CDD PROGRESS REPORT: CELEBRATING OUR ACHIEVEMENTS AND LOOKING FORWARD

As we approach the conclusion of the CDD fiscal year, we wish to bring attention to several noteworthy aspects pertaining to projects, the budget, and community involvement. Once again, through the collaborative efforts of the Board of Supervisors and the dedicated CDD staff, numerous valuable projects, events, and enhancements have been successfully realized within the community, all in alignment with a meticulously planned budget.

Over the course of the past fiscal year, significant accomplishments include the establishment of 2 new pickleball courts, enrichment of the Community Center playground through the addition of a tot lot and swing sets, the successful transition of 64 tennis court lights to energy-efficient LED technology, ongoing enhancements to road and sidewalk safety, integration of 2 streetlights to bolster pedestrian safety at crosswalks, and the tireless commitment of our maintenance team in stewarding the expansive 600-acre expanse of Arbor Greene.

Remarkably, the budget has maintained its stability, and in some cases, even experienced reduction over the last decade. In the face of substantial escalations in costs related to essential commodities, services, wages, and supplies in recent years, we extend our gratitude for the Board's prudent planning, thereby preventing any necessitated fee increments.

With the approval of the budget during the August meeting, we are pleased to announce the continuity of unchanged CDD fees for the upcoming fiscal year 2024. It is acknowledged that operational and maintenance costs remain inherent-

A LOOK BACK: NEW TAMPA'S JOURNEY TO TODAY

In the mid-19th century, New Tampa was a quiet patch of land within Florida's expansive terrain. By the late 1980s, things began to change. The area, spanning 24 square miles, was officially embraced by Tampa in 1988, marking the beginning of its journey from obscurity to prominence.

Geographically, New Tampa finds itself nestled among notable neighbors. It's bordered by Lutz to the west, has the University community to the south, which houses the University of South Florida, Wesley Chapel to the north, and Thonotosassa's Morris Bridge Road on its eastern side. While Wesley Chapel isn't formally a part of New Tampa, ask locals, and many view it as an extended part of the community.

New Tampa's growth is impressive. In 1990, it was home to just over 7,000 people. By 2000, that number had ballooned to over 26,000—a nearly 273% increase. By 2005, estimates suggest a population of around 37,350, making it a significant contributor to Tampa's overall growth.

Historically, Pebble Creek stands out as the area's longstanding neighborhood. Meanwhile, within Tampa's boundaries, Tampa Palms is recognized as one of the earliest developed areas. Interestingly, Tampa Palms began making its mark when New Tampa was still in its early stages, but its significant development came in the 1990s.

In summary, New Tampa's transition from a dormant district to a thriving hub is a testament to its potential and the vision of its residents and developers. Today, it stands as a key part of the greater Tampa region, a symbol of growth and progress.

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CITY OF TAMPA CONSTRUCTION GUIDELINES: WHAT HOMEOWNERS NEED TO KNOW

Embarking on a construction project? Stay informed about the City of Tampa's permitting requirements and ensure your project adheres to standards that protect our community and the environment.

Understanding Key Ordinances:

- Maintaining Drainage Patterns (Sec. 21-8): Any
 construction, grading, or activity that alters surface or
 subsurface drainage patterns is prohibited if it negatively
 affects neighboring properties or public rights-of-way.
- Safeguarding Public Drainage Systems (Sec. 21-9): It's illegal to introduce foreign matter (like trash, construction materials, or pollutants) into any public drainage system, including streets. Damaging or obstructing these systems is also considered a public nuisance.
- Applying for Permits (Sec. 21-26): Apply in writing on official forms, detailing the nature and location of the work. The city might ask for additional plans or information. Once compliance with all regulations is verified, a permit will be granted upon fee payment.
- Drainage and Earthwork Permit Requirements (Sec. 21-27): Before starting any excavating, grading, filling, or stockpiling activities, a permit is necessary. This permit is valid for six months from its issuance date, though extensions can be sought. Non-compliance may lead to a denied extension.

For detailed information on permits, you can visit the City of Tampa Permits website. Should you encounter a stormwater emergency or notice any illicit discharge affecting our Stormwater Management System, it's essential to report it immediately. You can reach out to the City of Tampa Stormwater Division at (813) 274-3101 or the Arbor Greene CDD at (813) 991-9226.

FROM PAINT TO POWER TOOLS: TIPS FOR FIREPROOFING YOUR HOME RENOVATIONS

TRY THIS DECADENT TAKE ON DEEP-FRIED STUFFED FRENCH TOAST

Thank you to Elliot and Pam Cazes of Parkviewfor generously sharing their recipe with the community. This mouth-watering creation is sure to impress your taste buds and add some sweetness to your neighborhood and family gatherings.

INGREDIENTS

- 12 Slices of Thick White Bread
- Cream Cheese (for stuffing)
- Preferred Fruit Preserves (for stuffing)
- Powdered Sugar
- 1 Box of Pancake Mix

- 2 Eggs
- 1-2 Cups of Whole Milk
- Juice of 1/2 Orange
- 1 Tsp of Vanilla Extract
- · Preferred Oil (for frying)

DIRECTIONS

- Pour oil into a fryer or a deep pot and heat it to 350°F (175°C).
- In a mixing bowl, combine 2 cups of pancake mix and 2 eggs. Gradually add milk, mixing until you achieve a thick pancake batter consistency. Stir in 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract and the juice of half an orange until well combined. Set the batter aside.
- Lay out slices of bread. On each slice, spread a generous layer of cream cheese followed by your choice of fruit preserves. Top with another slice of bread to form sandwiches.
- Take one sandwich and dip it into the batter, ensuring it's fully coated. Carefully place the battered sandwich into the hot oil. Fry until it turns golden brown and crispy.
- Use a slotted spoon to remove the fried sandwich from the oil, allowing excess oil to drip off. Transfer the sandwich to a platter lined with paper towels to drain any remaining oil. Repeat the process for each sandwich.
- Once all sandwiches are fried, slice each one diagonally. Lightly dust the sandwiches with powdered sugar. Serve warm with syrup on the side, if desired.
