Our **Early Years provision** offers a nurturing and inspiring start to every child’s learning journey. We understand that these first years are crucial, and our highly skilled, caring staff place the happiness, well-being and individual needs of our youngest children at the heart of everything they do. Children are known, valued and supported, enabling them to feel safe, confident and excited to learn.

Our bright, open-plan classrooms are thoughtfully designed to encourage curiosity, independence and collaboration. Carefully planned learning spaces allow children to explore, create and discover through purposeful play, whilst building strong communication and social skills.

Learning continues seamlessly into our engaging outdoor environment, where children enjoy daily opportunities to explore, investigate and develop physical confidence. From imaginative role play to hands-on exploration of the natural world, our outdoor provision enriches learning and supports healthy, active lifestyles.

Our inspiring EYFS curriculum is designed to spark wonder and enthusiasm, laying strong foundations in language, early reading and mathematics, whilst nurturing creativity, problem-solving and resilience. Through a balance of child-led discovery and guided learning, we ensure every child develops the skills, confidence and love of learning needed to thrive.

At **Our Lady and St Hubert's**, we are committed to providing an exciting, broad and balanced curriculum that fosters a love of learning, curiosity about the world and the knowledge and skills children need to thrive in an ever-changing future. Our curriculum is carefully designed to build a progression of knowledge and skills across all subjects, enabling children to “know more and remember more” through carefully planned learning that is revisited and embedded over time..

Teaching is rooted in a clear understanding of how children learn. Lessons are carefully structured in small, sequential steps to avoid cognitive overload and support the development of long-term memory. Through regular retrieval practice, vocabulary development and meaningful connections across subjects, children deepen their understanding and become fluent, confident learners. A strong emphasis is placed on reading, which is at the heart of our curriculum.

Our stimulating curriculum provides rich opportunities for children to explore real-world issues through a wide range of subjects, alongside enrichment opportunities, visits and hands-on experiences. We also actively develop essential lifelong skills through our 6Cs — communication, collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, citizenship and character — ensuring our pupils are well-prepared for the next stage of their education.

Through high-quality teaching, careful assessment and a strong culture of support, all children are encouraged to achieve their full potential. We aim for every child to leave us as a resilient, independent learner with a love of learning and the confidence to make a positive difference in the world.



Personal Development



At Our Lady and St Hubert's, we place great importance on nurturing the whole child, ensuring every pupil is supported to grow socially, emotionally and personally. We are proud to be an inclusive school where all children are valued and supported to thrive. This includes our specialist provision, **The Nest**, which is highly adapted to meet the needs of children with complex difficulties, particularly in Speech, Language and Communication, enabling them to access learning with confidence and success.

We provide a wide range of enriching experiences that support personal growth, including opportunities through our **Forest School** programme and **cooking enrichment**, where children develop independence, resilience and practical life skills. Alongside this, our strong focus on **online safety and digital literacy** ensures pupils understand how to navigate the digital world safely, responsibly and with confidence.

Our curriculum is underpinned by our **6Cs — communication, collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, citizenship and character** — which are developed across all aspects of school life, helping children to become well-rounded, reflective and responsible individuals.

We actively promote **British values**, supporting pupils to understand respect, tolerance, democracy and the rule of law, and to appreciate the diverse world in which they live.

Through these opportunities and our inclusive ethos, we ensure that all children are empowered to develop confidence, independence and a strong sense of responsibility, preparing them for life beyond primary school.



Wider Opportunities

At Our Lady and St Hubert's, we offer a wealth of wider opportunities that enrich children's learning and create lasting memories. Educational visits play an important role in bringing the curriculum to life, with trips to places such as the Black Country Living Museum, Sea Life Centre, National Space Centre and Silverstone, alongside our residential experience at Plas Gwynant in the heart of Snowdonia, where children develop independence, resilience and teamwork.



