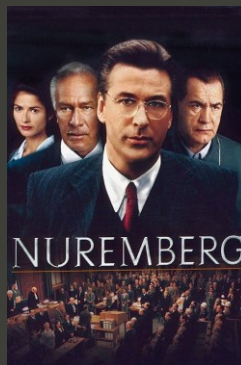

Series Synopsis

In the aftermath of war and horror, the world faced a unique challenge: How to deal with crimes that had no precedent.

NUREMBERG 45 tells the story of the first international tribunal through the eyes of two Holocaust survivors who represent the voices of millions. Ernst Michel, a 22-year-old journalist and survivor of Auschwitz, reports from Courtroom 600 with both distance and deeply personal conviction. Seweryna Szmaglewska delivers one of the most powerful testimonies against the Nazi regime.
