





TTA TALENT SHOW REQUIREMENTS:

Top Teens must meet the eligibility guidelines as follows:

- Top Teen entries are eligible for National competition for the Syn-Lod year only.
- Eligible entrants must be an active, financial Top Teen for at least one year at the time of entry at Area and be in a Chapter that is in good standing at the Area and National levels.
- Eligible entrants must be the First Place Winner from the Area Conference held during Fiscal Year Two
 of the Two-Year Program Period.
- Categories from which to choose: (1) Dance; (2) Spoken Work/Dramatization/Poetry; (3) Music Vocal;
 (4) Music Instrumental; and (5) Virtual Arts (new category). Each category will be judged separately, for a total of five (5) First Place Winners.
 - All performances must be "live." Videos will NOT be accepted.
 - The Talent Show/Performing Arts Application google form* must be completed and submitted by the February 15, 2026
 - Each performance will be allowed 3-5 minutes. Longer or shorter performances will be penalized.
 - NO profanity or vulgar lyrics in any vocal performance or dance; NO nudity allowed, attire respectable and tasteful; NO alcohol, tobacco, or drug advertisements shown on any clothing; NO pyrotechnics, open flames or any other dangerous additions.
 - Teens are responsible for their own easel stands for and other items for visual displays



- SPEECHES MUST BE MEMORIZED. Speakers must deliver from memory, the oration to a panel of judges. Speakers may NOT use any notes, view or read from any screen, tablet or any electronic device or they will be disqualified.
 - Each speaker will be allowed 3-5 minutes. Longer or shorter speeches will be penalized.
 - Speakers will be judged on the basis of content/composition (50%) and presentation/delivery (50%).
 - A copy of the speech manuscript will be sent to the National Awards Committee with the Area Director's Report.

"Civil War or Civil Engagement?" Civil War is defined as a severe and protracted form of conflict within a nation. Civil Engagement is defined as working to improve the community through individual and collective actions, both political and non-political. Which would you prefer? Civil War or Civil Engagement to address the current conflict, violence, and polarization occurring in the United States, and why?

"Can We Be the Change We Want to See?" The First Amendment protects Freedom of Speech: Is it really freedom for everyone or for a select few? Compare the conditions of Freedom of Speech during the Civil Rights Era to current times in America. How do you feel about the current condition of America versus the Civil Rights Era? Has it changed Freedom of Speech? Discuss the impact of the current administration's actions in the following areas: birthright citizenship, human rights of both documented and undocumented immigrants, or any other areas. Are you concerned with your Freedom of Speech being violated as a black American in this era?

"The Power of Civil Discourse in a Divided World." Civil discourse means engaging in respectful conversation, listening to understand rather than winning, and finding common ground even when we disagree. In today's world, people often disagree—about politics, culture, social issues, and even everyday choices. How has our dialogue with one another about these differences changed our community? Explain why civil discourse is important in your generation. Consider how respectful dialogue can help solve problems, build stronger relationships, or create positive changes in your school, community, or the world.

"The Rise of Artificial Intelligence: Friend, Foe, or Future Partner?" Artificial Intelligence (AI) and machine learning are transforming the way we learn, work, and live. From self-driving cars and virtual tutors to art-generating software and robot assistants, AI is quickly becoming part of our daily world. Have these innovations and technological advances impacted our creativity, ethics, and the role of humans? Explore what the emergence of artificial intelligence and machine learning means for your generation.

"Mind Matters: Building a Generation that Prioritizes Mental Health." Reflect on the importance of mental health awareness and advocacy among youth and senior citizens. Discuss how individuals and communities can work together to promote emotional resilience. How have social media and other influences had an impact on traditional relationships, families, and neighborhoods?
