




Last fall, we began discussions with one of our largest customers to develop a transition plan that ultimately marked the conclusion of a 40-year partnership.

Handi-Crafters has long been recognized for its expertise in shoe care kitting, particularly through our work with Kiwi, a brand owned by SC Johnson. At our peak, we assembled over a million shoe care kits annually for this iconic brand, with the demand for these products accounting for 70% of our business. "SC Johnson was a cornerstone customer and a project we honed over the years, achieving exceptional efficiency," said Mariana Tarau, Director of Operations at Handi-Crafters. "Hundreds of our clients gained valuable skills by packaging shoe kits. While much of our business was built around this partnership, it served us very well for decades."

As the partnership came to a close, we recognized the significant challenge ahead.

"Our team displayed remarkable determination and resilience," said Tarau. "It also became an opportunity to diversify our assembly work."

Initially responsible for stocking shelves and recovering items, Marissa soon embraced additional duties, including working the register. Though she initially had reservations about handling money, Marissa quickly proved herself more than capable, earning frequent praise

from her store manager, Anthony.

This achievement was especially meaningful given Marissa's initial doubts. She had once believed
