

Guy Sasson – Wheelchair Tennis | Paralympic Bronze Medalist

After a ski accident left him paralyzed, Guy Sasson rediscovered his passion for tennis at The Center. Now ranked #3 in the world for quad singles, he secured a bronze medal in Paris 2024, and attended all four Grand Slams, winning medals at three of them.

More 2024 Athlete Achievements

- Caroline Tabib had an amazing year, winning gold at the Italian Open & Poland, silver in the US, Spain, & Slovenia, & bronze in Brazil.
- Omer Gadot won a gold medal in a competition in Petah Tikvah & ranked among the top 10 table tennis players in Israel, including able-bodied competitors.
- Our wheelchair basketball team **won the Israel National Championship**, defeating the Hadera Sharks in the last play of the game.
- 10 of 12 players on Israel's wheelchair basketball U23 European Championship team are from The Center.
 - **Siv Ben Yishay** was named MVP of the Wheelchair Rugby European Championships.

Shesek: Putting HOPE IN MOTION

A Lifeline for Displaced Israelis with Disabilities

The October 7th attacks and the ongoing war have displaced over 130,000 Israelis, including thousands with disabilities who suddenly lost access to essential rehabilitation services. In response, the Israel ParaSport Center, in partnership with Bituach Leumi (Israel's National Insurance Institute), launched Shesek—an initiative providing rehabilitation, sports, and community support to individuals directly impacted by the war.

Since January 2024, Shesek has been a lifeline for hundreds of displaced individuals, offering adaptive sports, hydrotherapy, & trauma-informed rehabilitation free of charge. From refugees in hotels to Nova Festival survivors & families of hostages, Shesek helps rebuild strength, resilience, & hope in the most challenging of times. Shesek is more than a program. It's a movement, ensuring no Israeli with a disability is left behind.

Shesek's Achievements in 2024

- **Up to 40 active locations nationwide** providing rehabilitation & adaptive sports services
- **250 displaced individuals with disabilities** receiving direct support
- **38 families impacted by October 7th**, including wounded soldiers & hostage families, receiving care
- 28 Nova Festival survivors participating in sports therapy, including 20 in the Nova basketball team
- Collaboration with leading rehabilitation hospitals (Sheba, Loewenstein, Shamir, Ichilov) to reduce patient overload
- Two new bomb shelters installed on campus, ensuring programs continue despite security threats

2024 BASKETBALL TOUR



When our wheelchair basketball team was forced to cancel their tournament hosted in Turkey due to safety concerns, The Center pivoted—flying them to the U.S. for exhibition games against several college teams.

During their visit, the team played five matches against schools ranging from Division III to Division I, winning four out of five games. Spectators cheered not only for the thrilling plays on the court but for the inspiring stories behind each athlete. On their tour, the team visited local communities at schools & synagogues, sharing their personal journeys & the transformative impact adaptive sports have had on their lives. At every stop, they built meaningful connections, showcasing the strength & talent that comes from training at The Center.

As a multicultural team of Jewish & Arab Israelis, they demonstrated how friendship, teamwork, & a shared dream can transcend barriers—creating moments of unity both on & off the court. More than just games, the tour became a powerful symbol of hope during a time when it's needed most.

Key Priorities for 2025 & Beyond

Continuing Our Mission

In 2025, we remain dedicated to our core programming, providing rehabilitative and recreational sport services to Israeli adults and children with disabilities, while training elite competitive athletes. These programs are central to our mission of empowering individuals and ensuring everyone has the tools to thrive and succeed.

Investing in Our Elite Athletes

After sending five athletes to Paris 2024, we are now focusing on preparing 11 competitive athletes for the Los Angeles 2028 Paralympics. This includes developing new programs in archery, badminton, and athletics, upgrading our training facilities, and enhancing our sports science support for elite athletes.

Renovating Cur Pools

Renovating The Center's two swimming poor remains our top intrestructure priority. With over 900 swimmer each week, these poors serve as a first stop for many joining The Center playing a vital role in both rehabilitative services and athletic training. The way's impact and rising costs have delayed the project, and addition of unding is needed to complete the repovations by 2026.

Building on Shesek's Success We continue to provide free rehabilitative services to Nova survivors and

displaced individuals still unable to return home. In 2025, we will strengthen key partnerships and further establish The Center as a leading destination for post-rehabilitation services. Building on Shesek's success, we plan to expand with a new satellite program in northern Israel, attending our reach to those in need. Together with our partners, we are also advancing groundbeaking research in sport rehabilitation & its impact to healing.