In school, we further enrich learning through themed experiences such as Viking and Roman days, giving children the opportunity to step back in time and immerse themselves in history through hands-on activities. Pupils also take part in a wide range of competitions, including sporting events and mathematics challenges, where they are encouraged to strive for excellence and represent the school with pride.

Beyond the classroom, our extensive programme of after-school clubs provides opportunities for every child to discover and develop their interests. From dance, French and art to coding, newspaper club and dodgeball, there is something for everyone. Through these experiences, children develop our key 6Cs — communication, collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, citizenship and character — helping them grow into confident, well-rounded individuals who are ready for the future.



Practical Information

Our School Day

Our school day begins at **8.50am** and finishes at **3.30pm**, providing children with a full and enriching day of learning and development. From the moment they arrive, pupils are welcomed into a calm and purposeful environment where they feel ready to learn, grow and succeed. Each day is carefully structured to balance high-quality teaching with opportunities to play, collaborate and develop socially, ensuring every child thrives both academically and personally.

Wraparound Care

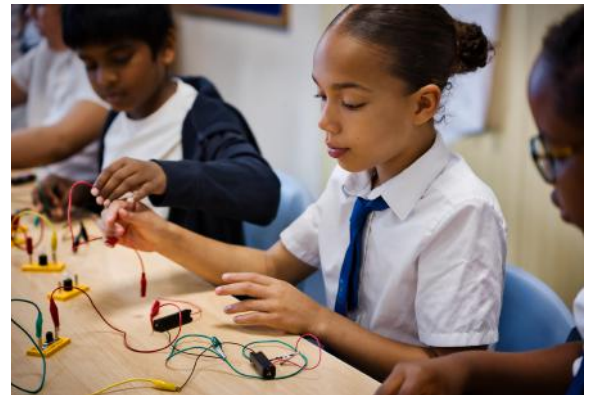
We offer high-quality wraparound care for our pupils, providing a safe, nurturing and engaging environment beyond the school day. The provision is led by trusted, experienced school staff and runs during term time.

Our Breakfast Club operates from **7.30am**, and our After School Club runs until **5.45pm**, giving families flexible childcare options.

Children enjoy a wide range of activities, including outdoor play, sports, creative activities, games and quiet relaxation time, ensuring a balanced and enjoyable experience at the start and end of each day.

Uniform

Our school uniform reflects our sense of pride, belonging and shared identity. Children are encouraged to wear their uniform smartly, helping them to feel part of our community and ready to learn. Attendance

Communication

We value strong, open communication with our families and work hard to keep parents informed and involved in school life. Information is shared regularly through email, Class Dojo and our electronic newsletters, which celebrate achievements, share key updates and provide important reminders. Admissions

Admissions to Our Lady and St Hubert's Catholic Primary School are coordinated through Sandwell Local Authority. Children can start Reception in the September following their fourth birthday, and parents are responsible for completing the online application process within the stated timelines. We encourage families to apply promptly, as nursery attendance does not guarantee a place in Reception. In-year applications for children transferring schools are also managed through the local authority. 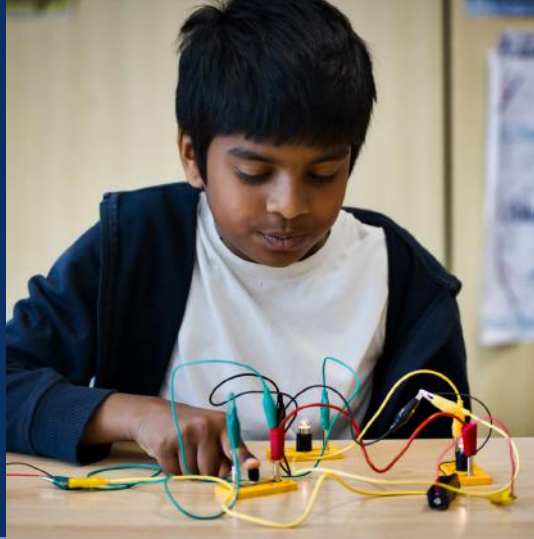
