JESUS AS INTERCESSOR AND THE HOLY SPIRIT AS ADVOCATE

By being immersed in the grace and power of the Holy Spirit, we begin to abide in God's love: "And hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Romans 5: 5). Our Baptism in the Holy Spirit is a Christ-centered event. It leads to our re-creation in the image and likeness of Jesus: "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3: 16). The Holy Spirit will guide us to all truth: "He will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming" (John 14: 13). The Holy Spirit lives with us and within us as Emmanuel, God-with-Us: "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, which the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows it. But you know it, because it remains with you, and will be in you" (John 14: 16-17).

The Holy Spirit helps us break sinful habits and experience spiritual transformation: "You should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth" (Ephesians 4: 22-24). The Holy Spirit deepens the Father-Child relationship between God and us: "The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him" (Romans 8: 16-17).



### PREPARING FOR THE JOURNEY

Through the Holy Spirit, we experience a transformative, personal relationship with Jesus: "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me" (Galatians 2: 19-20). The Holy Spirit creates a deeper obedience and faith in the authority given by Jesus to His representatives: "Whoever listens to you listens to me. Whoever rejects you rejects me. And whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me" (Luke 10: 16). The Holy Spirit's prayer in us will always be heard: "The Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the one who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because it intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will" (Romans 8: 26-27).

IJohn 2:27 tells us that we have the Perfect Mentor in the Holy Spirit: "The anointing (the Holy Spirit) that you received from him remains in you, so that you do not need anyone to teach you. But his anointing teaches you about everything and is true and not false; just as it taught you, remain in him." Week Two of Revelation 6 continues with the invitation to submit completely to the guidance and transformation that the Holy Spirit will bring about in us. 'Will you trust the Holy Spirit to transform you into Christ?'

The nightly review of the day is a significant practice in a disciple's formation. The context for our nightly review is our covenant relationship with God. Through baptism we were buried into the death of Christ, and rose to new life, God's own life, through the resurrection of Jesus. We belong to God and the Blessed Trinity has become ours through Jesus. Every single day, God is overwhelming us with grace upon grace, suffusing our lives with His tender mercies and unconditional love. Every single day of our lives, then, is an opportunity to praise, adore, and thank God for His indescribable goodness and loving kindness. We engage in praise and thanksgiving for the blessings and protection we received from God. Today, with thanksgiving in your heart, you can go over your day, from morning to evening, and see how God was Emmanuel, with you and in you. You can then do an examination of your conscience to see how you responded in your covenant union with Him. Did you succumb to temptation and did you commit deliberate sin? As disciples of Jesus, we owe it to our Savior to humbly acknowledge our sins and make an act of repentance and contrition. After you have examined your conscience and are ready to ask forgiveness, you can pray the Act of Contrition. We encourage you to journal on the following questions: What is God saying to you? For what are you grateful? For what are you contrite? What spiritual discipline, including fasting, do you need to focus on tomorrow?



# Examination of CONSCIENCE

#### Prayer of Thanksgiving

O my God, I thank you for all the graces and blessings which I have received from you this day. Express to God your gratitude as you recall the blessings and graces that were present today: For what are you grateful?

#### **Examination of Conscience**

Additional challenges to improve your physical and spiritual life:

- Attempt 20 minutes for morning prayer and 10 minutes for night prayer.
- Refrain from Alcohol on Wednesday and Friday per week.
- Refrain from Snacking between Meals on Wednesday and Friday per week.
- Begin and end your day at the same time daily.

In the Great Discourse, Jesus made it explicit that the Holy Spirit would continue the work of Jesus among us: "He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you" (John 16: 14). In Trinitarian style, the Three Persons think and work as one because They are One. Hence the Holy Spirit will never work at cross purposes with Jesus: "Therefore, I tell you that nobody speaking by the spirit of God says, "Jesus be accursed."



There is a deeper lesson for us to learn. Just as there cannot be division and competition among the Three Persons of the Blessed Trinity because there is no sin in God, similarly, among us as disciples of Jesus there should be no division and disunity. It is a scandal that as disciples of Jesus we claim Him as Savior and Lord, while disagreeing on the true meaning of His teachings. Jesus gave Peter the keys of the kingdom. Through the action of the Holy Spirit, the Church's Magisterium or Teaching Authority has kept God's covenant family free from error in matters of dogma and morals. We need to take the Teaching Authority of the Church seriously, as it is Jesus who instituted this authority. Similarly, St. Paul tells us that we can only know Jesus as Lord through the Holy Spirit. Holy Spirit, re-create me in the image and likeness of Jesus!

#### PAUL'S GREETING

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"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship (communion) of the holy Spirit be with all of you." - 2Corinthians 13: 13

Paul ends his Second letter to the Corinthians with this greeting. It is probably one of the best recapitulations of God's Plan of Salvation. The Presider begins the celebration of the Eucharist with Paul's greeting almost every Sunday:

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ" is the unmerited gift to us of sharing in God's divine life, made possible through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus is our Savior because He is Lord! As one of us, Jesus has bridged the chasm between God and us, caused by our sin. As Son of God, Jesus could do what we could not. And now we share in His relationship with the Father and Holy Spirit. With Him, in Him, and through Him, we can now address His Father as Our Father!



'The love of God:" The Father's love has made possible this indescribable gift of participation in the divine nature through Jesus. John 3: 16 highlights this passionate commitment of the Father to us, and His generous decision to give us His Son: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

'The fellowship (communion) of the Holy Spirit be with all of you': To bring about this covenant union of God with His human covenant family, the fellowship or communion of the Holy Spirit has been offered to us. The Holy Spirit is the Architect of our covenant union with God. Through the Holy Spirit, the Trinity invites us into God's life and relationships, to share in their Trinitarian fellowship. From being aliens and outsiders, we are brought into union with God, given entrance into God's sanctuary, offered the privilege of praising, adoring, and thanking our Triune God ceaselessly as the Father's sons and daughters. Communion is God's gift to us to share in what belongs quintessentially only to God: Divine Life. In His magnanimous love, God has fostered an inextricable bond between Him and us through the communion or fellowship of the Holy Spirit. "In him (Jesus) you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory." - Ephesians 1: 13-14

In baptism, we were sealed with the Holy Spirit. When a person becomes a Christian, the Holy Spirit takes up residence in them. They become temples of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit empowers us, and we function through the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit protects and encourages us. The sealing of the Holy Spirit refers to an official mark of identification that was placed on a letter or document. The seal was made from hot wax and then impressed with a signet ring. Jesus is the bearer of the signet ring. He marks us with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit. The seal of the Holy Spirit in the believer signifies security, authenticity, ownership, and authority, all originating in Jesus.



The Holy Spirit is the first and perfect installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession. Jesus has purchased our salvation or inheritance through His death on the cross.
