut vulture. Or if you're staying at Kosi Forest Lodge, you'll have the opportunity to paddle the narrow channels connecting the lakes, just remember to keep a lookout for Pel's fishing owl or even the elusive African finfoot – both big ticks with birders!

Kosi Bay Fishing:

The waters of the pristine Kosi Bay ecosystem are teeming with fish and keen fly fishermen will appreciate targeting specific species, like grunter, kingfish, river bream and pick-handled pike, amongst others. But regardless of your fishing skills, fishing in lake two and three offers great fun – but keep a lookout for hippos and crocodiles! Just remember that no fishing is allowed between First Lake and the mouth and don't interfere with the fishing kraals of the Thonga people. Rock and surf angling along the length of the coastline is also a popular activity, just make sure you have the relevant fishing licences.





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Whale Watching St Lucia is a magical 2 hour St Lucia tour taking you as close as 50 meters from the giants of the deep. Humpback whales are the most commonly spotted, but Minky's,

Right and Sperm whales are also seen. Whale Watching St Lucia begins with a high energy surf launch which requires decent "holding on strength".




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Summer is a glorious time in the Drakensberg with the mountains resplendent in their shades of green. Enjoy one of the many hiking routes on both lower and upper slopes - there are several marked trails, from short ambles through indigenous fern forests to more strenuous full day hikes traversing rivers and hillsides to full-on adventuring. But don't forget to take time to pause and appreciate nature's splendour – from the tiny wildflowers that add colour to the grasslands, to the massive blooms of the king protea, and from the tiniest birds flitting through the forests to watching the majestic lammergeier as it glides the thermals.



Take to the air:

Nothing can match the totally exhilarating experience of flying in a helicopter, especially across the breath-taking scenery of the Drakensberg... swoop over gorges and through lush valleys, hover above rivers and waterfalls, and marvel at the treacherous peaks and gullies. And how about a glass of chilled bubbly, or a picnic breakfast, whilst you're up there soaking in the magnificent views?

Or start your day before dawn, and float majestically up into the sky in a hot air balloon. Watch as the mist rises in the valleys below and the sun paints the mountains with a soft glow. Take in the spectacular scenery, marvel at the tones and textures of green, the verdant valleys, rising hills and mountain cliffs Drift slowly in the wind, enjoy the romance of the experience and feel the combination of exhilaration and absolute calm. Food for the soul!

Be adventurous:

If you cannot soar in the sky like an eagle, you can at least fly through the treetops like a bird. A Canopy Tour Experience enables you to glide between platforms perched in trees and on cliff faces - feel the wind in your hair and fresh air on your face. Be inspired by the nature of the majestic Drakensberg as you whizz past huge yellowwood trees, over flowering Cape chestnut trees and past rugged cliffs. Being able to gaze down upon ancient



indigenous forest, waterfalls and cascading streams make this an opportunity not to be missed.

Prefer to keep your feet on the ground? No problem, experience the spectacular route up Sani Pass, once a rough mule trail and now the well-known entry point into Lesotho from the Drakensberg. This is a highlight for 4x4 enthusiasts with spectacular scenery, breathtaking drop-offs, and gushing waterfalls, with the reward being amazing views and the opportunity of enjoying a pint at the highest pub in Africa (2874 metres above sea-level).

Pull on your hiking boots:

Enjoy the pristine indigenous forests and streams with refreshing rock pools as you hike the trails around the Dragon Peaks Mountain Resort estate, be sure to look out for the ancient seven-hundred-year-old yellowwood tree, and enquire about the guided hike to the protected rock art. Or explore the nearby trails within the uKhahlamba World Heritage Site, easily accessed from Monks Cowl Reserve. One can also hike to Nandi's Falls, a scenic 8km circular hike that passes the Sterkspruit Falls and continues on to Nandi's Falls.

Departing from Ezemvelo Wildlife's Didima Camp is a moderately challenging 5.6km trail that takes you up into the mountain, through indigenous forest with magnificent yellowwoods and wonderful bird life. Follow the river upstream into a gorge, past rock pools, rapidly flowing streams, and waterfalls. Whatever your choice of hike, pack a picnic to enjoy beside a mountain stream and do take a leisurely dip in a mountain stream before heading back. Be aware that thunderstorms are common during the summer months and although accidents are rare, be sure to complete the Mountain Rescue Register prior to setting off, even for a day walk.




