Welcome

The Reverend David Kendrick gave a special welcome to all who were in attendance for the 2020 Annual Meeting.

Remembering Dorsey

The Reverend David Kendrick recognized the life and legacy of Council of Churches of the Ozarks founder, Dorsey Levell.

Invocation & Blessing

Father Jos. Tharakan with member church, St. James Episcopal Church offered the invocation.

Declaration of a Quorum

The Reverend David Kendrick declared that a quorum of our Member Churches had registered and declared the 2020 Council of Churches of the Ozarks, Inc. Annual Meeting in session. 12 religious traditions were represented.

Approval of the 2019 Annual Meeting Minutes

Anitra Appleby, Secretary of the Board stated that the 2019 Annual Meeting Minutes were in the packets provided.

The Reverend David Kendrick asked for corrections or additions to the minutes as presented. Hearing none, The Reverend David Kendrick asked for a motion to approve the 2019 minutes as presented. A motion was duly made, seconded, and unanimously approved to accept the minutes.

Nominating Committee Report

The Reverend David Kendrick asked for Vice President and Chair of the Nominating Committee, Linda Merkling to come forward and give the Nominating Committee report. Linda stated the Committee is nominating the following individuals for membership on the Board of Directors for an initial three-year term.

The Reverend David Kendrick asked for other nominations from the floor. Hearing none he asked for a motion to elect the nominees by acclamation. A motion was made to approve the nominations. The Board nominees were elected.

Introduction of 2020 Board of Directors

The Reverend David Kendrick let the delegate body know according to the procedures in our bylaws, the Board of Directors has proposed officers for the 2020 year and will be elected at the next monthly meeting. They are as follows:

Linda Merkling-President Tom Ryan-Vice President Mike Pruett-Treasurer Anitra Appleby-Secretary

Linda let the membership body know she felt honored and blessed to serve as President of the Board and thanked the Reverend David Kendrick for his leadership.

New Member Church

The Reverend David Kendrick let the membership body know since the last annual meeting, Connecting Grounds church has been added as the newest member church voted on by the 2019 Board of Directors.

Special Recognition of Board Leadership

The Reverend David Kendrick thanked Cheryl Clay for her leadership and support and also thanked Cora Scott for her leadership as chair of the 2019 Compassion Campaign and presented them with awards.

Linda Merkling came to the podium and thanked the Reverend David Kendrick for his leadership as Board President and presented him with an award of appreciation.

Special Recognition of Rev. Mark Struckhoff

The Reverend David Kendrick recognized the Reverend Mark Struckhoff for his contributions over the last ten years to Council of Churches and presented him with a gift. The Reverend Mark Struckhoff thanked the delegate body.

Special Recognition of Advisory Committees

The Reverend David Kendrick also thanked the many volunteers and advisory members for their dedication and the blessing they are to the Council of Churches and those in our community. The dollar value of volunteer time is over 2 million dollars.

Review of 2019 Finances

Keith Noble, Treasurer of the Council of Churches Board of Directors, stated the Finance Committee of the Board works with the Chief Operating Officer and Accounting Manager to review all monthly and yearly financial statements.

He let the delegate body know last year an operating net loss of (\$61,736) was approved but 2019 ended with a net cash gain of \$92,000. We continue to see demand increase at Crosslines and Daybreak is doing well with increased Medicaid funding. Central Office is positive with \$200,000 in bequests.

Looking at the 2020 budget, there is a projected cash gain of \$19,000 and a net operating gain of \$7,700. The One Stop for Early Childhood has shown a \$52,000 loss but is working at increasing their fundraising. Over 90 cents from every dollar goes back into the community. Keith Noble presented the 2020 budget for adoption.

Presentation of 2020 Budget

Keith Noble asked for questions or comments. Hearing none, Keith Noble stated a second was not required since the motion comes from the Board. Keith Noble moved for adoption of the budget as proposed. The motion passed unanimously.

Compassion Campaign

Linda Merkling asked Board Member and Chair of the Development Committee, Bill Hennessey to come forward to speak about the upcoming 2020 Compassion Campaign goal.

Bill Hennessey gave a special thanks to the Reverend Dorsey Levell and the Reverend Mark Struckhoff. Bill also thanked Cora Scott for being the Chair of the Compassion Campaign. Over \$520,000 was raised during Christmas with a \$115,000 Christmas challenge. The Council received over \$2.2 million dollars in gifts as well as five different bequests that gave a combined \$270,000 to further our mission.

As we begin the new year, we'll kick off 2020 with a goal of \$2.3 million.

Mission/We Are Family

Interim Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer, Rick George spoke of the outreaches that serve our most vulnerable. The Council of Churches' outreaches inspire help for seniors, children, families, and adults. Rick recognized staff and spoke of the vision and dream of family and invited the membership to spend more time with us and us with them in 2020. We look forward to working with our member churches to inspire hope in our community, strategic planning, casting a vision and living into our mission.

In closing, the Reverend David Kendrick thanked the Council of Churches of the Ozarks Foundation for their partnership. It was founded in order to help with the long term efforts of the Council.

The Reverend David Kendrick let the delegate body know the Council of Churches and the Council of Churches Foundation have been having fruitful discussions between current development plans and endowment.

He let the body know there will likely be another meeting of member churches for change in bylaws.

Having no other business to conduct, the Reverend David Kendrick adjourned the meeting at 1:00 pm.


